Organization of College Day will probably vary slightly from past years, as a result of suggestions offered by students and faculty members. (Any further suggestions are welcome.) However, "classes" that day, as in the past, will be for the hundreds of high school visitors on campus. Members of the faculty are requested to submit titles (and descriptions, if needed) of lectures and/or demonstrations and discussions appropriate for the day. Please also submit names, if any, of

students to be helping with your "class." Those in the same department could perhaps consult one another, to prevent overlapping. It may be of interest to the faculty members that students have suggested more use of college students in the actual classes — for instance, disucssions or panels, as well as lectures; use your discretion about whether you wish to adopt these student suggestions. The main point is to make College Day so intellectually stimulating for the visitors that they will want to come here to college. Another suggestion about which we welcome comment is that there be more opportunity for the visitors to talk with faculty and students — about prospective majors, about university life, etc.

It would greatly facilitate organization of College Day if all the above information could be put in the box provided on the bottom shelf of the sideboard inside the door of the office of the Assistant to the Dean (by Tuesday, October 17, please).

FIRST FRIDAY:

According to the recent <u>College Newsletter</u>, publication of the NCEA, a "Catholic University participates in the total university life of our time...and is an institution, a community of learners or a community of scholars, in which Catholicism is <u>perceptibly present</u> and <u>effectively operative</u>." VACATION DAYS AT CW AND CM:

Dr. Caners brought to the attention of the Administration the fact that CM has a holiday on October 13, 1967 (in observance of Columbus Day), while the Women's College has classes on that day. CM students in Dr. Caners' calculus class asked if they were expected to come to class. They are. This was checked with the President and the Dean of the Men's College, and it was agreed that in all such cases, CM and CW students follow the calendar of the institution offering the class. Other faculty members may have the same question brought up in their classes -- forewarned is forearmed! We are grateful to Dr. Caners for bringing this to the attention of the Administration.

Students have often asked that faculty members might have some definite office hours, to facilitate their contacting faculty members when there is need.
