With a donation of \$7 million by Sid and Jenny Craig, the University of San Diego received the lead gift necessary to proceed with building its much needed \$17.5 million Sports/Activities Center. The University of San Diego and the Torero Athletic family were pleased to open the state-of-the-art facility in October of 2000.

"The Jenny Craig Pavilion allows the USD Basketball program to compete in one of the nation's finest basketball facilities," states Head Coach Kathy Marpe. "The University of San Diego thanks Jenny Craig for her generous donation. The team and the coaching staff are grateful for the opportunity to play in such a fine arena."

The pavilion, which is located at the eastern end of campus between Torero Stadium and Cunningham Baseball Field, includes a 5,100-seat gymnasium, coach's offices, fitness center and athletic training facilities, showers and locker rooms, concessions stand, and reception room. The Monsignor I.B. Eagen Plaza off the Pavilion entry, takes advantage of the view across campus to the ocean. The Chet and Marguerite Pagni Family Athletic Hall of Fame also is housed in the pavilion, along with the Warren Hospitality Suite located on the third floor.

"The Jenny Craig Pavilion is vital to the quality of life on campus," said Tom Iannacone, USD Director of Athletics. "It will have a positive and historical impact on many generations of students. It will also allow us to pursue championship venues for women's and men's basketball, and women's volleyball."

Other benefits the administration and coaches enjoy are the opportunity to host special events, concerts, attract television coverage of games, host tournaments and other unique events that had before been held off campus. For the third straight year the University of San Diego will host the West Coast Conference women's and men's basketball tournaments in the Pavilion with game dates set for March 6-10, 2003.

2002-03 Season Preview

Toreros Armed with Experience and Talented Young Players

With four starters returning from last winter's team, San Diego has their sights set high in 2002-03. The Toreros put together a string of seven consecutive victories in non-conference play last year, starting the season 10-4. USD will try and duplicate that start when this season begins on November 23rd in Long Beach. Veteran Head Coach Kathy Marpe has brought in four talented young players to complement an experienced line-up that has depth both on the perimeter and in the paint.



Kerri Nakamoto is USD's all-time career leader in 3-point shooting

The senior duo of guard Kerri Nakamoto and forward Erin Malich will lead the Toreros offensively, with both players returning off excellent junior seasons. Nakamoto, a native of San Jose, California buried a San Diego record 64 three-pointers last year and finished fifth in the nation in three-point accuracy. Malich, an athletic post player with the ability to shoot the jump shot, poured in a team-high 14.7 points per game as a junior, and ranked among the league leaders in blocked shots.

Anchoring the Torero line-up will be center Marta Menuez. The junior from Bodega, California averaged 11.7 points a game as a sophomore and proved to be one of the best offensive rebounders in the conference. Clearing a teamhigh 84 offensive boards last year, Menuez provides USD with formidable size in the front court to complement athletic and active players such as Malich and junior Melissa Padgett.

The departure of record-setting floor leader Melissa Glazebrook to graduation

leaves a void at the point guard position. Redshirt freshman Polly Dong and newcomer Tiara Harris are both ex-

pected to see time at point. Before falling to injury before the start of last season, Dong earned Foothill League MVP honors as a senior at Placer High School in Auburn, California. Harris is an athletic 5'10" product of Colorado Springs, Colorado, who was a First-Team All-State player as a prep senior at Pine Creek High School.

The Torero program will experience a change in leadership off the floor as well this season. Fifth-year top assistant Erik Johnson has assumed the role of Associate Head Coach. Johnson will now run the Torero practices and make the personnel substitutions during games.

The San Diego Surf and Slam Tournament, slated for December 28th and 30th, will once again highlight USD's non-conference home schedule. Over the past two seasons, the Jenny Craig Pavilion has played host to the holiday tournament that has brought in some of the nation's best college programs. A pair of NCAA Tournament qualifiers from last season, Penn State and Kent State, along with Nebraska are slated to play in the four team tourney in 2002.

USD opens their home schedule on Tuesday, November 26th when they play the University of Denver at 7:00 PM.

23rd Year Head Coach Kathy N.M.



Coach Marpe will begin her 30th year as a head coach, and her 23rd season leading the University of San Diego women's basketball program. In her career, Marpe has reached milestones aspiring coaches can only dream of - 352 career coaching victories, 106 West Coast Conference wins, two WCC Coach of the Year awards, two conference tournament championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances. At the helm of the USD women's program, Marpe has coached 11 First Team All-West Coast Conference players, and more importantly, 30 of Marpe's players have been honored as WCC Scholar Athletes.

The changes Marpe has witnessed in the game of women's basketball with the skills and athleticism of today's student-athletes, is nothing short of staggering. Success through change permeates Marpe's long and distinguished coaching career. Marpe's fourteen winning seasons and coach of the year honors in 1993 and 1998 attest to her ability to flourish in a changing athletic environment. Marpe's success comes as a result of embracing - not resisting change.

Marpe will once again embrace change in 2002-03, hoping to duplicate the Torero success of recent past. Her 1999-2000 team matched a school record of 17 overall wins featuring future professional players Susie Erpelding and Jessica Gray. The 1999-2000 Toreros ran through the WCC Tournament, beating the number one seeded

Pepperdine Waves 68-51. San Diego was awarded the automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament, becoming the second San Diego team Marpe would lead into the big dance.

On February 3, 2001 Marpe became just the fourth coach in WCC history to reach 100 conference victories. She enters the 2002-03 campaign with 106 WCC wins, ranking her third alltime in WCC career coaching victories. Marpe's 352 overall career wins puts her in an elite class of NCAA coaches who have won over 300 games in a career.

As the "dean" of West Coast Conference coaches, Marpe has twice been honored as the conference's coach of the year. She won her second award in 1998 after leading the 1997-98 Toreros to one of the largest single-season turnarounds in WCC history - an improvement of eight games.

In 1993 San Diego placed second in the conference standings and finished 16-12 overall. Earning her first WCC Coach of the Year honor, she would direct her team to the WCC Tournament title and their first trip to the NCAA Division I Tournament.

Marpe's distinguished coaching career began in Minnesota at Spring Lake High School in 1971. Along with the duties of coaching women's basketball, Marpe coached the volleyball and softball teams as well, totaling an impressive 53-1 record in the combined three sports.

The Minnesota native would find herself in New Mexico two years later, coaching the New Mexico Lobos. Under Marpe's guidance, the Lobos would accumulate a 51-30 record in her final three seasons. Playing in "The Pit," the UNM women drew over 1,000 a game with crowds reaching the 2,000-3,000 mark on occasion- attendance figures unheard of in the mid-70's. During her successful 7-year tenure at New Mexico, Marpe led the Lobos to consecutive finishes in the Associated Press Top 20 and made six AIAW Regional appearances.

Academic success and community involvement are values that Marpe encourages to studentathletes she coaches. Marpe feels that, "It is very important to remember who you are and where you come from, and also to give back to the people around you who are not so fortunate."

Recently Coach Marpe won a Gold Medal for basketball in the over-50 Senior Olympic Games, held in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. She has also been a member of the gold medal winning East Coaching staff at the U.S. Olympic Festival.

Erik Johnson

Erik Johnson is now in his fifth season on San Diego's staff, bringing proven experience as a recruiter, motivator and enthusiastic teacher of the game. With his promotion to Associate Head Coach, Erik now runs the Torero practices and will make the personnel substitutions in games. Johnson also heads up the recruiting efforts, coordinates the offense, and plays a major role in practice planning and scouting.

In Johnson's second season at USD, he helped the Toreros win the West Coast Conference Tournament title and earn a birth into the 2000 NCAA Tournament.

Before joining the Torero staff, Johnson spent four seasons at the University of Rhode Island - the last two as a first assistant under Head Coach Linda Ziemke. In addition to managing the bulk of the recruiting duties for the Rams, Johnson's primary coaching responsibilities at URI included developing post players, shooting, defense and scouting.



A native of San Jose, CA, Johnson was a four-year letter-winner at UC San Diego, leading the Tritons to three NCAA Division III Tournament appearances including a Sweet-16. He served as captain and was the team's leading scorer as a senior. He completed his career as the all-time career, and single-season three-point record holder.

Johnson holds a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from UC San Diego (1994) and completed his Master's Degree in Adult Education at the University of Rhode Island (1997). Johnson and wife Laura, who was a member of the USA National Volleyball team for five years, currently reside in Mira Mesa. The couple gave birth to their first child, Daly, in May of 2002.

Two-time WCC Coach of the Year Kathy Marpe leads a Torero coaching staff that has over 50 years of combined college coaching experience. Proven leader and motivator Erik Johnson has assumed the role of Associate Head Coach. Former All-American Shelley Sheetz brings energy and intensity to every Torero practice. 1st-year assistant Dana McGraw offers extensive coaching experience and a wealth of new ideas to the Torero program.





2nd Year Assistant Coach

Shelley C

Shelley Sheetz brings All-America honors and professional playing experience to the Torero staff as a second year assistant under Head Coach Kathy Marpe. Shelley coaches the USD guards and plays a major role in recruiting, scouting and practice planning.

Sheetz, who played college basketball at the University of Colorado from 1991-1995, was the first ever Kodak All-America in Colorado's school history. The Big Eight Freshman of the Year in 1992, Sheetz earned All Big Eight and Big Eight Tournament honors in her junior and senior seasons. As a senior, Sheetz guided the Buffalos to a school record 25 game winning streak and her team finished 14-0 in the Big Eight Conference.



After Sheetz guided Colorado to the Elite Eight for the second time in her career, the Conference selected her as the 1995 Female Athlete of the Year. Sheetz was named All-America by Kodak, Associated Press, and U.S. Basketball Writers Association, and was a finalist for the Naismith Award. The state of Colorado honored her as the Sports Women of the Year in 1993 and 1995. When her career at Colorado ended, Sheetz became the Colorado and Big Eight leader of three-point baskets made at 252, Colorado's second all-time points leader with 1,755, and second all-time leader in assists with 514.

At the end of her collegiate career, Sheetz played professionally for Wuppertal, Germany, the Colorado Xplosion, and the Portland Power in the American Basketball League. Originally from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Sheetz was elected into the Iowa High School Hall of Fame in 1996. Sheetz began her coaching career in the Northwest, as an assistant at Washington State University.

Dana McGraw

Dana McGraw brings extensive coaching experience and impressive credentials to USD as a first year assistant under Head Coach Kathy Marpe. McGraw has five years of coaching experience, holds an MBA from Baylor University and was a 1997 Summa Cum Laude graduate from Loyola University in New Orleans. Dana will work with the USD post players, as well as, assisting with recruiting and scouting efforts.

McGraw was hired in June of 2002 after serving as an assistant coach at San Diego State for the past two seasons. At San Diego State, she coached the post players, served as the academic liaison and assisted with recruiting. Prior to joining the Aztecs' coaching staff, McGraw held similar coaching positions at Chicago State, where she served as the recruiting coordinator during the 1999-

2000 season, and at Texas A&M-Commerce in 1998-1999. While earning her MBA at Baylor, McGraw served as a graduate assistant for the women's basketball program.

A native of Atlanta, McGraw earned the Cardinal Key Award given to the Most Outstanding Female Graduate at Loyola University. She was also given the Percy A. Roy, S.J. Memorial Award after earning the highest G.P.A. of a graduating senior. While attaining a B.A. in Philosophy, McGraw received the Senior Scholar-Athlete Award and was a member of the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Honor Roll. McGraw was a member of the first intercollegiate women's basketball team ever fielded by Loyola University.



Went 6-for-8 from three-point range vs. UCLA (12-05-01)... Tied a career-high with 10 assists at UC Irvine (12-21-01)... Led the team in assists nine different times... Set a career-high with six steals vs. Gonzaga (1-12-02)... Ranked in the league's top ten in both steals (1.86, 4th) and assists (3.14, T-9th) per game during conference play.

2000-01: Was named an All-West Coast Conference Honorable mention selection after a stellar sophomore season... Started in all 26 USD games and named team MVP... Averaged 10.5 points a game in 2000-01, second best on the team... Shot 42% from the three-point line... Drained 48 three point baskets, a Torero team-high in 2000-01... Dished out 10 assists against Gonzaga (1-25-01) which ranks second all-time for a Torero in a single game... Six times Nakamoto led the team in scoring as a sophomore... Was fourth on the team in rebounds, totaling 87 in 2000-01... Led the team in steals with 49 total picks and led the team in assists with 80.

1999-00: Earned San Diego's Coaches Award for her freshman performance... San Diego's third best scorer (8.6 points per game) while starting in all 30 games as a freshman... Shot a remarkable .363 from beyond the arc... Netted 49 three-pointers, the second most by a Torero in 1999-00... Scored a careerhigh 21 points at UC Irvine (1-2-00)... Against CS Northridge (12-11-99), she recorded 14 points, 9 assists and 5 steals.

Prep: Led Archbishop Mitty to a 31-0 record and a state title as a senior while averaging 16 points per game... Earned First Team All-CCS, and third consecutive First Team All-Blossom League honors as a senior... Mitty won three consecutive league and section championships... Was named team Co-MVP as a senior after earning Best Offensive award following her sophomore and junior seasons... Monarchs compiled a 83-8 mark in her three seasons as a starter... Team won Nor-Cal championship as a freshman... Played club ball for the San Jose Jammers on a team that compiled a 22-2 record.





When the West Coast Conference got its start back in 1952, the founders really had only one goal in mind - to create a convenient way for five Bay Area schools to play basketball. What has grown from that original vision 46 years ago is a marvelous cohesive athletics league which is competitive at the national level in 13 sports.

The eight current members of the WCC span the Western United States from Canada to Mexico. Though the institutions range from the pine forests of the Northwest to the sundrenched beaches of Southern California, the combined excellence in athletics and academics sets the conference apart on the national scene and draws the individual institutions together in a common mission.

The WCC sponsors championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross-country, men's and women's golf, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball. The league was chartered by five Bay Area institutions (Pacific, Saint Mary's, San Francisco, San Jose State and Santa Clara) as the California Basketball Association, playing its first game on January 2, 1953. After two seasons of play under that name, the conference expanded to include Loyola Marymount and Pepperdine in 1955, and became the "West Coast Athletic Conference" in 1956. The name was shortened to "West Coast Conference" in 1989. The current alignment of Gonzaga, Loyola Marymount, Pepperdine, Portland, Saint Mary's, San Diego, San Francisco and Santa Clara has remained unchanged since 1979, making the WCC the third most stable conference in the nation. Only the Ivy League and Pacific-10 have been together longer.

The 2002-2003 season marks the 16th year for the WCC's women's basketball league, one of the most improved in the nation. The West Coast Conference started the Millenium off with a bang, doing one better than in 1999-2000. For the third consecutive season and just the fifth time in league history four teams advanced to the post-season. Post-season participants included San Francisco, Pepperdine, Saint Mary's and Santa Clara. St. Mary's received a bid to the NCAA Tournament and played into the second round in 2000-01, losing to the #1 seeded Tennessee Volunteers. Four teams, Pepperdine, Saint Mary's, Santa Clara and Loyola Marymount won at least 20 games two seasons ago. In addition to Pepperdine and Santa Clara's bid into the NCAA's, Santa Clara and San Francisco received bids to the WNIT last season.

WCC women's basketball began with seven teams, including Loyola Marymount, Pepperdine, San Diego, San Francisco and Santa Clara. In 1987, Nevada and U.S. International left the WCC, replaced by Gonzaga, Portland and Saint Mary's.


The WCC Tournament Returns to San Diego

USD's Jenny Craig Pavilion Site of 2003 Tournament

For the third consecutive year San Diego's Jenny Craig Pavilion will house the West Coast Conference Basketball Tournament. Play begins on Thursday, March 6th when first round action begins for the women. The men will start play on Friday, March 7th.

Effective with the 2003 WCC Basketball Tournament, the WCC has adopted an 8-Team/ Play-In format for both the men and the women. The women will play March 6-9, 2003 and the men will square-off March 7-10, 2003.

Under the new format, the #5 through #8 seeds will compete in the opening round to determine who will advance to the next round of the tournament. Waiting for the winners in the quarterfinals will be the #3 and #4 seeds, who will have first round byes. The winners of the quarterfinal match-ups will go head-to-head with the #1 and #2 seeds, who will have byes through the first two rounds of the tournament.



The University of San Diego Athletic Department has made a commitment to increase the athletic ability of the entire student athlete population. Therefore, each student athlete will be given a sport specific training program based on the metabolic demands of their position and sport.

This is accomplished by training for the proper combination of power, strength, size, speed, agility, flexibility, endurance, and footwork. It is the responsibility of the strength and conditioning staff to design and implement workouts, teach and demonstrate proper lifting technique, and to monitor and evaluate each individual athlete's progress, while maintaining a positive environment to train in.

Student athletes at the University of San Diego train in the newly rebuilt USD Sports Center weight room. The 5,000 sq ft facility contains 12 power racks, 8 Olympic lifting platforms, various selectorized and plate loaded machinery, and over 7500 lbs of free weight. This facility is also equipped with an additional 1800 square feet of artificial turf that is used for team agility, plyometric, and flexibility training.

The goal of the strength and conditioning department is to educate and motivate each student athlete to maximize their genetic potential and create an environment where athletes can develop into champions both mentally and physically.

USD Academic Support

The USD Athletic Academic Support program is designed to promote the academic development of student-athletes. The primary objective is to offer the necessary resources for the academic success of student-athletes as they work to earn their degree. Academic Support services are designed to enhance the student-athlete's overall collegiate experience and encourage development and attainment of academic and career goals.

The University of San Diego's Academic Support efforts are led by Shaney Fink who begins her third year as USD's Academic Support Coordinator. Fink was a standout volleyball player in the 90's, and in 1999 she was on the Volleyball coaching staff as an assistant, helping the Toreros to a 23-6 record and a second round finish in the NCAA Tournament. Prior to USD she gained coaching experience at the high school, college and international levels for five years. She capped off a stellar collegiate career (1990-93) at Cal Berkeley and won selection to the All-PAC Ten Decade Team. Fink completed her B.A., graduating in Social Science from Berkeley in 1994.

All USD student athletes have access to advising, tutoring and mentoring services. The mentoring program, Access, was developed in 1999 and teams a graduate student in the Counseling program with an athlete who would like to enhance study skills, learn about campus resources and receive guidance on goal development and attainment. Student-athletes also have access to a quiet area where they can study or work in the computer center. In addition, student-athletes are encouraged to utilize the campus learning centers including the Writing, Math and Logic Centers as well as to take advantage of the resources available to them in the Career Center, Counseling Center and Computer Labs.

USD is a member of the NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS program. This program was created to enhance the total development of student athletes on NCAA Division 1 campuses.

The NCAA Champs/Life Skills Mission is: To maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the campus educational program and the athlete as an integral part of the student body. With this in mind, the CHAMPS Life Skills program was created to support the student development initiatives of its member institutions and to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting.

Director of Athletics

Tom lannacone

Tom lannacone is in his fifteenth year as Director of Athletics at the University of San Diego. He was named Director of Athletics on September 1, 1988 after holding the same position the previous four years at St. Francis College of Pennsylvania.

At USD, Iannacone directs an Athletic Department that includes sixteen NCAA Division I intercollegiate varsity teams, eight men's and eight women's, plus intramurals and recreation.

In the last fourteen years behind his direction and leadership, Torero Athletics has enjoyed successes both on and off the playing field. His accomplishments at USD include improvements in the major areas of personnel, scholarship assistance, facilities, promotions and marketing, fund raising, drug education, academic support, and a university approved plan for scholarship support and sports sponsorship. In addition, he was instrumental in USD gaining membership to the Pioneer Football League, which began play in 1993. He has served on the I-AA Athletic Directors Association Executive Committee; and is past Chairman of the West Coast Conference Athletics Directors Committee.

During lannacone's tenure, all athletic facilities have seen vast improvements. The Jenny Craig Pavilion, USD's 5,100-seat multi-purpose facility, opened its doors in 2000 and is now home for USD basketball and volleyball, along with benefiting the entire university community. Torero Stadium, where football, and men's and women's soccer compete, is also home to the WUSA San Diego Spirit, has also benefited with expanded seating to 6,000, new lighting and sound system, new video scoreboard, additional press box facilities, and a recently widened playing field with new grass turf. Improvements at the Sports Center include com-

plete renovations of both the north and south wings that added offices for administrators and coaches; additional women's locker rooms; an athletic department conference room; and an academic support room. The gymnasium received new lighting and scoreboards, a new dance floor and workout area for rowing machines. Recent improvements at the Sports Center include a new main entrance, a complete renovation of the weight room, and perimeter fencing around the pool along with a scoreboard. This past year both Cunningham Baseball Stadium and the Softball Complex were under demolition and reconstruction, and benefited with new fields. Baseball received new batting cages, while softball benefited with a new scoreboard and expanded seating. Additionally, the Canyon Field received lighting and a complete renovation for intercollegiate practices and intramural use with a new artificical turf surface.


On the playing fields, USD has sent thirty-three teams to NCAA Tournaments since lannacone's arrival in the Fall of 1988. Additionally, the school has

captured fifteen conference championships; thirty-three All-Americans; twenty-nine Academic All-Americans; twenty-nine Conference Coaches of the Year; twenty-three Conference Players of the Year; and four West Coast Conference Scholar-Athletes of the Year. Besides having the 1999 NCAA National Champion in women's tennis (Zuzana Lesenarova), the Torero athletic program came out on top of the WCC schools in terms of overall strength in 1999 (based on an unofficial scoring system produced by USD each season). For the first time, the 1998-99 combined men's and women's athletics programs at USD ranked first in the standings. Since 1988 the university has been the host site for NCAA Tournament events for women's volleyball, men's and women's cocer, and women's tennis. This past two years USD has hosted the WCC Basketball Championships, and will do so again in 2003.

Prior to USD, lannacone built an impressive list of credentials at St. Francis College as Director of Athletics between 1984-87. His major contributions included the expansion of sports offerings and scholarships for both men and women, improved budgets, renovation of athletic facilities, the hiring of additional staff, and the establishment of a master plan for the future and continual development of athletics. He served on several committees, most notably the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) Infractions committee and the Northeast Conference committee on conference development.

He served as assistant Director of Athletics at Fordham University between 1977-84. Along with his administrative duties, he was assistant football coach for the Rams. Between 1975-78, he acted as offensive coordinator and backfield coach as Fordham captured 19 victories in their final 24 games during this span. The '77 squad was and remains the highest scoring team in Fordham history, averaging 34 points per game. In 1983 he was presented the prestigious Jack Coffey Award by the Alumni Association for his outstanding contributions to Fordham athletics. He also served on various Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference committees.

Prior to Fordham, lannacone taught physical education and coached track and field, and football in Connecticut Public School Districts from 1964-76. He made his collegiate football coaching debut as an offensive backfield coach at Western Connecticut State University in 1974. A 1964 graduate of the University of Connecticut, lannacone received his master of science degree in physical education from Southern Connecticut State University in 1973.



Tom and his wife, Cynthia, have three children: Tom Jr., Jennifer and Eric. All three are graduates of the University of San Diego.



Dan Yourg Associate Director of Athletics

Dan Yourg, Associate Director of Athletics, has been a member of the USD Athletics Department since the fall of 1985. Yourg oversees football, baseball, men's basketball, golf, men's soccer, and men's and women's tennis. In addi-

tion, he is the department liaison to USD's Financial Aid Office. Yourg received his Bachelor's (Sociology, 1980) and Master's (Social Work, 1986) degrees from the University of Wisconsin, where he was a nose guard on the Badgers' football team.

Dan and his wife Virginia, a USD alumnus, are the parents of three sons, John , Tom and Mike.



Jo-Ann Nester Associate Director of Athletics/ Senior Woman Administrator

Jo-Ann enters her first year on the USD staff as the Associate Director of Athletics and SWA.

Nester comes to USD from Dartmouth College where she held the

position of Associate Director of Athletics the past nine years. Her duties included oversight of compliance, student services, promotions and marketing, and eleven sports.

Prior to Dartmouth she was Director of Athletics and Recreation at Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, Indiana between 1984-93. In addition, she has a coaching background at the high school and college levels, and has served on several committees within the NCAA, ECAC and Ivy League.

Her educational background includes a B.S. degree in Health and Physical Education from West Chester State College, a M.S. degree from West Chester, an Ed.D Doctor of Education from Temple University, and a degree from the Executive Program/Sports Management Institute at the University of Notre Dame.



Carolyn Greer Head Athletic Trainer

Carolyn Greer enters her twentyfifth year as the Head Certified Athletic Trainer for the University of San Diego athletic department. She is assisted by Suzi Higgins and Paul Signorelli.

A 1975 graduate of San Diego State University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Physical Education, Carolyn went on to earn her Master's in Sports Medicine in 1978.

Over the years she has taught classes in Sports Medicine and had numerous articles published in a variety of journals. 

Discover the University of San Diego



THE SETTING

The University of San Diego is an independent Catholic institution of higher education. Founded in 1949, USD is located on 180 acres overlooking Mission Bay, San Diego Harbor and the Pacific Ocean. The campus is named Alcalá Park and is located just 10 minutes from downtown San Diego and the world famous San Diego Zoo. Historic Old Town is just minutes away as well.

The city of San Diego along with this campus traces their origins to fifteenth century Spain. The campus was named after a Spanish village near Madrid - Alcala de Henares. Founded by the Greeks as Complutum, the village was later renamed Al Kala (the Castle) by the Moslems. Christians recaptured the village centuries later and founded a university, the University of Alcala, whose buildings became the inspiration for USD's style. Both institutions are located on a hill overlooking a river valley.

THE CAMPUS

USD

The USD campus is regarded as one of the most architecturally unique institutions in the country, featuring 18 major buildings designed in an ornamental 16th century Spanish Renaissance style.

Since 1984, USD has completed 11 major construction and expansion projects. A five-story, Spanish Renaissance parking garage (1,100 spaces) was completed in 1998. A landscaped fountain plaza was finished in the fall of 1995, connecting the entrances of the Immaculata and Hughes Administration Center. In 1992, the university completed the 45,000 square foot Loma Hall, which includes an expanded bookstore, a larger mail center, classrooms and laboratories. In 1990, the renovated Katherine M. and George M. Pardee Jr. Legal Research Center opened, a facility that offers the latest in information technology.



ACADEMICS

USD enrolls more than 7,000 students who have a choice of more than 50 undergraduate and graduate degree programs. The university's academic units include the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Schools of Business Administration, Education, Law and Nursing. Class size generally averages between 18-25 students with the student to teacher ratio being 18:1. Over 97 percent of USD's full-time faculty hold doctorates. In the annual ratings of the country's colleges and universities, published by U.S. News &

World Report, USD moved from the regional to national category in 1994. The university is ranked among the top 100 schools in the nation.

STUDENT LIFE

Student activities include cultural events, dances, boat cruises, beach parties, BBQ's, concerts, comedy nights, symposia and much more. Students participate in a wide range of volunteer projects such as adult literacy tutoring, senior citizen outreach, and house building in Tijuana. The intramural program is also an integral part of student life on campus with over two-thirds of the USD community partaking in intramural sports.




ATHLETICS

The University of San Diego is a member of the West Coast Conference for nearly all sports and competes in 16 intercollegiate sports on the NCAA Division I level. Women's sports include: basketball, crew, cross country, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Men's sports include: baseball, basketball, crew, cross country, golf, football, soccer and tennis. Since 1990 USD teams have won ten conference championships; made 30 NCAA post-season appearances; had 26 Conference Coaches of the Year; 21 Conference Players of the Year, 12 Conference Freshmen of the Year, four WCC Scholar Athletes of the Year and 30 All-America selections.
