DEPARTMENTAL NOTES

<u>Chemistry</u>: We are happy to announce that Mr. Alan Fay, a chemistry major in his junior year, has been awarded an Undergraduate Research Participation Grant at San Diego State College through the National Science Foundation. This award carries a stipend of \$600 for a ten week program this summer during which time Mr. Fay will be engaged in a chemistry research project under the supervision of a staff member at San Diego State College. This is one of 16 awards that have been made available at SDS to qualified undergraduate majors in chemistry. It is the purpose of this program to give the student a relatively individualized experience in scientific investigation that will aid in his scholarly development and help prepare him for graduate study and research.

Dr. D. B. Peterson of the Department of Chemistry has received a summer appointment as a Research Scientist at the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory of the University of California at Berkeley. Dr. Peterson will be working in a research group headed by Professor Warren Garrison of Berkeley. The group is primarily interested in the radiation chemistry of aqueous systems - particularly those with biological significance.

The following night he was the featured speaker at the Wrestling and Basketball Appreciation Banquet at Notre Dame High School in Riverside.
