OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT:

University Chaplain

I am happy to announce the appointment of Reverend John Myhan, O. P., as Chaplain of the University of San Diego for the year 1973-74. In addition to the usual duties of the University Chaplain, Father Myhan will be chairing a committee during the coming year with the purpose of making a thorough study of campus ministry at U.S.D. and proposing recommendations for the integration of the ministry with other aspects of University of San Diego's programs.

OFFICE OF DIRECTOR OF SECURITY:

In the past few weeks, three members of the USD community learned, much to their chagrin, that the lower drawer of their desk is not a secure place to store a purse or other items of value. In the first instance, one of our secretaries, who shall remain unnamed, left her purse unattended on two successive days while she performed an errand, leaving her office unlocked. By the end of the second day, she had been deprived of \$29.00.

More recently, an administrative staff member left her office momentarily to discover upon her return that her wallet containing \$4.00 in cash plus six credit cards had been removed from her purse.
