

PROSPECTUS

Golf Coach Frank Cates, who is returning for his fourth season at USD, sees the present team as one of the strongest in several years. He states, "Three of our top players are returning and we have some excellent prospects joining the team."

Returning are senior Geoffrey Dean, who has the best scoring average of the returning players; junior Rick Schultz, who closely followed Dean in average; and sophomore Tom Shea, USD's leading scorer in the last five tournaments in '87-'88. Ready to challenge this group are returning junior Mark Yarter and senior Steve Zweber.

Freshman Creighton Aotani joins the team this season. He brings with him an excellent high school record and is a veteran of many junior golf tournaments. He already has established himself as a fine shot-maker and competitor.

The University of San Diego Golf Team participates in NCAA Division I and is a member of the West Coast Athletic Conference (WCAC).

The WCAC Golf Championship will be held this season at the Heron Lakes Golf Course in Portland, Oregon in April 1989.

The University of San Diego Invitational Golf Tournament will be held this year on March 13 and 14 at Carmel Mountain Ranch Golf Club.

USD GOLF FACILITIES

Carmel Mountain Ranch — The USD Golf Team has just recently been afforded the privilege of playing this fine 6,278 yard layout in the northern part of the city. The course is noted for lakes, streams, deep pot bunkers and multi-level greens. Carmel Mountain Ranch is the site of annual qualifying for the U.S. Open and the San Diego Open tournaments. Course rating: 73.2.

Stardust Country Club — USD is very fortunate in being able to play this beautiful 27-hole layout that is located just down the hill from the campus. These courses, when combined to 18 holes offer a course of about 6,600 yards with a course rating of about 71.5. Stardust boasts some of the best greens in the area and was the site of the San Diego Open for many years.

Bear Creek Golf Club — The USD team has the privilege of playing this Jack Nicklaus course in Murietta (about 60 miles north of San Diego) against the rolling countryside of the Temecula Valley. Bear Creek, home of the 1985 Skins Game, is a long 7,024 yards from the tournament tees that features multi-level greens, deep pot bunkers, and several lakes and streams. The course rating is 75.4.

Singing Hills Country Club — The USD Golf Team has playing privileges at the two courses at Singing Hills, which is located in a beautiful valley east of El Cajon (about 15 miles from campus). The 6,573 yard Willow Glen course and the 6,132 yard Oak Glen layout were re-worked several years ago by architect Ted Robinson. The course ratings are 71.5 and 69.0.

In addition to these fine courses, an on-campus area is available for medium and short iron practice.

UNIVERSITY PROFILE

The University of San Diego is an independent, Catholic university located on a 180-acre mesa overlooking Mission Bay, San Diego Harbor and the Spanish town where St. Didacus (i.e. Diego) spent much of his time.

Complementing its splendid natural setting is the University's location just ten minutes from downtown San Diego — conveniently close to the major business, cultural, residential, and recreational areas, as well as the rail, bus and air terminals.

Founded in 1949, USD is presently experiencing record attendance. Undergraduate enrollment stands at 3,600 with graduate student enrollment bringing the total student population to a record level of 5,800.

The University includes a College of Arts and Sciences, as well as Schools of Business Administration, Education, Nursing, and Law. Each is characterized by high academic standards, small classes, and excellent student-faculty relations.

Though the majority of students come from the West Coast, every region of the United States is well-represented on campus. Students also attend USD from 24 foreign countries. Recreation and Athletic activities are expanding rapidly. They include sailing, crew, yoga, karate, surfing, modern dance, backpacking, and ballet. USD's intercollegiate sports for men include baseball, football, basketball, cross-country, golf, soccer, crew, and tennis. Intercollegiate sports for women include basketball, cross-country, crew, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball.
