This year the A.S.B. has taken several bold steps for the development of a more effective student government. For the first time, the decision-making process of the A.S.B. was expanded to include representatives of the classes, the resident students, the fraternities and the seminaries. These representatives, with the A.S.B. officers, form the Legislative Council.

The Legi-Council acts with and upon the recommendations of the A.S.B. Among the innovations initiated by the Legi-Council were a well-organized regis-

tration process, an effective freshman orientation program and the first annual Parents' Day—Open House. The organization also aided the A.S.B. in the publication of a Student Handbook explaining school procedures, clubs and the social calendar; in the sponsoring of the first successful major cultural event in several years—the Monterey Jazz Festival; and in the opening of a Student Lounge.

The Legi-Council, as its main function, acts in an advisory position to the A.S.B.

The literary magazine of the College for Men appeared in the spring and featured a group of poems by John Ridland, a contemporary American poet, and a special article on Fra. Junipero Serra by Professor Brandes of the History Department. Also included were poems and stories by a representative group of students from the College for Men, the College for Women, and elsewhere.

Pequoud also sponsored a series of literary readings. These were given during the noon hour throughout the year by members of the English Department and by special guests such as Mr. Sanders of the Speech Department, Fr. Sullivan of the Foreign Languages De-

partment, and Dr. Wilm Pelters of the University of California at Irvine.

Another form of *Pequoud's* contribution to the cultural life of the College was to be seen in the two graphic arts shows, "For Collectors," which were arranged for and hung in the library by the magazine staff. The opportunity for students, faculty, and friends of the College to see and purchase original works by artists such as Baskins, Chagall, Bonnard, Renoir, Rouault, Matisse and many others was obviously appreciated. As a further gesture in support of the arts on campus, the *Pequoud* staff purchased and gave to the College a fine lithograph by the Swiss artist, Alberto Giacometti.

The Student Advisory Council is an organization formed for the purpose of communicating student problems and grievances to the Administration.

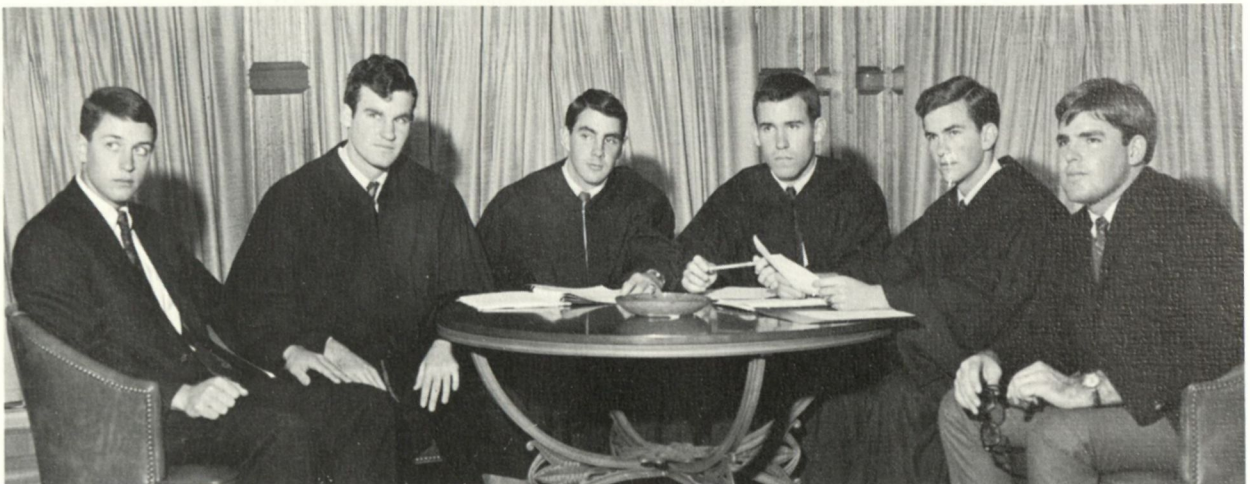
The Council has been actively engaged in improving library facilities and hours and has worked out several modifications in the procedures of events surrounding Graduation.

One of the organization's major accomplishments was its collaboration with the Resident Student Association in obtaining relaxation of restrictions on the resident students, including the lifting of nightly checks.

The purpose of the Student Court is to regulate student conduct on campus and in the apartments. The Court is the outstanding example of the new Administration policy of allowing students an increased share in regulating their own activities.

The Court's major objectives were enforcement of traffic regulations and the maintenance of proper student attire on the campus.

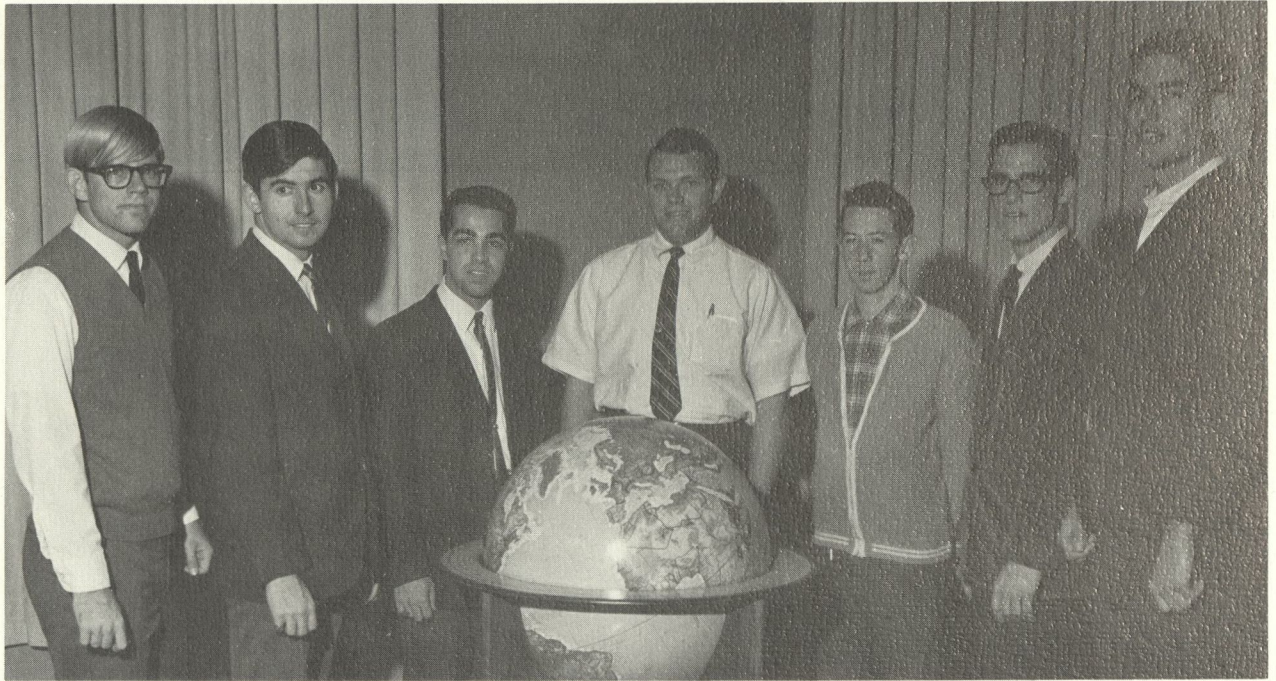

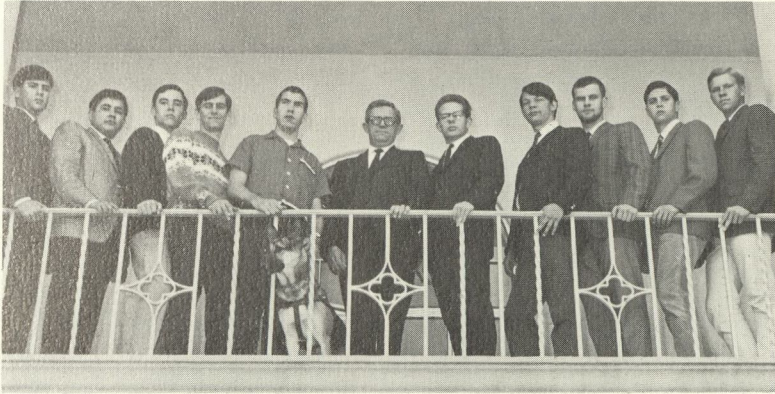

At the meeting one of the special tasks assigned the IRC was the introduction of Michael Newman, an expert on African affairs who is currently a member of the faculty.

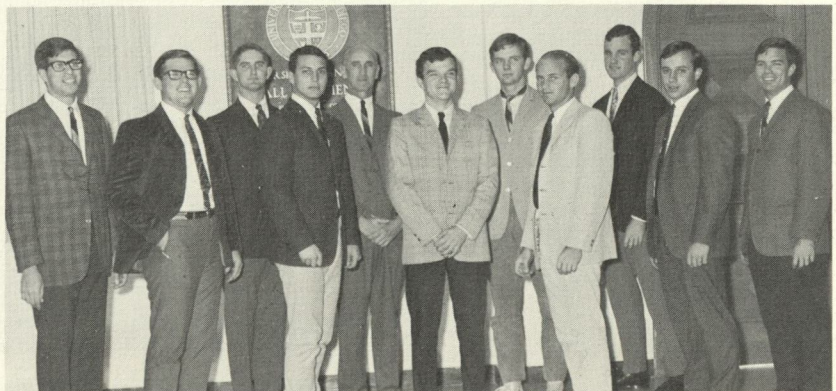

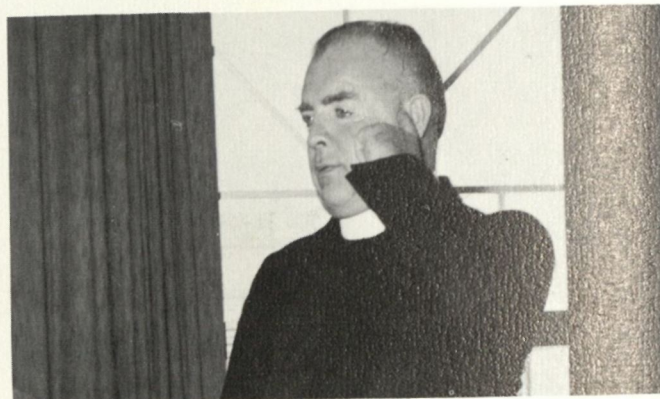

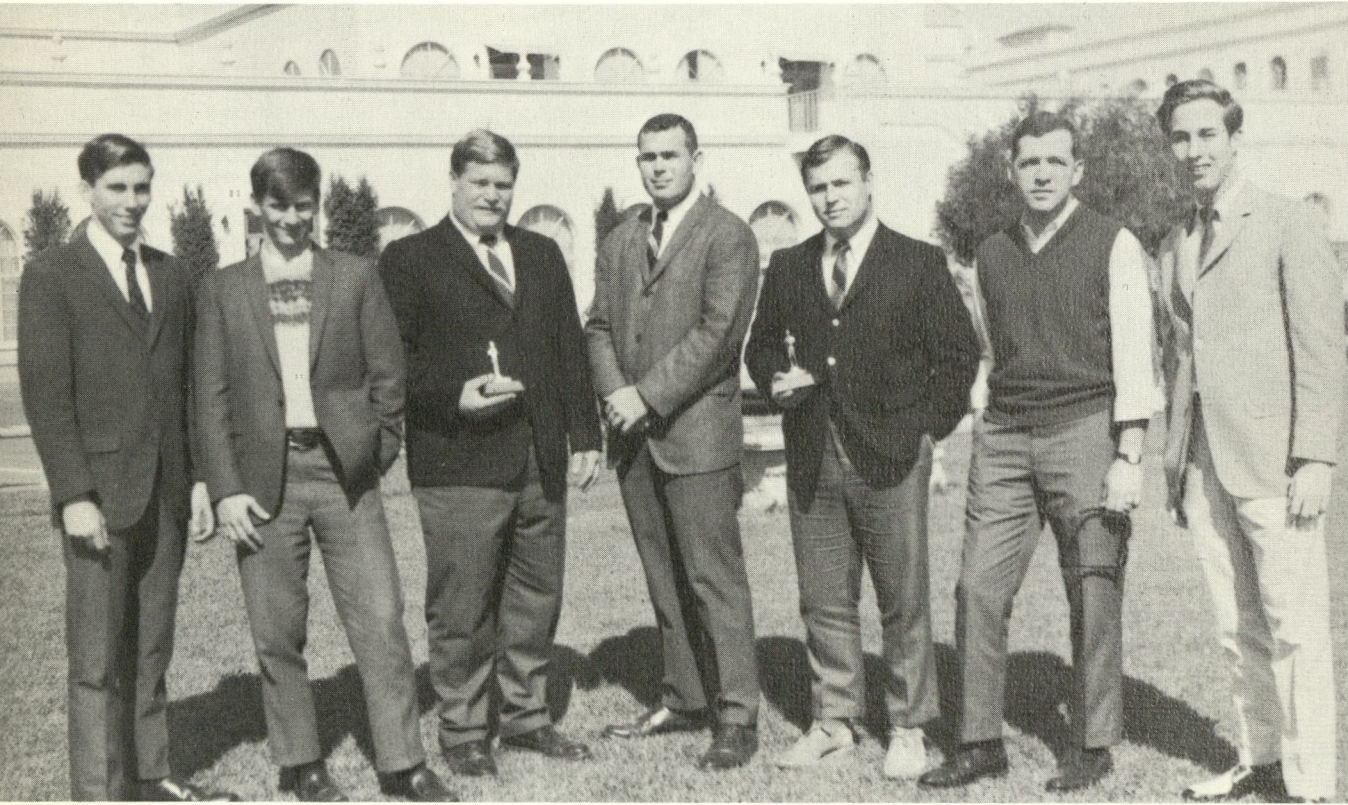

1967 saw the College for Men enter into its second year of Intercollegiate Forensic Competition. The debate team journeyed to the University of Oregon and the University of Arizona, along with numerous trips to the Los Angeles area. Under the auspices of the Pacific Southwest Collegiate Forensic Association, the debate team competed in over eleven tournaments. 1967 also saw the establishment of a 'colony' of Pi Kappa Delta, the largest national honorary speech fraternity in the United States. In the near future, a permanent chapter of the fraternity will be instituted.

The debate squad also hosted the Second Annual University of San Diego High School Speech Tournament. With over twenty-one San Diego City and County high schools present, and more than 250 contestants, the tournament was a huge success.

Records posted this year include: First place debate at Pasadena College, Second place debate at the University of Oregon, First place and undefeated in debate at San Fernando Valley State College, and numerous other awards in individual events.

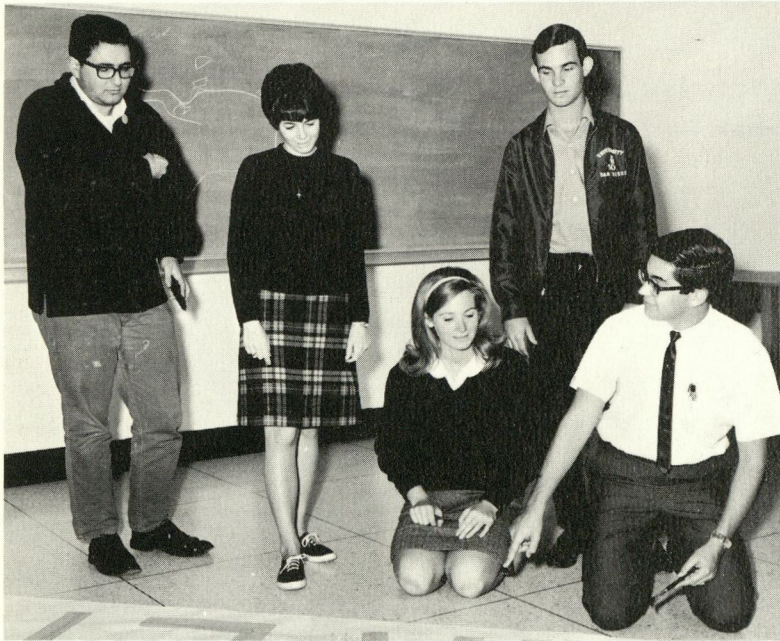

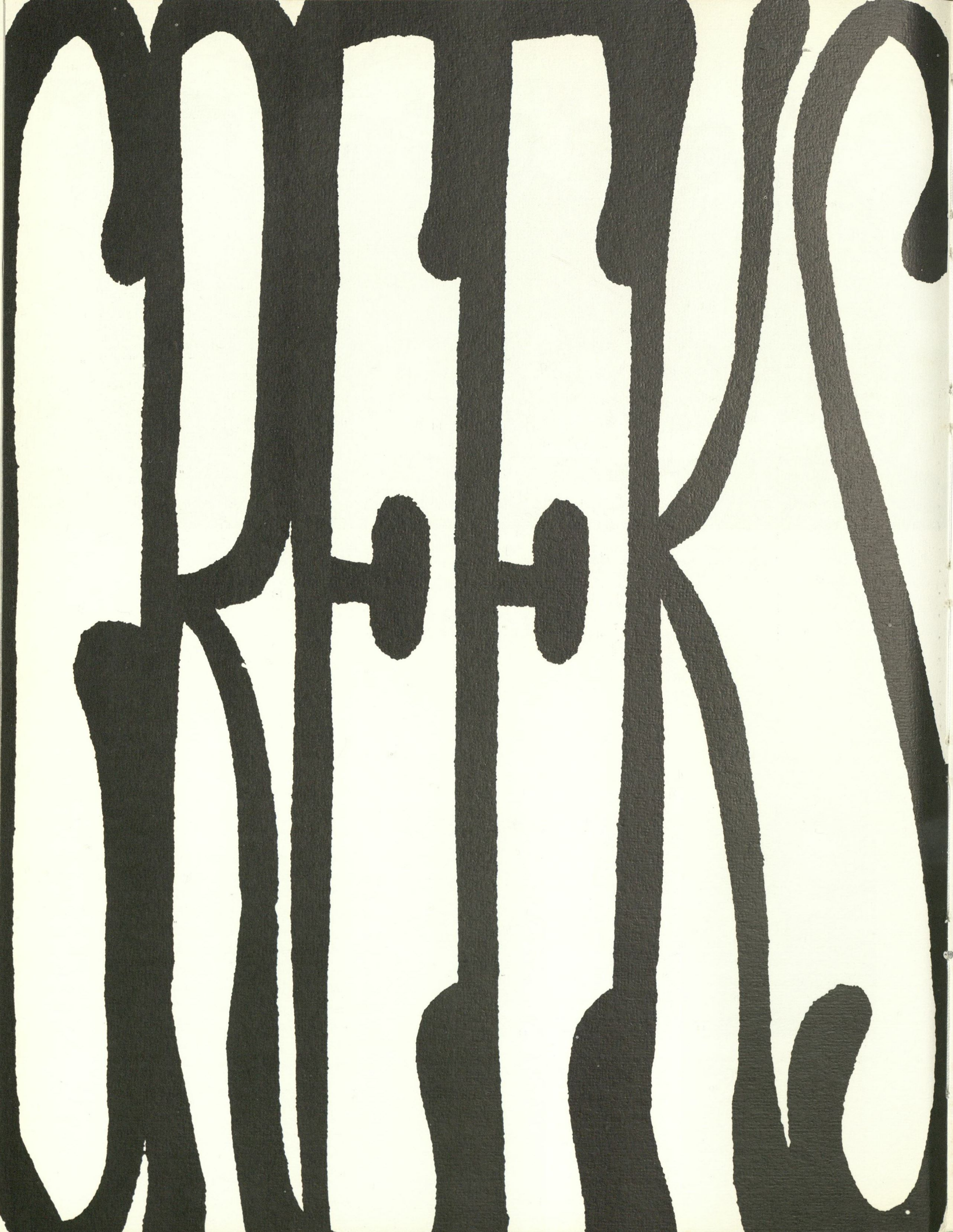

As a governing agent, the IFC reviewed the year initiated by-laws and crept forward toward another successful year.

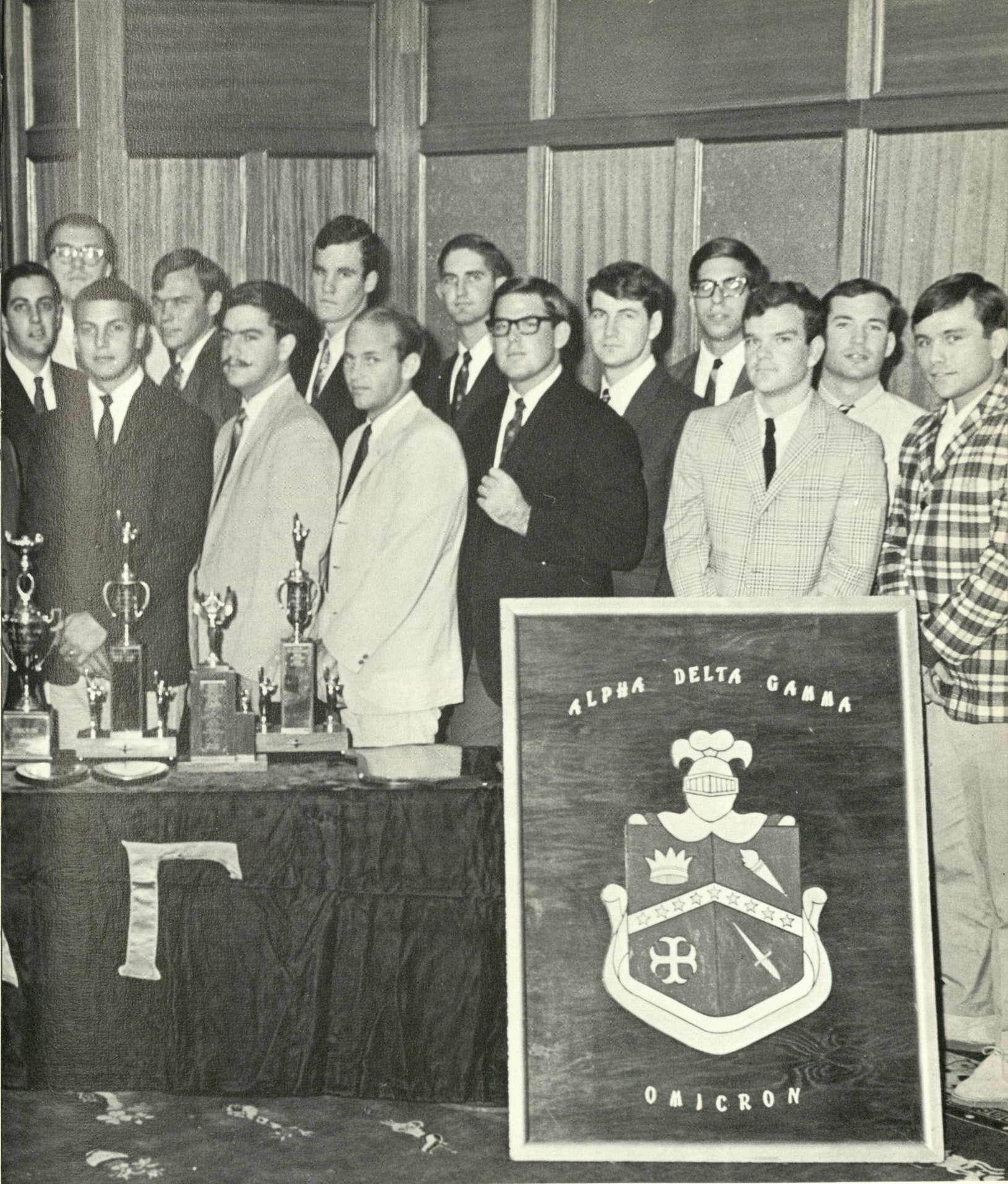

Summary

Varsity basketball gained a winning record during the 1966-67 season. The mark of 14-11 was riddled by overtimes, an excellent home show and a losing road campaign.

At home the Toreros went 8 and 1 but lost 10 of 16 on the road. Overtimes were commonplace and the team split the difference of six occasions.

Barely had they gotten by the first foe in Cal Poly, Pomona (59-58) when a run-shoot-run overtime left the Toreros on the better end of an 86-83 decision at L. A. State.

A week later the team rolled over Pepperdine's five for its first less than hair-raising win (84-70). The following day and further up the road the Toreros met Fresno St. in a foul-ridden contest which found them ten points down in their first loss (71-61).

The big game came and went in a mid-week clash which was slated as a defensive battle. It proved so with a knotted 46 to 46 score that ended in a 55 to 50 overtime defeat at the hands of crosstown rivals San Diego St.

This brought the Toreros to a 3-2 season mark as school recessed for Christmas vacation. Over the Yuletide the varsity hit two holiday tournaments. First, at the Cal Western Tourney the Toreros picked up third place with a win-lose-win against Alma of Michigan, Northern Arizona and Puget Sound.

Still on the road, but this time in the air, the Toreros headed north for a post-Christmas mistake in Montana. The Anaconda Tournament produced one win in three games. Then followed the final two game swing in the Northwest which ushered in a bleak New Year in a losing way.

Once back home, practice stiffened in preparation for Loyola of Los Angeles. The Toreros tied it in the final second then pushed hard for 74 to 66 victory.

The touring Australian Olympic team made a visit to USD but remained down under in a one-sided (71-57) trouncing by the Toreros.

Final exams were sportily relieved by a Fresno St. appearance. In a sub-filled contest the Toreros took their only home court defeat (93-84). A Pepperdine win revived the home strength.

L.A. State came down, with San Fernando Valley a day behind, as the Toreros sustained their winning ways as they handled these two (69-61, 65-56). Chapman ran the string to four as the Toreros picked off an 86-78 win in overtime.

A win at Whittier took the string to five (70-61). The Toreros then concentrated on highly rated Cal Western as Homecoming drew near. Those who weren't turned away saw this one as the Toreros rolled to a 68-57 win which was to initiate a back-to-back split as the Westerners picked up the next encounter (75-70).

The Toreros now owned a 14 and 9 record as they boarded the bus for points north. It was an up-and-back Cal Poly, Pomona loss (83-65) and an up-and-back overtime UC Irvine loss the following day.
