## 10th I/D/E/A/ FELLOWS PROGRAM AT USD

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

The 10th I/D/E/A/ Fellows Program will be held at the University of San Diego July 17-23. The Program was initiated in 1966 by the Institute for Development of Educational Activities, Inc. the educational affiliate of the Charles F. Kettering Foundation. The Fellows Program is the oldest, continuing in-service program for administrators. Its objective is to keep concerned, dedicated administrators informed on changing trends and to provide an atmosphere for the sharing of ideas, problems, and solutions.

Theme of the 1977 Fellows Program is "Critical Issues in Education." Significant crisis issues affecting the operation and life of schools to be discussed include: Reductions in staff and curricula as the result of declining support; changes wrought by collective bargaining; the effect of television; juvenile delinquency and its effect on schooling; the Back-to-Basics Movement, its advocacy and meaning.

Cortines, Superintendent, Pasadena Unified School District; Kathy Garmezzy, Senior Staff Assistant, Youth Project, National League of Cities; Harold L. Dreyfus, Chancellor, University of Wisconsin, and George Gerbner, Dean, The Annenberg School of Communications, University of Pennsylvania.
