OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT - Very Rev. John Paul Cadden

Father Cadden spoke at a luncheon meeting of the Executive Committee of the California College and University Faculty Association at San Diego State College today. The topic of his talk was "The University of San Diego; Its Plans, Programs, and Relationship to San Diego State College." A question and answer period was a feature of the program. One of the professors present at the meeting said it would be very desirable for professors in one discipline to meet their colleagues from the University of San Diego and exchange ideas.

The Speakers Bureau of the College for Men and College for Women, accompanied by Fr. Eagen, is currently visiting Newman Centers and Parish High Schools of Religion throughout the diocese to acquaint students with the University of San Diego.

Father Eagen and Mr. Robin Schmidt of Phillips-Ramsey Public Relations Firm attended the convention of the American College Public Relations Association held at the Hotel Del Coronado last week. A highlight of the convention was an address by Mr. Thomas Jordan of University of San Francisco entitled, "How Private Are Private Funds". Mr. Jordan suggested that the state colleges and universities supported by taxation should think of charging tuition before seeking private funds for supplemental support.

Dean Parker and Father Eagen met with admissions officers and directors of recruitment from all the Catholic colleges in Southern California on February 3 in Santa Ana. This was the first meeting of its kind. This group plans to host the same personnel from all 13 Catholic colleges and universities in California some time in May. The purpose of the meeting will be to coordinate and improve recruiting procedures, as well as to study admission standards among the various schools.

DEPARTMENT OF SPEECH & DRAMATIC ARTS - Rev. John H. Cloonan

The annual passion play, Dowsett's "The Betrayal", is already in active rehearsal in Room 208. The two prime leads are played by Hubert Fontaine as Caiaphas and Philip Bolles as Pontius Pilate. Second lead parts are acted by James Molkenburr as Nicodemus, Kathleen Zaworski as Claudia, and Victor Peri as Gratus. Dates for production in More Hall are: Friday, April 2, Saturday, April 3, and Sunday, April 4. Mr. Donald Ernst, Chairman of the English Department, is assisting Father Cloonan in this year's work of directing the passion drama.

SOCIETY FOR ADVANCEMENT OF MANAGEMENT

In a joint luncheon in the U.S. Grant Hotel of the San Diego Chamber of Commerce and the Society for Advancement of Management on January 22, Dr. Henry Singer, international director of the latter organization, spoke on "Changing Requirements for Managers in the 1970's". An editorial on his speech appeared in the San Diego Union on January 23.

Among the subjects discussed were the effects of automation, which are both good and bad; the enormous need for expansion of capital outlays; the increase in leisure time; the necessity for catering to the needs of young families which are growing rapidly; the importance of senior citizens especially due to retirement pension plans and private investing and the tie-in between science and management.

One of the big impacts on education Singer predicted would be that it will be a continuing process among schools, homes and communities with an increase in the number of year around schools and perhaps less formal education.

With a prediction of 250 million people in the United States by 1980 and a prediction of longer life for most all, some of the problems sounded rather awesome. All the universities in the area had representatives. Mr. and Mrs. Harold Dermody represented USD.

The school chapter added 16 new members this semester. Their first meeting will be in Room 207 on Thursday, February 11. Mr. Paul Alvard, a management consultant to the San Diego Employer's Association, will be the speaker. Refreshments will be served. Faculty is welcome.
