The Honorable Richard D. Lamm, Governor of Colorado, and Bernard H. Siegan, Distinguished Professor of Law at the University of San Diego will discuss, "Should There be Greater Regulation of Land Use at the State and Federal Levels?" The final debate in a series of six debates will be held March 23 at 8:00pm in Salomon Lecture Hall in De Sales Hall. The debate is open to the public; no admission fee.

Governor Lamm was an Associate Professor of Law at the University of Denver from 1969 to 1974. A member of the Colorado House of Representatives from 1969 to 1974, he was Assistant Minority Leader during 1971-1974. Lamm received his B.B.A. from the University of Wisconsin and L.L.B., University of California.

Siegan writes a weekly newspaper column which is presently published in various sections of the country. Author of the books, Land Use Without Zoning and Other People's Property, Siegan has published numerous articles on land use and urban planning which have appeared in professional journals, newspapers and magazines.

Siegan graduated with a J.D. degree from the University of Chicago Law School. In Chicago, he was a specialist in real estate and zoning law.
