## SCIENCE CLUB



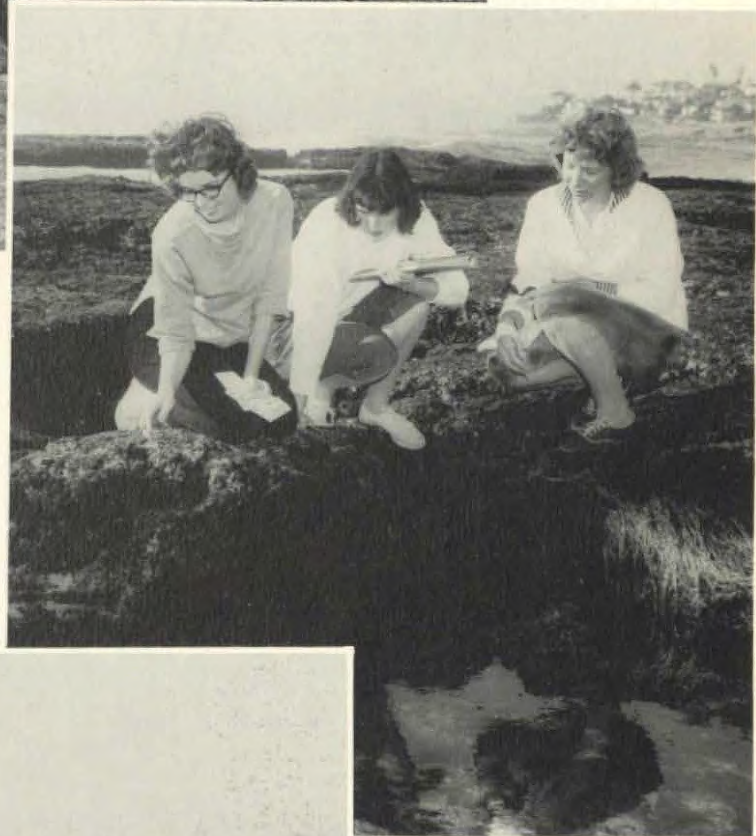
The purpose of the Science Club is to promote the interests of science among its members. San Diego has renowned scientists visiting its educational centers each year as well as a number in residence. Last year members had the privilege of hearing Nobel Prize winners in physical chemistry, biochemistry, and genetics. The club keeps its members posted on local science programs, encourages attendance, and brings as many as possible to the college. The club also helps its members to keep up with current scientific journals by panel discussions at their meetings and by asking students in the physical and life science classes to perform demonstration experiments.

A very important function of the club is to help science majors discover the particular vocation in which they can make the greatest contribution. Tours and personal contacts with scientific institutions are arranged; fellowships, grants and scholarships are investigated.

This year the officers were: Joyce Lawson, vice president; Martha Fiorino, president; Judy Turley, treasurer; and Georgia Bechler, secretary. They worked with Mother Farrens as moderator. # French Nun Now

## Citizen

An elderly French nun who wants to die an American yesterday was assured her wish in ceremonies at United States District Court.

Mother Madeleine Lambin, a teacher at San Diego College for Women, renounced her former citizenship along with 78 other aliens who joined the family of Americans at a naturalization hearing.

"It was a great sacrifice for me to renounce my French citizenship," Mother Lambin said. "But I came here 49 years ago and is has been 49 years of happiness without shadow. I wanted to die an American."

Mother Lambin came to the United States in 1912. She spent 29 years in Chicago, three years elsewhere and came to San Diego when the new college was formed in 1949.

"I love France so much, it hurts to leave her," she said. "But America—that's my home."

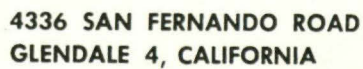

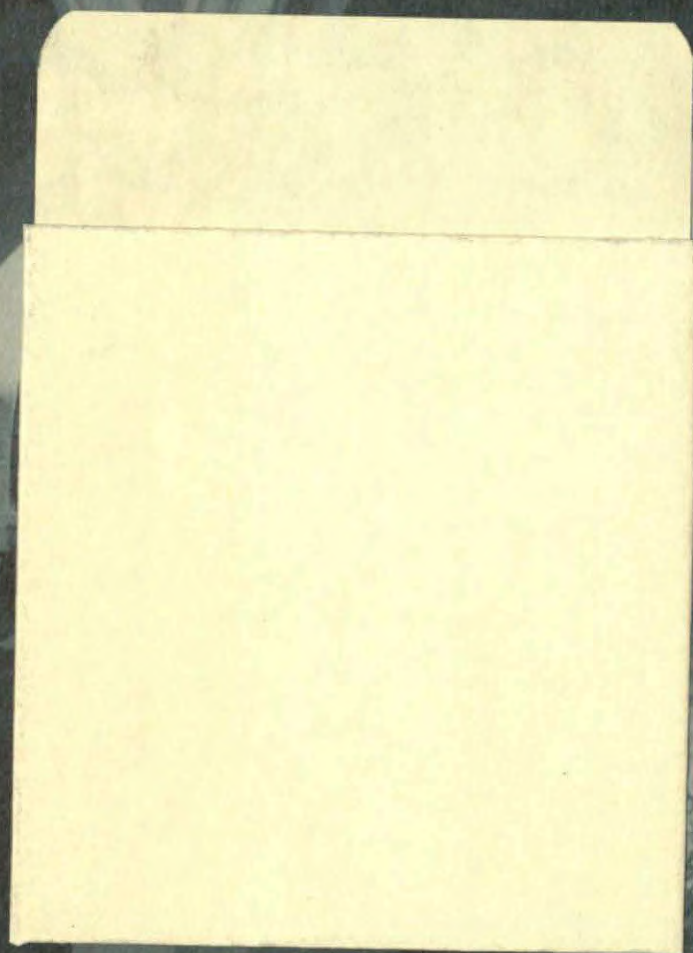
