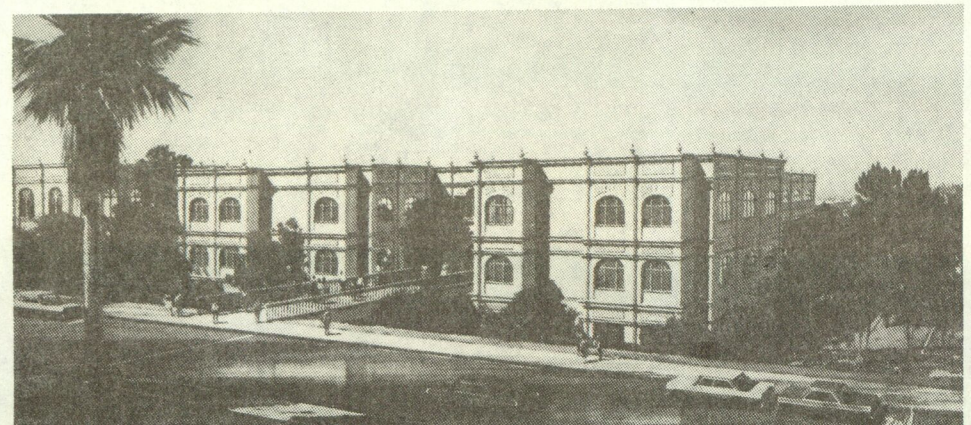

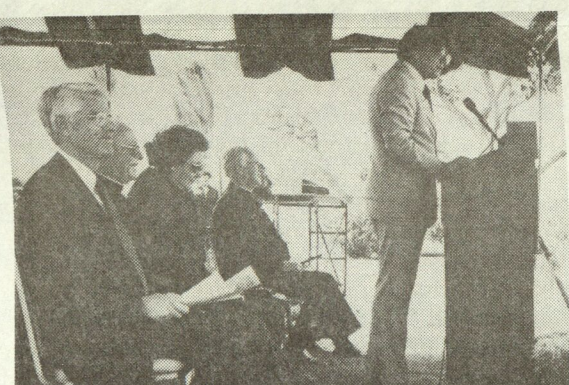
USD Close-ups: Groundbreaking 1982



Bishop Maher, Mrs. Copley, and President Hughes detail the Discovery Campaign and construction projects for members of the press and television media at the news conference held in the Philip Y. Hahn School of Nursing just prior to groundbreaking ceremonies. Dr. Hughes described, in addition to the Library expansion, the new School of Business Administration building and the Manchester Executive Conference Center (see below).



The proposed School of Business Administration building has been designed by architects Tucker, Sadler & Associates, and is scheduled to begin construction in early spring. Located west of the Executive Conference Center, its 45,000 square feet will house instructional facilities, faculty offices, seminar rooms, lounge space, and centers for student accounting, word processing, and computer science instruction. A tripled enrollment in the School over the past five years has mandated the new facility.



Dr. William L. Pickett, vice president for University Relations, addresses the some 200 alumni, parents, friends, and faculty and staff of the University who braved a stormy day to attend groundbreaking ceremonies. Dr. Pickett and his staff worked closely with Mrs. Copley, chairman of the Discovery Campaign, in achieving the \$15 million goal.

Bearing the name of USD trustee Douglas Manchester, whose \$500,000 leadership gift last year moved the project forward, the Manchester Executive Conference Center will be located just west of the School of Nursing. Designed by Tucker, Sadler & Associates, it will serve as the premier conference facility of the University, housing seminar and workshop rooms — many of which will become instructional centers for the Continuing Education program — and classrooms.

USD announces Weingart grant — new Center for Dispute Resolution

A new center for alternatives to litigation in the resolution of disputes, funded in part by a \$125,000 grant from the Weingart Foundation, was announced in October by Sheldon Krantz, dean of the USD School of Law. Speaking in behalf of the School and the San Diego Law Center, another USD project, Krantz applauded the Weingart Foundation for "its generosity and forward-looking concern with the welfare of the community" in making the grant. "This action," Krantz added, "and the support of San Diego foundation trustee Sol Price, enabled the immediate implementation of a vital activity which might otherwise have been delayed for a considerable time."

"The formal legal system is in trouble," Krantz said, observing that numerous studies have documented the "alarming increase" in both the costs of and delays in the use of litigation to resolve disputes. Citing various plans to establish alternatives to litigation — studies by the American Bar Association, Congressional legislation supporting experimentation with neighborhood justice centers, and new state programs such as "Rent-a-Judge" — the dean said there is growing pressure both in the legal profession and outside of it to find approaches to this country's "heavy reliance on litigation," which he characterized as a peculiarly American phenomenon. "Most countries," Krantz said, "historically and currently resolve disputes through reliance on village elders, extended family members, and neighbors, rather than on institutional methods such as courts. In many countries, such as Japan, it is considered demeaning to file or to be involved in lawsuits." While the values of one society cannot be transferred to another, he pointed out, it is important to recognize that other countries do manage to resolve disputes without undue reliance on lawyers and courts.

The new Center is envisioned as a possible solution to the problem in San Diego, and as a means of testing and promoting alternatives to litigation in dispute resolution. The purposes of the Center are: to initiate demonstration non-litigation projects; to develop and provide training in non-litigation forms of resolution for persons who would be working in these and related projects; to develop and provide education programs for the general public and for special groups such as business executives, on the benefits of non-litigation forms of dispute resolution; to develop new courses and materials to sensitize law and business students to the advantages of avoiding costly and delay-ridden litigation; and to provide assistance to other groups that may be interested in starting similar programs.

Krantz said the decision on where the first project undertaken by the Center remains to be made, but preference will be given to southeast San Diego. Once the area is selected, residents from the area, representatives of community organizations, and Center staff will work together to discover ways to mediate disputes involving petty theft, vandalism, assaultive behavior, and family or neighborhood disputes, and the plight of low-income residents who are most affected by the decline in Federal support for legal services.

A second project planned is for the mediation of business disputes, an experimental program which would test alternative forms of resolution and would be formed with the guidance of a business executives advisory committee.

An advisory board for the new Center has been formed, with William McGill, Ph.D., former chancellor of the University of California at San Diego and recently retired president of Columbia University; Monsignor I. Brent Eagen, USD trustee and chancellor of the Diocese of San Diego; Judge Leland Nielsen of the U.S. District Court; Judge William Yale, retired justice of the San Diego Superior Court, and Krantz as members.



Mexico-U.S. Law Institute launched

The announcement of a new Mexico-United States Law Institute, being established by the University of San Diego School of Law, was made by Sheldon Krantz, dean of the School, at the U.S.-Mexico Border Governors Conference luncheon on September 18.

The Institute, still in the planning stages, will be conducted jointly with one or more Mexican law schools, for five primary purposes: to expand knowledge of the legal systems in both countries; to undertake research and development projects with emphasis on reducing unnecessary legal barriers to cooperation and joint development; to stimulate exchanges of faculty and students; to increase the number of Mexican-American law students attending the USD law school; and to focus national attention to important legal issues affecting the two countries.

"The futures of the United States and Mexico are inextricably tied together," Krantz said. "Nowhere is this more evident than here, in the San Diego-Tijuana region, where the advantages of joint cooperation and economic development are so promising." However, the dean said, there are many differences between the two countries which "inhibit joint cooperation and development." He cited significant cultural and language barriers, dissimilar legal systems, discriminatory laws in both countries, and ignorance about or confusion over the two legal systems.

Krantz commented that the University of San Diego is in an excellent position to create the institute, both because of its geographical location and because of its demonstrated competence in international programming — the School for several years has operated summer programs for law students in Guadalajara as well as abroad, and offers a Master's degree program in Comparative Law.

Projected undertakings for the new Institute include: training and legal education programs for lawyers, academics, students, and corporate executives in both countries, comparing legal systems with special focus on tax and banking laws; creation of a Mexican Law Collection at USD, with volumes of major significance translated into English; exchanges of faculty and students between USD and at least one of the leading Mexican law schools; increased emphasis on Mexican-American comparative law in the existing Master's program; sponsorship of national conferences on issues of importance to both countries.

USD School of Law to co-sponsor public forums

Is the document written nearly 200 years ago — and which has been the cornerstone of our society — still viable today?

This winter, Southern Californians are invited to a free public forum where they will hear some of the country's top spokesmen discuss such constitutional issues as federalism vs. decentralization, the status of our criminal justice system, and the proposed balanced-budget amendment to the Constitution.

Titled "We the People: The Viability of the Constitution in the 1980s," the forum is being sponsored by the School of Law and the University of California, San Diego's Extension program and Department of History. Four sessions will be held, on Wednesday evenings in February — those on February 2 and 16 at the UCSD School of Medicine, and on February 9 and 23 in the Grace Courtroom of the USD School of Law. Speakers will include a White House staff member, experts on federalism, and an author of the proposed balanced-budget amendment now before Congress. All are open to the public without charge.

Intersession to begin January 3

Enrollment is open to anyone 55 years or older, and the tuition remains at \$35. Participants must be able to provide their own transportation.

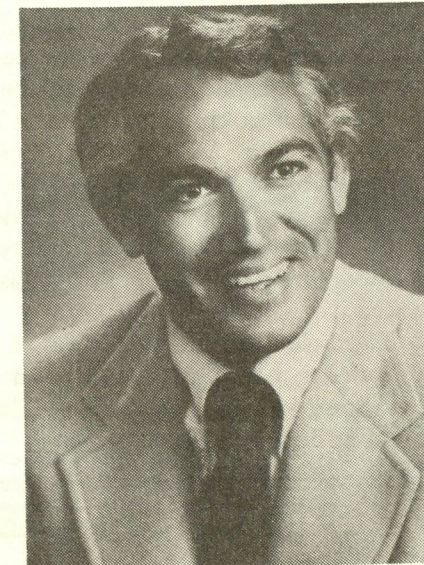

School of Education receives grants

USD's School of Education was among a number around the country receiving Dean's Grants as a result of the passage of Public Law 94-142, the Education for All Handicapped Act of 1975. The grants are awarded through the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped, U.S. Office of Education. The purpose of the grants is to increase awareness, understanding, and knowledge levels relative to disabled learners among university faculties that train pre-service regular education teachers, support staff including administrative personnel, and doctoral students training for leadership positions. This year's grant to USD was \$39,100.

According to Dr. Edward DeRoche, dean of the School, the Division of Special Education has been awarded a grant of \$26,240 for the current academic year by the Division of Personnel Preparation, U.S. Department of Education. The purpose of the grant is to provide funding for a one-year, full-time faculty position in the area of the severely handicapped and to provide four half-time tuition assistantships to graduate students in this area. Dr. Jan Writer presently serves in the faculty position, coming to USD from the University of Arizona, where she was coordinator of the graduate program in the area of the sensory impaired/multihandicapped. Recipients of the graduate assistantships for this year are GIGI GULLEY, Kathleen Kugler, Yvonne Van Son, and Mary Evans.

President's Club

Brochure on tax advantages offered

"There's a popular belief in many circles that people make gifts to institutions in order to save taxes. Those of us involved in developing support for charitable and educational organizations know that this simply isn't true." This is the belief of Dr. Gilbert Brown, Special Assistant to the President at USD.

"One doesn't first decide that he must do something to lower his taxes and then, on looking around, hit upon a gift as a way to obtain relief," Dr. Brown continues. "The desire to help the University comes first; it is only when that desire to help exists that the beneficial tax laws have any effect."

Dr. Brown points out that charitable giving has come under increasing scrutiny by many tax "reformers" in recent years, but rules on giving are still advantageous to donors. "This year particularly, with the rapid surge in stock prices, there is a definite advantage to individuals who may be facing a capital gains problem."

Dr. Brown adds that the University is currently distributing new brochures which outline the tax advantages of fifteen popular gift plans.

People-to-People program has successful maiden voyage

Last June, UPDATE reported that a new program established by USD's religious Studies Club, "People-to-People," would get underway during the summer with the departure of Dr. Gary Macy, assistant professor of religious studies, and a team of students (Ann Waggoner, then a freshman, from India; and James Teixeira, a senior from Carlsbad) for Chulucanas, Peru. In that town of 40,000 residents, they would live for four weeks, sponsored by Augustinian Father Gary Rye. The team returned in late August. Some of Dr. Macy's impressions are reflected in the following UPDATE interview.

The People-to-People program is entirely self-sustaining. Contributions enabling the continuation of the effort are welcome — Dr. Macy says "anything from a dime on up." UPDATE: Before you left, you said the team was not going to Chulucanas to "do" anything for the Peruvians, but to learn from them. Did you find that to be the case?

GM: Absolutely. The program was formed precisely because we know we have a great deal to learn from what is truly a different world. I think it is impossible to understand just how different it is until one has experienced it firsthand. What we consider poverty here in the States would be considered middle-class living down there. In Chulucanas, for example, we learned that 60% of the children die before they reach their third birthday. Since the law provides that bodies must be buried within 24 hours of death, everyday at four o'clock one could see people carrying bodies of their families to the cemetery. Fr. Rye described seeing a father go by on his bicycle, carrying a small casket under one arm. It is such a commonplace, there are no longer any services; they are simply buried. The major reason for these deaths is tuberculosis or other lung involvements resulting from the dust — there has been a drought for six years in that area, and children breathe dust constantly. The streets are not paved, they are powdery-fine dust, and the children play in them.

Poverty in the country is bad, but in the cities it is worse. One quarter of the Peruvian population live in Lima, many of them people from the country who think they will find a better life. They end up living in huts made of straw mats and cardboard, thrown up wherever they can find an empty lot. They call these little settlements "pueblos juvenes," new villages. In these "new villages," unemployment ranges from 80 to 90 per cent, disease is rampant, there are thousands of kids on the streets stealing anything they can carry, hoping to make enough money to buy a little food.

UPDATE: What would you say was your most valuable insight from the experience?

GM: The major purpose of the program is to put into proper perspective our romanticized ideas about poverty. One idea we hear often goes something like "The lazy slobs, if they would just do what we do, everything would be fine." The other romantic idea is that these people are heroes. They aren't heroes. They are simply people who know they have to find a way to live with their fate. My most dramatic insight came not in Peru but when I first returned to this country, by way of Miami. I was struck by the tremendous amount of fear in this country, baseless fear. Americans are afraid of their own future — they think they have to be a "success" or they will starve to death. They are in a trap society has created for them, thinking if they don't have a car, if they don't own their own home, if they don't have this and that, they will die. Experiences such as ours in Peru put our way of life into a different perspective. We learn that a good deal of the rest of the world does not live the way we do, yet survives. We learn that it is possible to be poor, jobless, perhaps in ill health and still have a sense of our own value as human beings. Not that there's inherent virtue in being poor, but that our attitudes about poverty need changing.

I would like to see this program grow so that our students can gain a sense of perspective. We need programs which train people to be sensitive to different perspectives, to help them get to know other ways of living, and to experience the lessons that those other lives have to teach us. Students who participate in this program have strict requirements — our biggest fear is that People-to-People will come to be seen as a kind of grand vacation. It's not that at all. Participants must pay their own way — their parents may not help.

But the rewards for participation are immeasurable. By encountering life in the Third World, we encounter something of ourselves.

Annual Report reflects growth, strengthening partnerships

Growth in enrollment, growth in assets, growth in gift income, growth in faculty numbers, student financial aid — all benchmarks of the success story told by the University's Annual Report for 1981-1982, just published by the USD Office of Public Relations.

Figures included in the Report show that gift income at the end of fiscal 1982 totalled \$2,693,313, compared to \$714,016 in fiscal 1976; total assets had increased to \$63,289,054 compared to \$34,960,214 in 1976; the annual operating budget was \$26.7 million, more than twice the 1978 figure of \$12.6; and revenues had jumped to \$27.9 million from \$13.3 million in 1978. Additionally, the \$1.8 million deficit accumulated by the University in the early years of its operations was completely eliminated by the end of the fiscal year.

"That success," President Hughes writes in the opening pages of the Report, "derives in no small part from the University's relationship to the corporate sector, a relationship which is nowhere more clearly expressed than in the presence and dedication of corporate leaders on our Board of Trustees."

Amplifying the theme of partnership, Bishop Leo T. Maher, chairman of the USD board, speaks of the University's overriding partnership with the Judeo-Christian heritage in general and with the Catholic faith in particular. "I know of no human activity outside that of the Church itself in which the bond between the religious and the laity is more evident — or, indeed, more productive — than the activity of higher education. Certainly that is true at the University of San Diego, an institution which had its genesis in the vision and energies of Most Reverend Charles F. Buddy and Reverend Mother Rosalie Hill, RSCJ. The moral, ethical, and humanitarian values these two founders embodied remain as living traditions on this campus, manifest over and over again by a dedicated, responsible Board of Trustees and an administration and faculty who daily direct and shape the affairs of the University."

Also reflecting the University's relationship with the community are statements by trustees Helen K. Copley, chairman and CEO for Copley Newspapers; Daniel W. Derbes, president, The Signal Companies; Patricia Howe Ellison, Partner and Manager, L.F. Rothschild, Unterberg, Towbin of San Francisco; Kim Fletcher, chairman and CEO, Home Federal Savings and Loan Association; Douglas F. Manchester, president, Torrey Enterprises, Inc.; George M. Pardee, Jr., recently retired chairman of Pardee Construction Company; Leland S. Prussia, chairman, Bank-America Corporation; and Walter J. Zable, president and CEO, Cubic Corporation.

Discovery Campaign, \$15 million goal, announced at Copley Library groundbreaking

"I am pleased to be able to announce today that the \$15 million dollar goal of the Discovery Campaign has been reached. Through these investments in the strength of independent higher education and in the University of San Diego, we move forward in our plans for the future. Only a few people will actually hold the spades which turn the earth this morning, but as we join together in the groundbreaking ceremony, we acknowledge with gratitude all those who made this day possible."

With these words, Mrs. Helen K. Copley, vice chairman of the USD Board of Trustees, chairman of the University's development campaign, and chairman and CEO of Copley Newspapers, announced at ceremonies on a windswept campus November 9 that the three-year effort to raise funds for facilities expansion had been successful. This was the first public announcement of the campaign, which has been conducted by the University Relations division of the University following studies conducted in 1979.

The occasion for the announcement was the groundbreaking for the construction of an expanded James S. Copley Library — now to be designated the Helen K. and James S. Copley Library in recognition of Mrs. Copley's personal gifts to the project and her leadership in a \$1,500,000 grant from the J. S. Copley Foundation.

The new construction — to get underway shortly after January 1 and scheduled for completion next September — will more than double the size of the existing library, adding 38,000 square feet and 480 reader stations. It will permit the volume collection to grow from 245,000 to some 350,000 and will house service desks, seminar rooms, and study reference areas.

Other major gifts for the library project include the W. M. Keck Foundation, \$500,000; the Edyth Bush Charitable Foundation, \$150,000; the National Endowment for the Humanities, a \$400,000 challenge grant; the Dan Murphy Foundation, \$100,000; and gifts from the Ahmanson Foundation, Atlas Hotels, Robert Golden Foundation, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest O. Ellison of San Francisco, Home Federal Savings and Loan, and Wells Fargo Bank.

President Hughes, in remarks at the ceremony, commented that the literal groundbreaking for the library was also a symbolic groundbreaking for other projects of the Campaign: for the new School of Business Administration building, to be situated across Marian Way from the Copley Library, and for the Manchester Executive Conference Center, to be constructed between the Philip Y. Hahn School of Nursing and the new Business facility. Both projects are slated for beginning construction in early Spring, 1983.

"A fourth project, which becomes our leading priority," Hughes said, "is the construction of a student center, a centralized facility for dining, recreation, health services, and conduct of student government affairs. Funding for this \$6 million facility is now being sought."

The president told some 200 guests and media representatives that "All of these projects have been mandated by the remarkable rate of growth in student population." Citing an increase of 72% in headcount enrollment over the past five years and a tripled enrollment in the School of Business during the same period, he said, "Our plans for campus development are not the product of aspiration or anticipation of growth; they are our answer to a clear and pressing existing need."

The opening statement at the news conference which preceded the groundbreaking and luncheon was made by Bishop Leo T. Maher, D.D., chairman of the USD



Board. Bishop Maher recalled the genesis of the University. "In 1937, Bishop Charles F. Buddy, on his way from St. Joseph, Missouri to the new diocese of San Diego, of which he would become the first bishop, stopped off in San Francisco to visit Mother Rosalie Hill, superior of the San Francisco College for Women and Vicar of the Western Vicariate of her Society. 'Someday,' Bishop Buddy said to her, 'I will ask the Religious of the Sacred Heart to come to San Diego to help me with the work of education.' Bishop Buddy and Mother Hill did indeed become partners in education, and today we stand in the midst of the actualization of the vision foreshadowed in Bishop Buddy's remark."

"What began as a partnership between the Diocese and the Religious of the Sacred Heart," Bishop Maher continued, "has today spread and grown into a partnership which engages the community of San Diego and the larger community of persons who understand the role of private higher education in the welfare and vitality of our nation. It is all those partnerships we acknowledge and celebrate today... exemplified by people such as Helen Kinney Copley."

President Hughes also paid tribute to Mrs. Copley. "Her concern for this community and for this University will be, in the coming months, embodied in the stone and steel of the building which will bear her name, but the less visible effects of her trusteeship shall not be forgotten."

Ceremonies took place on the west lawn of Founders Hall during a brief lull in what was otherwise San Diego's largest storm of the year. Monsignor I. Brent Eagen, USD trustee and Chancellor of the Diocese, delivered the invocation — and promised that the weather would hold. Shortly after the conclusion of the groundbreaking, as guests were settling down for the luncheon held in the Library, the tropical storm resumed its downpour.

Enrollment figures leap again

Official enrollment figures for Fall 1982 have been announced by the Office of the Provost, showing a continued increase in student population.

Undergraduate headcount enrollment stands at 3,150 with 699 students enrolled in graduate programs — 27 students in the Orange County religious studies program — 1,154 in the School of Law (89 of them at the Orange County campus), with a total headcount of enrollment of 5,003 and a total on-campus enrollment of 4,894.
