NURSING FORUM SET
AT USD NURSING SCHOOL

January 9, 1978

Four nationally known nurses will be the guest speakers at the University of San Diego nursing forum entitled, "The Future of Nursing from a National Perspective: The Entry Into Practice Issue," on Friday, Jan. 12, from 9:30--11:30 a.m.

The nurses include Jessie M. Scott, Assistant Surgeon General; Rozella M. Schlotfeldt, professor of nursing at Case Western Reserve University; Mary Ann Garrigan, professor of nursing at Boston University; and Martha E. Rogers, professor of nursing at New York University.

Scott serves as the director of the division of nursing for the Health Resources administration in Washington, D.C. She received her B.S. in nursing from the University of Pennsylvania and her M.A. in nursing from Columbia University. She is a recipient of a distinguished service medal from the U.S. Public Health Service, a Florence Nightingale medal from State University of New York, and the Mary Adelaide Nutting Award for leadership in nursing.

Schlotfeldt is a consultant to the office of Nursing Home Affairs of the Public Health Service of HEW. She has taught at the University of Iowa, the University of Colorado, and has served as dean of Case Western Reserve University School of Nursing. She received her M.S. and Ph.D. in nursing education from the University of Chicago.

Garrigan is a founding faculty member at the Boston University School of Nursing. She has continued in her capacity there as a professor for 30 years. She received the 1976 Honorary Life Membership Award from Teacher's College, Columbia University in recognition of her scholarly achievements in nursing. She received her B.S. in nursing from Columbia University and her M.S. in nursing education from Boston University.

Rogers is the author of three books on nursing. She is a member of the American Academy of Nursing. She received her M.A. in nursing from Columbia University and her M.P.H. and ScD. from Johns Hopkins University.

The forum on nursing issues is part of a two-day dedication program of the new USD Muriel Marsh Hahn Pavilion, Philip Y. Hahn School of Nursing. It will be conducted in the Pavilion meeting room.
