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
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PROPOSAL OVERVIEW

During the period between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011 the University of San Diego faculty and administrators submitted 98 federal, state/city, private and international proposals for research, training, scholarship and service. The total amount requested by all units was \$22,630,202. Of the 98 proposals submitted 43.88% were awarded, 37.76% were declined, 1.02% were blended with an existing project and 17.35% are pending.



AWARD OVERVIEW

During the fiscal year the University received 129 new and continuing multi-year awards totaling \$29,059,710. Of these awards \$350,000 was for equipment; \$2,279,227 for instruction; \$10,186,886 for research; \$450,000 for scholarship; \$10,177,798 for service and \$5,615,798 for training. There were 129 new and continuing awards during the Fiscal Year 2010-2011. The Office of Sponsored Programs managed 125 awards in total; 45 new awards and 80 continuing awards for a total of \$27,788,789 (multi-year amount). One (1) of the new award managed by the Office of Sponsored Programs for \$250,000 was submitted by Development and determined to be a grant. Additionally, three (3) awards were turned over to scholarship accounts for a total of \$1,254,933, and one (1) award, determined to be a service agreement, was turned over to SOLES management for \$16,000.



PROJECT FUNDING FORECAST: FISCAL YEARS 2012-2015





The Henry Luce Foundation awarded Chemistry and Biochemistry, Professor Dr. Debbie Tahmassebi a five-year Clare **Boothe Luce** Professorship in 2009 in the amount of \$586.380. Lauren Benz was then hired as the prestigious Clare Boothe Luce (CBL) Professor to fill the role of junior researcher on this career development grant. The CBL Professorship was funded to fulfill the wishes of its namesake, "to encourage women to enter, study, graduate, and teach" in science, math, and engineering.

Dr. Benz anticipates that her research: "Fundamental Investigation of the Role of Defects in Sulfer Removal Over Titanium Dioxide" will provide information that will impact the design of future catalysts. Restrictions on the sulfer content of fuels are tightening while supplies of light-weight fuels diminish. As a result better catalytic methods for sulfur removal will be required.








