

PROSPECTUS

Now in his fourth year heading the USD golf program, Head Coach Frank Cates sees an excellent year ahead for the Toreros. Topping the '88-'89 season — where the Toreros won two tournaments and placed second and third in others — is going to be difficult. However, four of '88-'89's top scorers return to the team

and will be joined by a couple of excellent prospects to improve the Toreros' chances.

Leading the returnees is senior team captain Rick Schultz — USD's top scorer at the Hyatt Bear Creek Invitational and New Mexico State Coca Cola Classic in '88-'89. Sophomore Creighton Aotani, an all-West Coast Conference selection last season, was USD's top scorer in four tournaments, including the WCC Championships at Heron Lakes Golf Course in Portland, Oregon. Also returning to the team are junior Tom Shea and senior Mark Yarter.

The University of San Diego is a member of NCAA Division I and is affiliated with the West Coast Conference (WCC).

The West Coast Conference Golf Championship will be held this season at the Half Moon Bay Golf Course in Half Moon Bay, California. It will run from April 23 through 25, 1990.

The University of San Diego Invitational Golf Tournament will be held again this year at the Carmel Mountain Ranch Golf Course. The tournament will run from March 12 through 13, 1990.

USD GOLF FACILITIES

Carmel Mountain Ranch — The USD Golf Team has just recently been afforded the privilege of playing this fine 6,278 yard layout in the northern part of the city. The course is noted for lakes, streams, deep pot bunkers and multi-level greens. Carmel Mountain Ranch is the site of annual qualifying for the U.S. Open and the San Diego Open tournaments. Course rating: 73.2.

Stardust Country Club — USD is very fortunate in being able to play this beautiful 27-hole layout that is located just down the hill from the campus. These courses, when combined to 18 holes offer a course of about 6,600 yards with a course rating of about 71.5. Stardust boasts some of the best greens in the area and was the site of the San Diego Open for many years.

Bear Creek Golf Club — The USD team has the privilege of playing this Jack Nicklaus course in Murietta (about 60 miles north of San Diego) against the rolling countryside of the Temecula Valley. Bear Creek, home of the 1985 Skins Game, is a long 7,024 yards from the tournament tees that features multilevel greens, deep pot bunkers, and several lakes and streams. The course rating is 75.4.

Singing Hills Country Club — The USD Golf Team has playing privileges at the two courses at Singing Hills, which is located in a beautiful valley east of El Cajon (about 15 miles from campus). The 6,573 yard Willow Glen course and the 6,132 yard Oak Glen layout were re-worked several years ago by architect Ted Robinson. The course ratings are 71.5 and 69.0.

In addition to these fine courses, an on-campus area is available for medium and short iron practice.

UNIVERSITY PROFILE

The University of San Diego is an independent Catholic university located on a 170-acre mesa overlooking Mission Bay, San Diego Harbor, and the Pacific Ocean. The Campus is named Alcalá Park after the Spanish university town where St. Didacus (i.e., Diego) spent much of his time.

Complementing its splendid natural setting is the University's location — just ten minutes from downtown San Diego and conveniently close to the major business, cultural, residential,

and recreational areas of San Diego, as well as rail, bus, and air terminals.

Founded in 1949, USD is presently experiencing a period of record growth and attendance. Undergraduate enrollment currently stands at just over 3,800 students. Graduate students bring the overall campus enrollment to 5,921 students.

The University includes a College of Arts and Sciences and Schools of Business Administratrion, Education, Nursing, and Law. Each is characterized by high academic standards, small classes, and excellent student-faculty relations.

Though the majority of USD students come from the West Coast, every region of the United States is well-represented on campus. Students from 24 foreign countries can also be found in attendance at USD.

Recreation and athletic activities are expanding rapidly and include activities such as sailing, yoga, karate, surfing, modern dance, backpacking, and ballet. Intercollegiate sports for men include baseball, basketball, crew, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, and tennis. Intercollegiately, USD fields women's teams in the sports of basketball, crew, cross country, softball, swimming, tennis, and volleyball.
