It gives me pleasure to announce that the College has received reaccreditation for the maximum time (five years) for the Standard Teaching Credential with Specialization in Elementary and Secondary Teaching. An initial accreditation for three years has been granted to the credential programs in Librarianship and in the area of Mental Retardation. Congratulations to all the members in the Education Department and to those faculty members who collaborate in this fine work.

OFFICE OF THE ACADEMIC DEAN

1. Just a brief word to remind faculty members that ideas for Intersession courses should be proposed by July 15, 1969. To refresh your memory, I quote the following from Dr. Martin's and my memorandum of May 1, 1969:

It is not at all the purpose of the Intersession to kaleidoscope or sandwich the usual semester course into a breathless 3 1/2 weeks. Rather, this is a unique opportunity for educational experimentation, for the creation of short courses; community projects; scientific research opportunities; field trip projects in art, science, etc.; intensive language studies; independent study programs--the type of thing that the regular semester does not lend itself to adequately. Perhaps we could serve in some special way the business, industrial, and educational communities of San Diego. The possibilities are endless. Again, we urge a spirit of innovation and creativity. Since all offerings are on a "student demand" basis, the more exciting the course sounds to the students, the more likely it is to be a viable offering.

2. In order to make it possible to have a holiday on July 4, classes will meet on Wednesday, July 2. There will be no classes on Friday, July 4.

MEETINGS

Sister Murphy was part of a group of fifteen professional women historians who held an inaugural meeting of the West Coast Historical Conference at Asilomar, Pacific Grove, California, from June 6-8. The group, into which women historians are eligible for membership, plans to have annual meetings.

Dr. Karena Shields was one of 26 speakers from 11 countries who were invited to speak at the Fourth Pan-American Congress of Historical Medicine, May 26-31, in Guatemala City. The Congress was conducted in four languages; Dr. Shields gave her paper, "Medicina en leyendas, tradiciones y actualidad entre los Choles y Tz'itales," in Spanish.
