

PROSPECTUS

The 1990-91 season is one to be viewed as having great potential. States 5th year head coach Frank Cates, "We have several players who are mechanically very sound. It remains to be seen how we will get it together and handle our games on the course."

Junior team captain Creighton Aotani is returning for his third year;

senior Tom Shea returns for his fourth and final season; senior Doug Jacot begins his last of four seasons of play; and senior Phil Isbell returns for his second year of team play.

Joining this group is junior David Brown, who is a transfer from a Florida team; his freshman brother Steve Brown; junior Andy Crenilla, a junior college transfer; seniors Mark Riekhof and Doug Neary; and freshmen Jay Vigeland and Greg Firko.

The University of San Diego is a member of NCAA Division I and is affiliated with the West Coast Conference (WCC).

The West Coast Conference Golf Championship will be held this season at Heron Lakes Golf Course in Portland, Oregon from April 21-24, 1991.

GOLF FACILITIES

Stardust Country Club - Nearby Stardust Country Club remains the team's primary practice facility. The USD team is very fortunate in being able to play this beautiful 27-hole layout that is just blocks from our campus. These courses when combined to 18 holes offer a course of about 6,600 yards with a course rating of about 71.5 and a slope rating of 126. Stardust greens remain among the best in the county. The course was the site of the San Diego Open for several years.

Carmel Mountain Ranch Golf Course - USD has had the privilege of playing Carmel Mountain Ranch for three years and have held two USD Invitational Tournaments at the site. The course is noted for lakes, streams, deep pot bunkers and multi-level greens. Carmel Mountain Ranch has been the site for qualifying for the U.S. Open and the San Diego Open tournaments. The course rating is 73.2.

Bear Creek Golf Club - The USD team has the privilege of playing this Jack Nicklaus course in Murietta (about 60 miles north of San Diego) against the rolling countryside of the Temecula Valley. Bear Creek, home of the 1985 Skins Game, is a long 7,024 yards from the tournament tees that features multilevel greens, deep pot bunkers, and several lakes and streams. The course rating is 75.4.

Singing Hills Country Club - The USD Golf Team has playing privileges at the two courses at Singing Hills, which is located in a beautiful valley east of El Cajon (about 15 miles from campus). The 6,573 yard Willow Glen course and the 6,132 yard Oak Glen layout were re-worked several years ago by architect Ted Robinson. The course ratings are 71.5 and 69.0.

In addition to these fine courses, an on-campus area is available for medium and short iron practice.

Creighton has been USD's low scorer in many events entered throughout his career. He captured the Point Loma Nazarene Invitational in April of 1990; was runner-up at the CSU-Sacramento Invitational in March of 1990; and again was runner-up in the San Diego Intercollegiates his freshman year. He has also achieved medalist honors as low scorer in several of the team's dual matches.



UNIVERSITY PROFILE

The University of San Diego is an independent Catholic university located on a 180-acre mesa overlooking Mission Bay, San Diego Harbor, and the Pacific Ocean. The campus is named Alcala Park after the Spanish university town where St. Didacus (i.e., Diego) spent much of his time.

Complementing its splendid natural setting is the University's location - just ten minutes from downtown San Diego and conveniently close to the major business, cultural, residential, and recreational areas of San Diego, as well as rail, bus, and air terminals.

Founded in 1949, USD is presently experiencing a period of record growth and attendance. Undergraduate enrollment currently stands at just over 3,800 students. Graduate students bring the overall campus enrollment to just over 6,000 students.

The University includes a College of Arts and Sciences and Schools of Business Administration, Education, Nursing, and Law. Each is characterized by high academic standards, small classes, and excellent student-faculty relations.

Though the majority of USD students come from the West Coast, every region of the United States is well-represented on campus. Students from 24 foreign countries can also be found in attendance at USD.

Recreation and athletic activities are expanding rapidly and include activities such as sailing, yoga, karate, surfing, modern dance, backpacking and ballet. Intercollegiate sports for men include baseball, basketball, crew, cross country, football, golf and tennis. Intercollegiately, USD fields women's teams in the sports of basketball, crew, cross country, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The University of San Diego men's golf program does not presently offer scholarships based on athletic ability. However, financial aid is available to any incoming student, and many of our athletes at the University are currently on financial aid.
