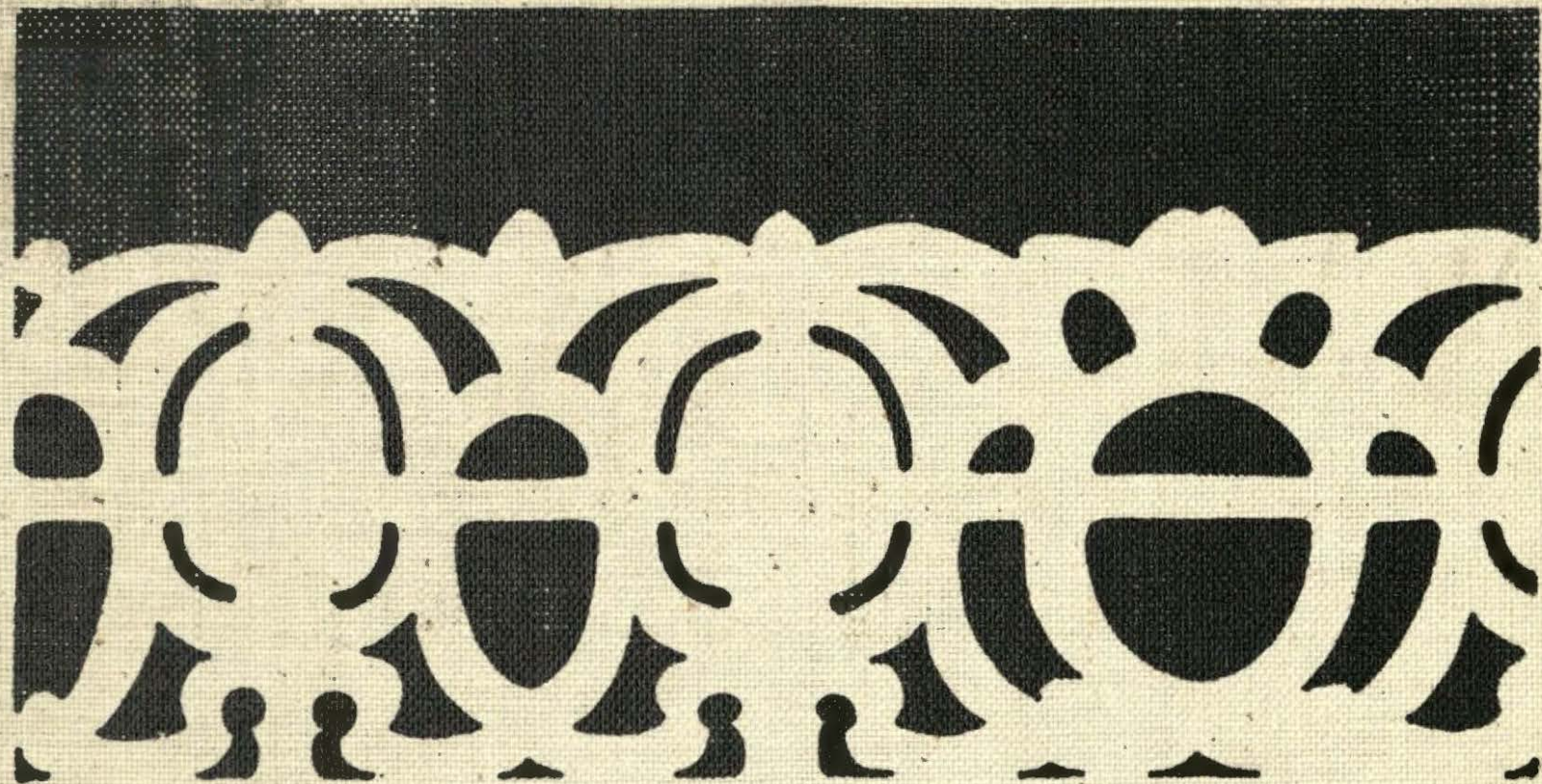

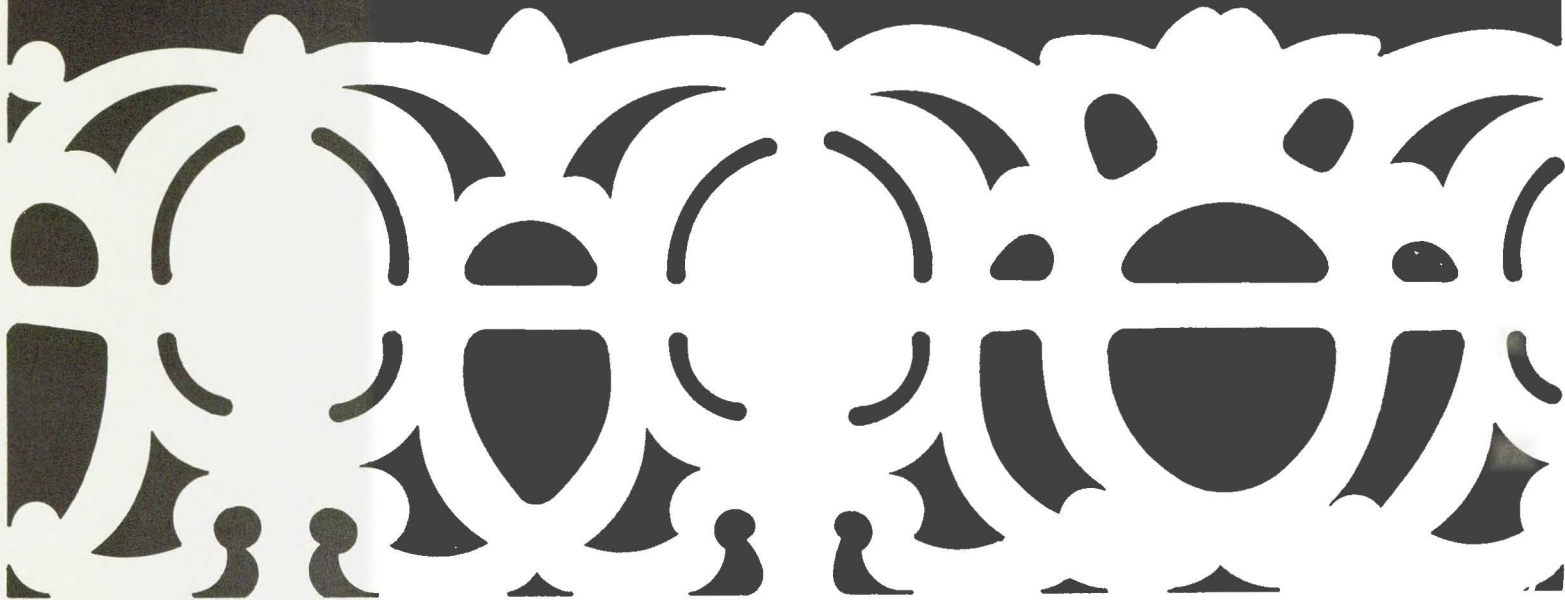

Introduction

Here, in Alcala Park which overlooks the birthplace of Christianity and civilization in California, there is a glowing atmosphere of unity and progress, a renewed spirit of enthusiasm in the University life, for enriched educational opportunities have brought about a flowing interchange of ideas and activities among the Colleges.

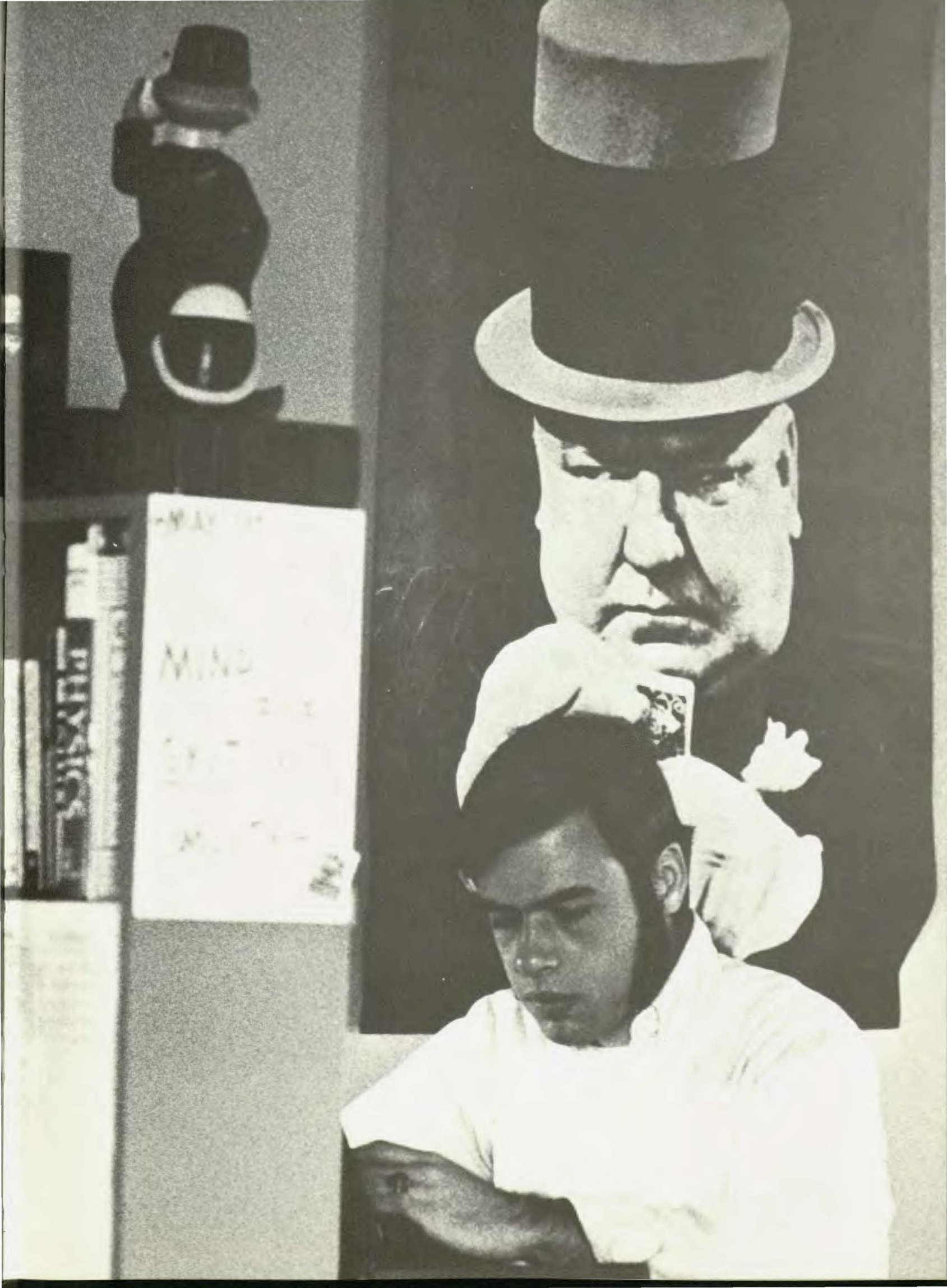

The University of Alcala

This famous and historic university is a landmark in the small city of Alcala de Henares in Spain. The name, **Alcala**, is derived from the Moslem **al-gala nahar**, **algala** meaning castle. The city itself is ancient in its origins and has been identified with the Roman and later Visigothic town of Complutum. Destroyed about the year 1000, the town was rebuilt by the Moors during the eleventh century. A quiet outpost of Madrid, it returned in due time to Christian hands but clung to its heathen name, Alcala.

There in our "sister city" classes were offered for the first time in 1459 in the then already honorable and traditional university curriculum of the liberal arts, the **trivium** and the **quadrivium**. Fifty years later the University proper was founded by Cardinal Jimenez de Cisneros with the opening of the College of Saint Idelfonso. Staffed by scholars and clerics from the great Spanish centers of learning, the University soon became famous for the quality of its faculty, its impressive intellectual life, and the academic enthusiasm and high accomplishment of its students. In addition to the original college-hospitals, ancillary colleges, and resident establishments of nearly every religious order operating in Spain gathered together to comprise one major university. Before the end of the sixteenth century Alcala de Henares was, in Spain, second only to the University of Salamanca. Yet, for reasons typical to the fates of men and their institutions, the passing centuries, darkening over Spain, dimmed the luster of Alcala. By 1835 the entire University had been moved to Madrid. Her greatness had waned and set.

Our own Southern California city, in a latter day renaissance, bears the name of one of the great figures of that vanished university world: Saint Didacus, or better—San Diego de Alcala, a Franciscan whose life and labors were celebrated, not only in canonization, but also in the remembrance of the conquistador, Sebastian Vizcaino. When he arrived here, coming overland by the punishing coastal route some one-hundred and fifty years after Cabrillo's discovery voyage, Vizcaino celebrated his feat with an act of devotion which was later confirmed and made enduring by Fray Junipero Serra when he dedicated his first mission to San Diego here where the Presidio now stands across the bed of Mission Valley from another, newer, Alcala.

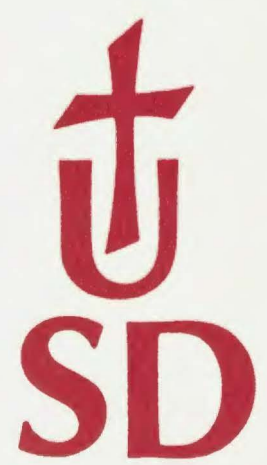
Our own University of Alcala, amazingly young by comparison with its famous predecessor in the old world, has developed swiftly into a responsible and respected Christian center of humane learning. The Alchemy and Astrology of another age have given way to the modern sciences and to free inquiry into the character and substance of physical reality. Philosophy and Theology and the Arts of language, number, and figure continue to serve the contemporary spirit, as they did an earlier one, in its search for disciplined knowledge and insight. The human and profound project in which men of all epochs have engaged allows present scholars and teachers to join hands across the drift of time with those of another community. Here, in spirit and in fact, in purpose and in prospect, the two Alcalas meet and move into the beckoning future.

At the opening whistle of the 1967-1968 basketball season, Coach Phil Woolpert, suited up eight returning lettermen.

In the first game against Cal Poly, Rick Cabrera brought a 65-50 victory over the Broncos. Against Pepperdine, defeat came in a close 80-78 score as the Wave forward, Steve Ebey, scored 29 points.

Always a highlight in the season schedule is the cross-town rivalry with San Diego State College. Durel Carpenter scored 17 points but these were not enough to prevent a 69-50 loss to the number one-rated Aztecs. The game was played in the new San Diego Sports Arena—the first time college teams had played a prelim to a pro basketball game. The Los Angeles Lakers and the San Diego Rockets brought out a large crowd.

At Fresno State, Sophomore Neal Schram scored 23 points, but not enough to overcome the final deficit of 87-67.

All-Coaster Ted Fields, #22, leaves USD as their fifth all time high scorer. 182

In San Diego the Toreros played one of the season's best games in the California Western Holiday Tournament. The University of San Diego downed Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo 78 to 64 as Ted Fields was high scorer with 21 points. The Toreros took Westminster 83-64 as Cabrera put though 24 points. In the title game, Cabrera again led the Toreros to victory with 23 points in a win over California-Western by the score of . Both Cabrera and Ted Fields were selected as "All Tournament."

Against Cal State Long Beach, Rick Cabrera again led his teammates to an 83-63 easy win, but in the University of California at Irvine game the Toreros were downed 81-72. At San Fernando Valley State the Toreros lost 83 to 65.

At Westmont Woolpert's won 88-76 with Cabrera pouring in 28 points and Gus Magee, USD's 6'6 center putting in 18 points. Back to Irvine, Magee scored 16 points but USD lost 67-61.

Against Pepperdine, USD downed the Waves 61-51. Against Cal Poly, the Toreros playing their best defensive game of the year won out in a thriller when Jim Wilke hit with two seconds left.

At the semester break Woolpert's men were at the University of Idaho, and despite a fine performance by Cabrera who scored 20 points including 12 of 12 free throws, the Toreros lost 64-62.

Against Gonzaga University, Gus Magee in a fine performance led in a 69-66 victory.



At Cal State, the Diablos earned easy victory of 81-72, as Ted Fields was outstanding that evening. A three game homestand began with a 51-49 victory over the University of Redlands. Ted Fields scored two free throws with two seconds left to give USD another victory.

University of California at Irvine came to the USD gym and with Cabrera scoring 18 and Fields 17, the game was a big win for USD.

With a week to prepare for the Homecoming Game, Coach Woolpert worked his team hard to meet Nevada Southern which had a 17-4 record for the season. Magee and Carpenter played great defensive ball but All-American Miller scored 30 points. With but a minute to go USD drew within two points but lost at the buzzer 87-83.

The Toreros, off to a shakey start in the next game, downed Chapman College 74-68. The team in its final homestand had Rick Cabrera to help with a 28 point performance as the Toreros downed the Whittier Poets 65-60.

In a locally televised contest, USD pulled the game out when Ted Fields stole a pass to score in the final seconds to defeat Cal-Western 69-68. In a return engagement with Cal-Western at the Sports Arena, as a preliminary to the San Diego Rockets—Cincinnati Royals game USD dropped the final game of the season 74-59. Fields was again highpoint man scored 19 in the game.

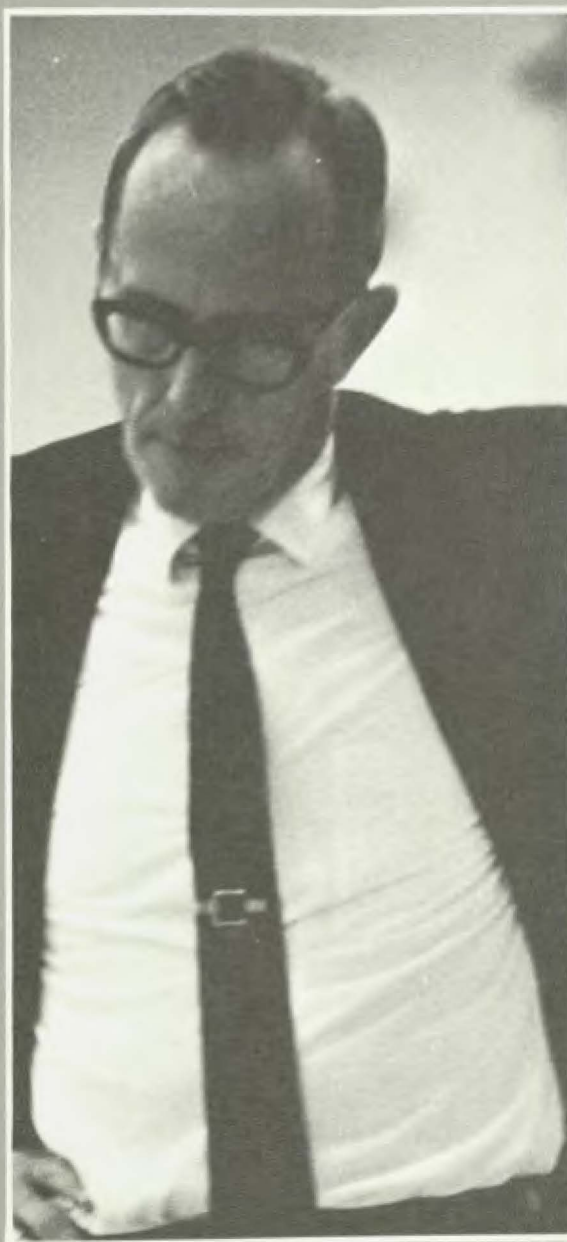
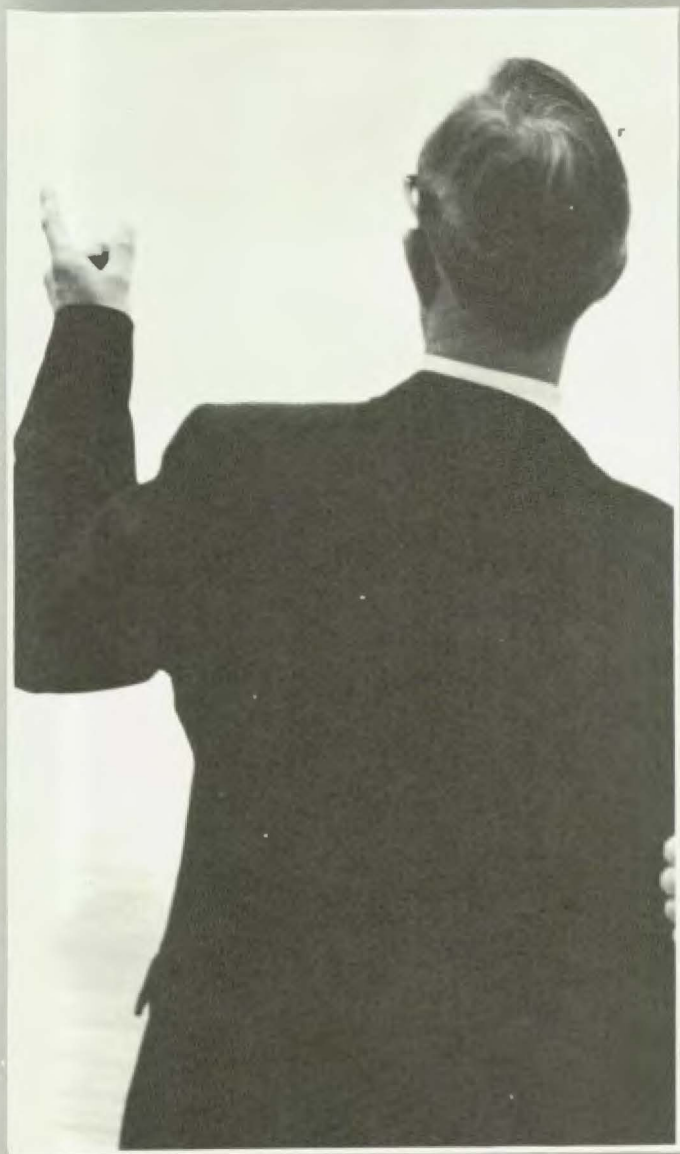
The advent of the new schedule, and the new bleachers, the more consistent and larger number of crowds, the orchestra all gave to the 1967-1968 season a ring as the best in the history of the University. The two games played as prelims to the Pro National Basketball teams, and the televised games, offer unlimited possibilities for next year.

In looking back over the 1967-1968 season, Coach Woolpert aided by John Cunningham and Bernie Bickerstaff, brought on the second best win season in the University history with 15 wins and 10 losses. Willie Moore, trainer, did an outstanding job in helping to keep injuries down to a minimum. Coach Woolpert had in fact, in order to upgrade the calibre of opponents, scheduled the toughest schedule in the team's history.

JV's: SAN DIEGO CHAMPS

JV BASKETBALL

Coach John Cunningham was faced with a unique problem this year as he formed a first year JV squad. The task proved rewarding as the Toreritos gained strength during the season and finished with an 18-8 record.

The squad looked toughest at the beginning of the year when they won their first five games, including big wins over rivals San Diego State and Cal Western. The Toreritos momentum slowed and they lost six of their nine games. Finally, though, the players began to play as a unit and from that point until the end of the season won ten games while losing only two.

Leading the Toreritos in scoring was frosh forward Steve Oberholser, the team's captain, as he chalked up 375 points for a 14.4 average. The next closest scorer was Benton White, another frosh forward, who ended the season with 316 points and a 12.1 average.

Bob Gamble, John Boone, and Nick Nicassio, shared the starting guard roles. Tim Groff, a 6-6 frosh, and Phil Hand, a 6-7 junior, served at center for the Toreritos. Groff led all rebounders with 264 in 25 games for a 10.6 average.

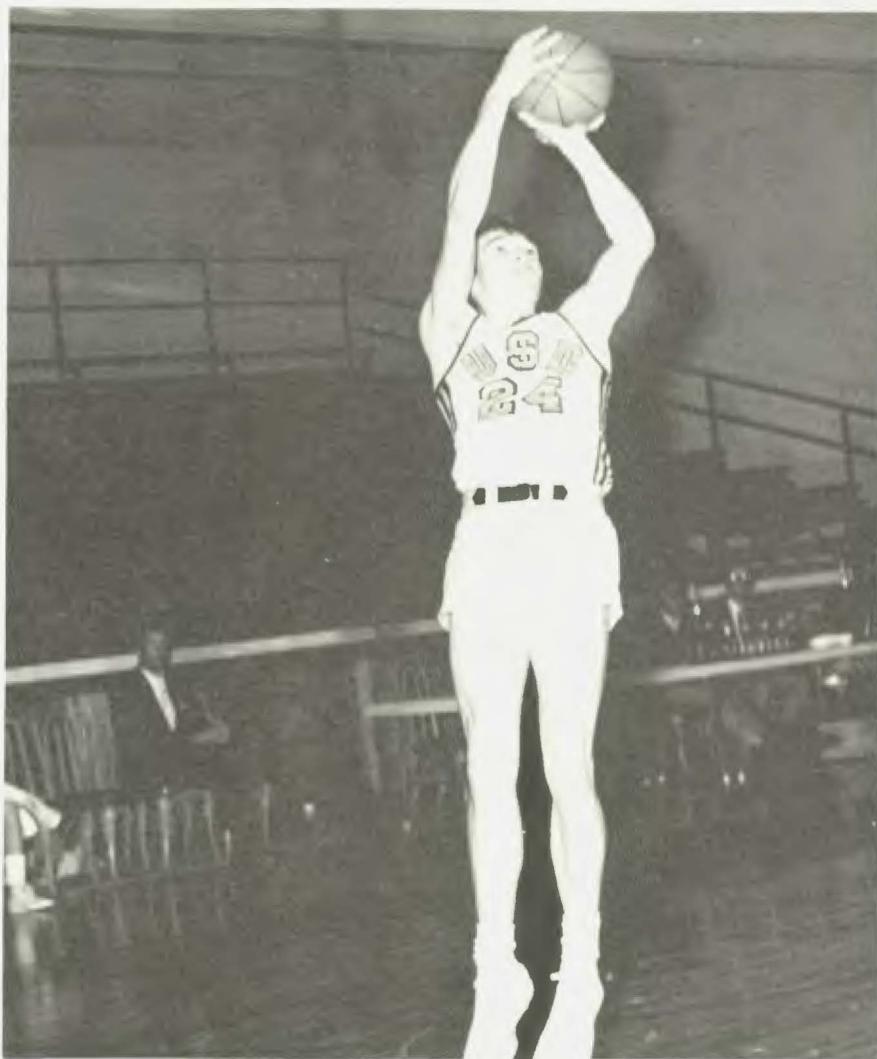
Backup forwards were Rick Sabosky, who played in all 26 games, and Dick Lavelle. Lavelle led the Toreritos in both field goal, and free throw percentages, with respective percentages of 62.2% and 86.4%.

Backing up the starters at guard were John Wathan, Don Rush, and John McGreevy, while John Gleave and Joe Fogel served behind the starting center.

The Toreritos were a running, rebounding team that specialized in fast breaks. As a result, they set the single game scoring record of 106 points in their game with the Naval Air Station, and averaged a healthy 76.5 points a game.

The Toreritos season culminated in their capture of the San Diego championship when they won the first USD Frosh-JV Basketball Tournament. The JV's defeated University of California, San Diego 80-68 in the Semi-final and, in their last game of the season, downed Cal Western 68-66 for the title.

Although they were not the best shooting team in the school's history, this year's JV's possessed the quality to win. They finished the season only one win shy of the record 19 wins set by last year's Frosh squad.

BASEBALL

The key word is optimism this year as Coach John Cunningham starts his fifth season as head baseball coach at the University of San Diego, with the toughest schedule in the school's history.

Leading the pitching staff this year is 6-6 Dural Carpenter. In the 1967 campaign Dural compiled an ERA of 1.69, the lowest in Torero history.

Two young pitchers from the San Diego area are Steve Davis and Gary Myron.

Steve Davis from Point Loma High where he led the Pointers to the Western League Championship last year, and received a position on the Brietbard All-Star team.

Gary Myron is a fire-balling right-hander from Mission Bay High, who pitched all CIF caliber ball for the Bucs last year, recording 11 victories in 14 decisions, and also was nominated a Brietbard All-Star.

Others on the hill staff include John Briskey, from Provo, Utah, Dave Timms, a southpaw from Mesa College, and Tom Brown, a side-armed from Anaheim.

The two "old men" of the '68 varsity will be counted on to carry the offensive burden this year. Chuck Rutledge, right fielder, who came to USD from Arizona State, hit .315 last year and led the team in home runs.

"Lucky" Tommy Thompson was last year's Co-MVP; a former All-CIFer at El Cajon High. Tom has played stellar ball as shortstop for the Toreros the last two years and was All-League for the Toreros last year and All-League again in the summer for La Mesa Collegians. Tommy has been drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Last year's "Hustle Award" winner is Rick Baker, a sophomore first baseman. Another sophomore starter is Dennis Forester, a 6-1 catcher who could become a candidate for All-League honors.

From St. Augustine's High are two more frosh who will be starting in the '68 season: third baseman-outfielder John Wathan and second-sacker Dave Gon-

zalez are both Brietbard All-Stars. Drafted by the New York Yankees last year, David will switch from short-stop position to second this year. John will work at third base.

Backing up the infielders will be Shasta College's All-Leager Bob Kivley, a three-letterman in high school, at home at just about all the positions on the diamond and is used as the utility man in the infield.

Clairemont High's Dwayne Lawson, a Brietbard All-Star also, Dwayne will work out as back up catcher.

The outfield consists of Ted Pecot, Dave Agosto, Rene Chevalier, and Chuck Rutledge. Dave will be the starting centerfielder and comes to USD from San Diego City College where he hit at a .390 clip last season.

Rene Chevalier, a football and baseball letterman at Grossmont JC last year, is proving a great addition to the Torero squad.

Ted Pecot comes to USD from Los Angeles, where he was All-League in basketball and baseball at Lincoln High.

Coaching the pitchers this year for the University of San Diego is Chuck Leaf, a former standout athlete at California Western University. He was assistant baseball coach at Cal Western, and for the past three years has been an English teacher, baseball coach and an assistant in football at Escondido High School.

Rone Bennett, a graduate of the University of San Diego in '65, is serving as a graduate assistant coach in baseball. Bennett played second base two years for the Toreros. He is pursuing graduate studies at USD which will lead to a Master's Degree in Education in June of this year.

The schedule is just beginning as this volume goes to the press, but if the lineup of all-stars is any signal of ability and versatility, the Torero team will prove to be one of the finest in the history of an San Diego college or University.

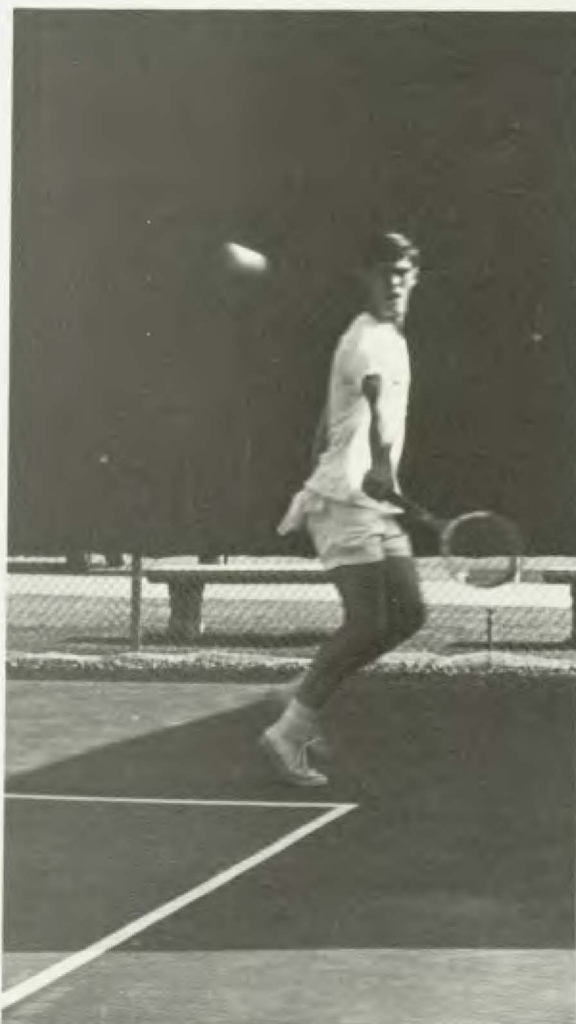
