Dean's Letter

Dear Friends,

It is again with real pleasure that I write to you about the accomplishments and plans of USD School of Law. This is a year in which your law school has achieved unprecedented distinction. What makes it so satisfying for me is to be able to tell you that much of this success could not have happened without the involvement, support and loyalty of USD's alums and other friends. So it is with utmost gratitude, that I am honored to provide you with my eighth annual Dean's Report.

- In Spring 1996, USD was admitted to membership in the national legal honor society of **The Order of the Coif** – the most distinguished rank of American law schools. Membership signifies national recognition of USD's excellence of program, faculty and students; immensely enhances the prestige of the school; and translates, in practical terms, into a variety of advantages – for example, enhanced opportunities for clerkships and employment of our graduates.

- In August 1996, we welcomed an **entering class** of great strength and diversity. While the student credentials of many other peer schools have suffered from a declining national applicant pool, USD enrolled an outstanding class with a 160 average LSAT (84th percentile nationally), approximately 10% with prior graduate study, 37% women and 23% minority.

- September 1996 saw over 600 alums and guests return for a variety of events connected with **Law Alumni Weekend**. Members of the classes of 1961, 1966, 1971, 1976, 1981, 1986 and 1991 were able to witness, firsthand, some of the major improvements in the school since their graduation. Our new computer lab in the Pardee Legal Research Center was the site of the continuing education programs: "Introduction to Legal Research on the Internet: A Hands-On Lab" and "Where Cyberspace and the Workplace Meet: A Survey of Electronic Privacy Issues." And USD was honored to recognize Judge Federico A. Castro, class

of 1971, as our Distinguished Alumnus of the Year. Please read on for this story and photos.

- Anyone who was comatose or in trial in October 1996 may not have heard that USD hosted the final **presidential debate**. *The San Diego Union Tribune* headline read: "**Who won debate? USD!**" The national and local media attention given to USD was exciting. USD prepared and executed the event flawlessly and everyone had a great time (with the possible exception of the correspondent for *George* magazine, Norman Mailer, who slept soundly through most of the debate).



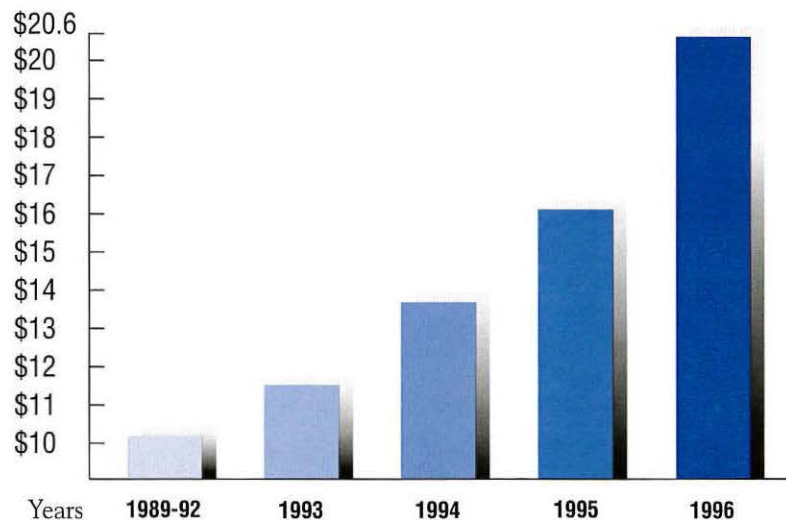

The Honorable Federico A. Castro '71 Receives 1996 Distinguished Alumni Award

People often credit their families when accepting awards, but in the case of the Honorable Federico “Fred” A. Castro ’71, recipient of the 1996 Distinguished Alumni Award, the lifelong, powerful influence of family is truly apparent. With his strong family ties and meaningful relationships within the community, it is natural that Judge Castro chose a career in family law.

In his introduction at the Distinguished Alumni Award luncheon on September 21, John S. Adler ’74 remarked, “Fred Castro, even as a youth, had a well-developed sense of guiding principles and core values that were formed by his family, which included three brothers and one sister.” His values were also shaped by individuals outside the family, including an inspirational first

grade teacher who kept every student in her class for two years to give them time to learn to speak English, as well as Castro’s “demanding yet appreciative first employer.”

Family support and discipline helped the Castro siblings face the hardships and discrimination they would encounter over the years. Castro was born in California in the town of Tehachapi, the son

of a man who had fought in the Mexican Revolution. Older brother Ramon Castro recalled "being demeaned and segregated in restaurants and having to ride in the back of the bus." It was clear from Ramon Castro's speech at the luncheon that the Castro sons were taught to stand up for themselves, to fight for a just cause and to always fight fairly.

Looking back on how the Castro brothers relied on one another in those early days, Ramon Castro (now a San Diego attorney, former USD faculty member and a member of the Board of Trustees from 1972 to 1977) made light of the fact that he and his older brother, Jess, had to teach their younger brother to take care of himself. "Fred was quiet and sensitive and concerned about everyone else ... He was a little too gentle, so we taught him how to fight." Ramon laughed when he said, "Fred could really hit."

Castro and his brother, Ramon, went on to attend the University of California at Berkeley together, full-time students working hard to support themselves and one another. When he received his bachelor's degree in business in 1954, Castro chose to go into business. Again, he faced discrimination. According to Ramon Castro, "Fred went to 19 or 20 interviews in San Francisco. We thought discrimination would be minimal in a cosmopolitan area, but several companies wouldn't hire him because he was Mexican."

Castro was eventually hired by a retailer and built a successful career as a business administrator. At age 39 he decided to go to law school. So Castro headed to San Diego with his former wife and their baby daughter, Corrine, to attend the University of San Diego School of Law. Brother Ramon was there

to help, just as Castro had helped to finance Ramon's law school education some years earlier.

Following graduation in 1971, Castro worked for two years at the San Diego City Attorney's office and then entered private practice in 1974, specializing in family law. He was appointed to the bench by Governor George Deukmejian in September 1987. Castro has spent most of his career overseeing domestic, juvenile and family law matters, and he recently served on a state task force on juvenile justice. In addition, Castro is an active USD alumnus and served on the law school's Alumni Association board of directors for two terms.

At the luncheon Adler praised Castro for presiding "with a voice of wisdom, compassion and fairness, working for justice within the community and throughout the state." Sister Sally Furay '72 observed that whether he is presiding over juvenile court or participating in community activities, Castro is involved and caring. "He is always deeply concerned about the individual kids. It wasn't just a theoretical issue to him. It was a human and personal issue. I deeply admired that and I still do," she said.

After receiving the Distinguished Alumni Award, Castro thanked his family, as well as his colleagues, including three who were unable to attend the luncheon: Susanne Stanford '75, the Honorable Napoleon Jones Jr. '71, chairman of Law Alumni Weekend, and the Honorable Robert Baxley '64. From the emotion-filled comments of Castro's brother to the proud looks on the faces of his wife, Rosa, and the many family members in attendance, it was obvious that the bond among the Castro family members has been a genuine source of strength and inspiration.

In his acceptance speech, Castro spoke of his concern about discrimination in the United States, and in his beloved California. "I see specific groups fanning the flames of intolerance and bigotry," he said, urging those in the legal profession to "be in the forefront in protecting legal rights. We cannot sit on the sidelines and see our rights of due process and equal protection under the law whittled away. We must be prepared to constantly defend the rights guaranteed by the Declaration of Independence."

Commenting on the unique trust bestowed upon lawyers and judges, Castro said, "Under no circumstances can we compromise that trust in our profession." Then he went on to say that in spite of the seriousness of the day-to-day concerns facing those in the legal profession, they should remember to enjoy life and "to laugh with each other, not at each other ... Never confuse having a career with having a life," he said. "I have learned in life that the things that matter are your relationships with God, with family and with one another."

As Adler eloquently stated in his opening remarks, "Some are measured by the length of difficulty in the road they travel and still others are measured by the dignity and honor they bring to themselves and to those around them. Under each of these methods, our honoree this year stands as the foremost example of everything that is decent, honorable and admirable about the profession of law."

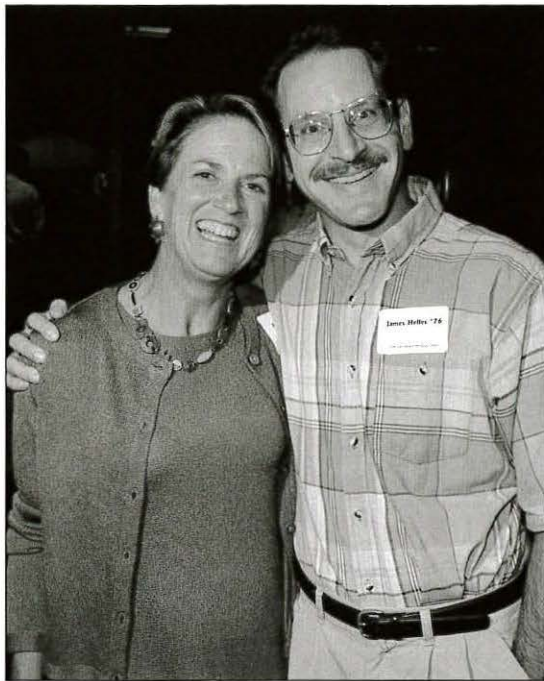

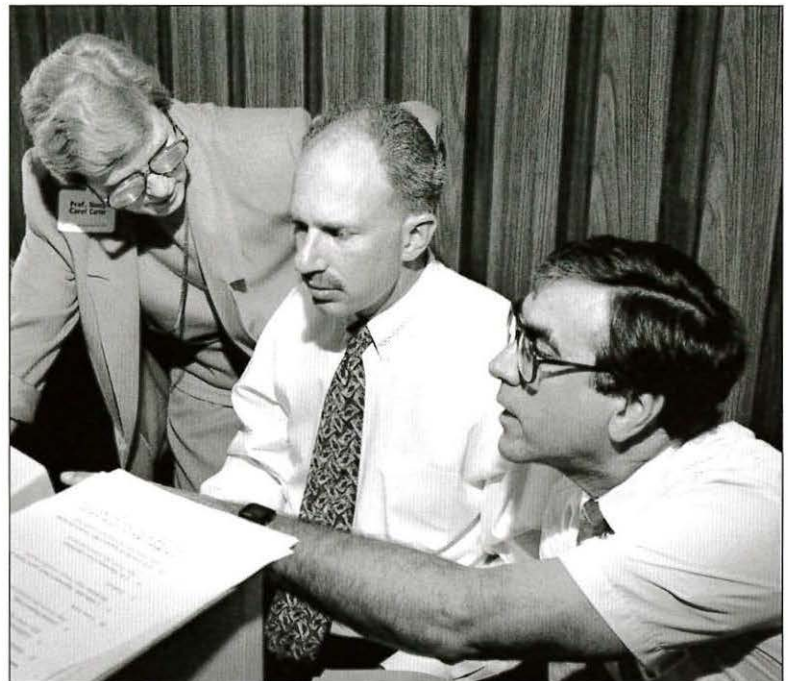

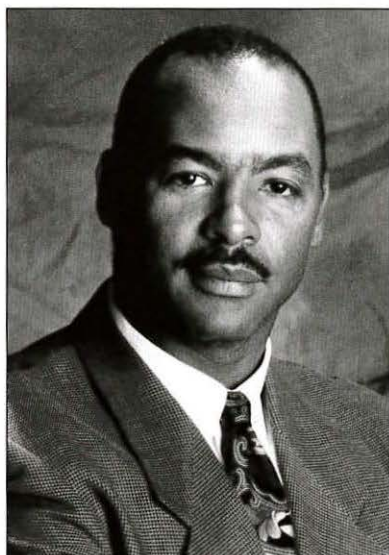

Alumni Profiles



Kellen B. Winslow '93

Fans of the San Diego Chargers recognize **Kellen B. Winslow '93** for his accomplishments as a tight end on the football field. Today, Winslow participates on another team as the director of business development for Enova Energy, parent company of San Diego Gas & Electric. Winslow joined Enova Energy in September 1996, where he is responsible for identifying new business development opportunities and executing sales strategies. Enova Energy is a national energy company offering customized energy solutions and innovative services including natural gas and electric commodity procurement, power scheduling and dispatching, resource planning, market assessments and energy audits.

Winslow, a member of the National Football League Hall of Fame, paralleled his athletic accomplishments with a successful career in the media. He co-hosted weekly sports TV and radio programs in San Diego. He has appeared on NBC's "Today" show, ABC's "Nightline," ESPN and most major local and national radio and TV sports talk shows. During the college football season, Winslow can be seen roving the sidelines for ESPN's prime time college football broadcasts.

Winslow attended USD after receiving a B.S. degree in counseling psychology from the University of Missouri, Columbia. "I decided to enroll in USD School of Law's evening program because of the school's reputation and quality of education," he said. "I liked the fact that there was a diversity of students in the evening program including others like myself who were returning to school after years of professional work experience." He recalls that the professors at USD taught him "how the legal world really works. I saw the world differently after graduation – politically, socially and economically."



Donna L. Silverberg '90

As public policy coordinator of the Oregon Dispute Resolution Commission, **Donna L. Silverberg '90** provides dispute resolution expertise, policy analysis, consultative services, system design and training to state agencies and local governments in the state of Oregon. Currently, she is on assignment to the Governor's Office where she is the special assistant on dispute resolution for natural resource issues, including timber, fishing, watershed management and urban growth disputes. In addition to providing services to the Governor's Office, Silverberg offers her expertise to Oregon's 15 natural resource agencies and local governments statewide.

Silverberg began her career as the assistant director of the Center for Municipal Dispute Resolution in the San Diego City Attorney's Office. Using the extensive training and knowledge she gained at USD, Silverberg has mediated hundreds of disputes involving land-use and public policy matters. Silverberg attended USD after receiving her B.A. degree in sociology from Lewis and Clark College.

"What I enjoyed most about the USD School of Law was my opportunity to learn about and from other cultures as well as my internship at two local mediation centers," Silverberg said. "My internship work was invaluable. I was able to work with diverse communities, families, businesses, courts and policy makers in cases rife with contention," Silverberg continued. "The thoughtful conversations about that work with professors at USD helped establish a framework for what has now become my life's work." She remembers a number of professors including, "Professor Allen Snyder who was an inspiring teacher of mediation practice; Professor Susan Quinn who is a fabulous teacher, mediator and friend; Professor Michael Kelly who told me I had a great aptitude for working with and creating legislation; and Professor Charles Wiggins who continues to support my efforts in the dispute resolution field."



Melissa B. Cates '85

As senior counsel of law and business affairs at MTV Networks, **Melissa B. Cates '85** has successfully combined two of her top interests – the law and the entertainment industry. After earning her B.A. in political science at the Claremont Colleges, Cates worked as a production assistant on several television series for two years. Then she came to USD where she was a published member of the *San Diego Law Review*

and received an American Jurisprudence Award.

Cates gained general corporate experience at New York's Parker, Chapin, Flattau & Klimpl before combining her legal talents with her entertainment background at a boutique law firm. In 1991 Cates joined Viacom Productions, a subsidiary of Viacom Inc., in Los Angeles as director of business affairs. There she negotiated and drafted development and production agreements for network and cable television pilots, series and movies. In 1993 Cates returned to her hometown of New York for her current position at MTV Networks, another subsidiary of Viacom Inc. She structures the development deals with the creators, writers, on-air talent, v.j.'s, animators, producers and directors for MTV Music Television pilots and series as well as developing feature films for the new MTV Productions division. Cates is also a member of New York Women in Film and Television and the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences.

Cates has fond memories of her days at USD, including "my professors, fellow students, classes and the graduate apartments – especially walking up and down those stairs for three years!" Cates especially remembers, "Professor Frank Engfelt since I deal with contracts on a daily basis, and Professors Grant Morris and Maimon Schwarzschild for helping me develop an analytical mind." Cates still keeps in touch with friends she made in law school (several of whom flew to the east coast for her wedding) and recalls, "I returned for my 10-year reunion, and it was a lot of fun to see everyone after all these years."



James F. Brashear '82

James F. Brashear '82 is combining his legal training with his interest in aviation and the travel industry, as associate general counsel for The SABRE Group in Fort Worth, Texas. The SABRE Group is a technology affiliate of AMR Corporation, the parent company of American Airlines. A world leader in electronic commerce, it processes an average of 93 million daily travel information requests from over 70 countries.

Brashear heads the corporate and securities group in The SABRE Group legal department. His responsibilities include domestic and international corporate, securities and transactional matters.

Brashear received a B.A. degree in political science from the University of California, San Diego. After law school at USD, he practiced in Los Angeles and earned a commercial pilot's license, then moved to Fort Worth to work at American Airlines. As a senior attorney, his practice focused on aircraft transactions, international and aviation law. Brashear joined The SABRE Group following its initial public offering this fall. "Deciding to leave Southern California was tough," Brashear said, "but it was the right choice. At AMR, I get to work in the world's largest industry – travel – and play a role in making travel easier for people all over the world."

While attending USD, Brashear learned principles of research analysis, drafting and organization that he applies today. "The SABRE Group is a high technology company at the cutting edge of electronic commerce. It's a practice where new law is being created every day. A strong education is essential, and I think USD gave me the tools to succeed." He particularly remembers three law professors, "I remember Professor Roy Brooks for his enthusiasm and sincere interest in the success and well-being of his students; Professor John Minan for bringing the Socratic method to life in Property; and Professor Frank Engfelt, who made Contracts understandable."

She has also made her mark in San Diego as a port/airport commissioner with the San Diego Unified Port District. 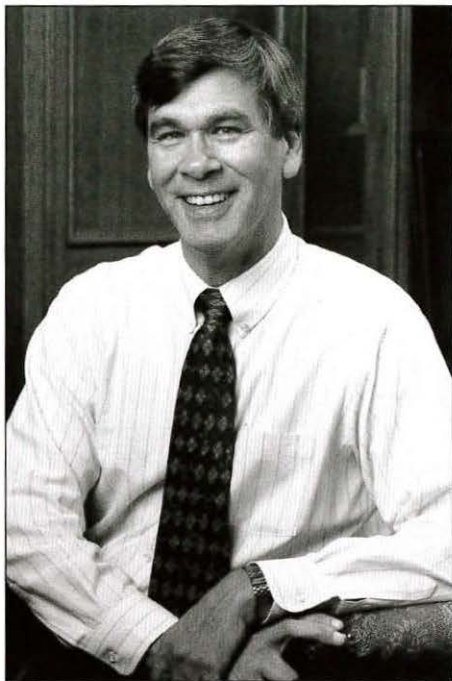
Ned Mansour '73

Distinguished Visiting Faculty Members Bring New Perspectives to USD

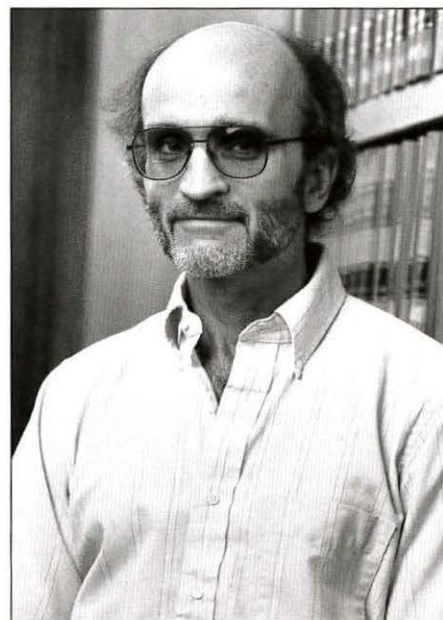
Why did Richard S. Kay come to San Diego to teach? "Because of the great weather – it's gorgeous here." He added a few more reasons, including, "the interesting, stimulating faculty. And visiting gives you a change of pace. You have the opportunity to see things from a different perspective and meet different people." Kay has been on the faculty of the University of Connecticut School of Law since 1974 and is currently the William J. Brennan Professor of Law. He earned his undergraduate degree at Brandeis University and holds an M.A. degree in economics from Yale University. He graduated magna cum laude from Harvard Law School where he was an editor of the *Harvard Law Review*.

Kay has been an invited speaker and panelist at numerous academic conferences in the United States and abroad. He is the author of about 40 articles and reviews on constitutional law, constitutional theory and comparative law. In addition, Kay is the co-editor of *European Human Rights Law* (Oxford University Press, 1995), and he is pleased that this book will be translated into Russian and Ukrainian and distributed to universities in various Eastern European countries. At USD this fall he is teaching Evidence and European Human Rights.

When asked whether teaching was something he always wanted to do, Robert Schopp responded, "Nothing like it. I was practicing psychology and studied law and philosophy as a hobby. It got out of hand and before I knew it, I was a law professor." He earned a Ph.D. in psychology at North Carolina State University and practiced clinically until 1984. Schopp returned to graduate school to study law and philosophy in order to be able to think more clearly about perplexing legal and moral issues that arise in clinical practice, and received his J.D. and Ph.D. in philosophy at the University of Arizona. He is no less perplexed now, but he likes to think that he is perplexed in a deeper and more comprehensive manner.

Schopp joined the faculties of the College of Law and the psychology department of the University of Nebraska in 1989. His teaching and research interests involve the intersection of law,

psychology and philosophy. "I think I am attentive to the way empirical, normative and conceptual questions tend to intermingle in the law. The study of psychology deals with empirical questions and philosophy with normative and conceptual questions. In the law all three come into play, and one needs to integrate all of them in order to understand legal issues." Schopp's article on jury nullification which is being published in the *Southern California Law Review* specifically addresses these three types of questions. Schopp's work includes criminal law, mental health law, clinical practice, professional ethics and jurisprudence. He is teaching Criminal Law and White Collar Offense this fall at USD.

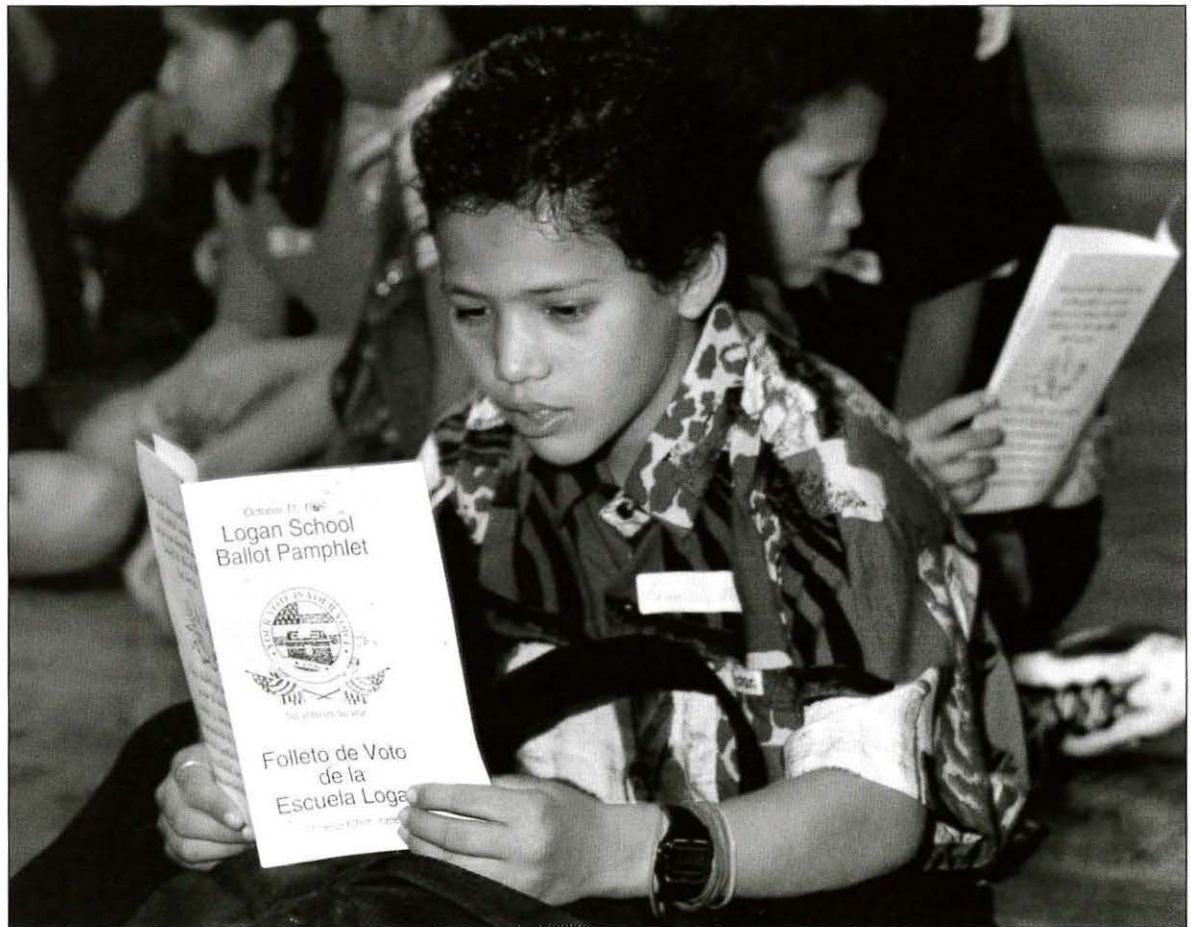

President Clinton won and the majority supported education for immigrant children, health care for everyone and banning cigarette sales to minors. Election day was a resounding success and the experience was rewarding and fun – for both the youngsters and the volunteers.

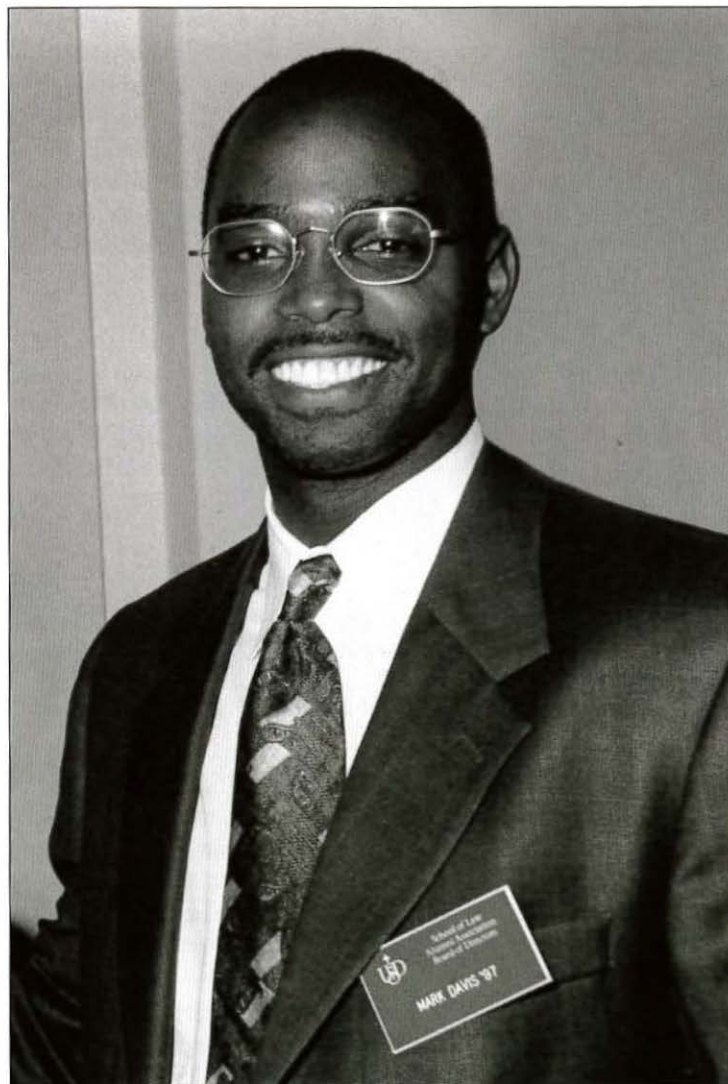

Michael Bar-Zohar Speaks on the Peace Process in the Middle East

Professor Michael Bar-Zohar, one of the most popular Israeli speakers in the United States today, spoke in Grace Courtroom at the USD School of Law on October 7 during a visit arranged by the Jewish Law Students Association. In third-year student Tara Davidoff's introduction, she expressed how honored USD was to host Bar-Zohar's visit and mentioned a few of his many accomplishments. His distinguished career has included service in national Israeli politics, journalism, research and the military. His best-selling book *Suez Top Secret* earned him the Israeli Pulitzer and the French Academy award. He is the official biographer of David Ben-Gurion, the founder of the state of Israel. In addition, Bar-Zohar was a member of Itzak Rabin's inner staff during the 1992 Labour primaries and involved in the campaign for the reelection of Shimon Peres in 1996.

Bar-Zohar recalled the turbulent history of his homeland. He appealed for peace, no matter what kind – for example, Israel has been at peace with Egypt since 1977. "Is it a good peace? No."

Bar-Zohar admits that there are no cultural relations, no tourism, no true relationship with Egypt. "Yet it is a wonderful peace, for the worst peace is better than the finest war." He argued that while a war decision can be made in 30 seconds, a peace decision can take 30 months or more. Bar-Zohar passionately spoke for the need to continue the peace process and believes that "the road to peace is there, in spite of the dangers."

Despite the renewed tensions with the Palestinians, Bar-Zohar believes Israel needs to "rescue" the peace process. Bar-Zohar discussed the main three goals he feels are necessary for the peace process. These consist of achieving a complete autonomy for the Palestinian people; the continuation of further negotiations for future peace that would satisfy both sides; and negotiating peace with other Arab neighbors, namely Syria and Lebanon. He graciously answered questions from students and professors after his remarks and at a reception held in his honor.

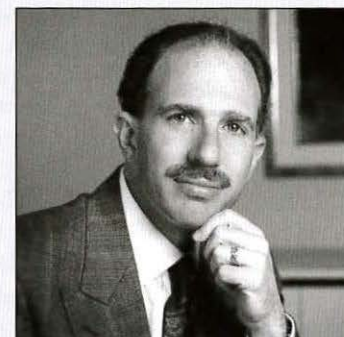

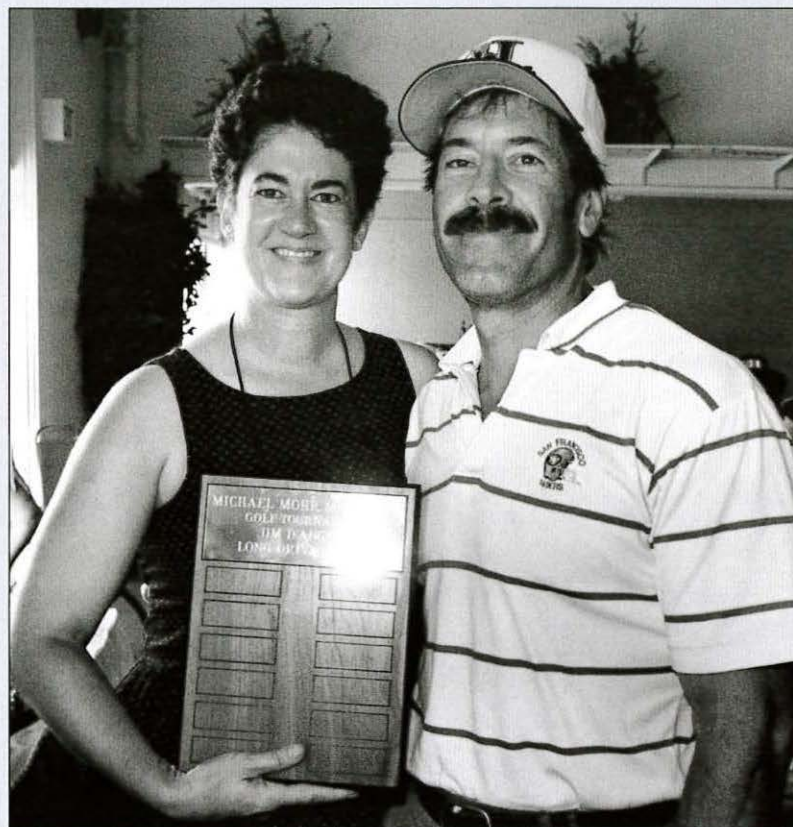

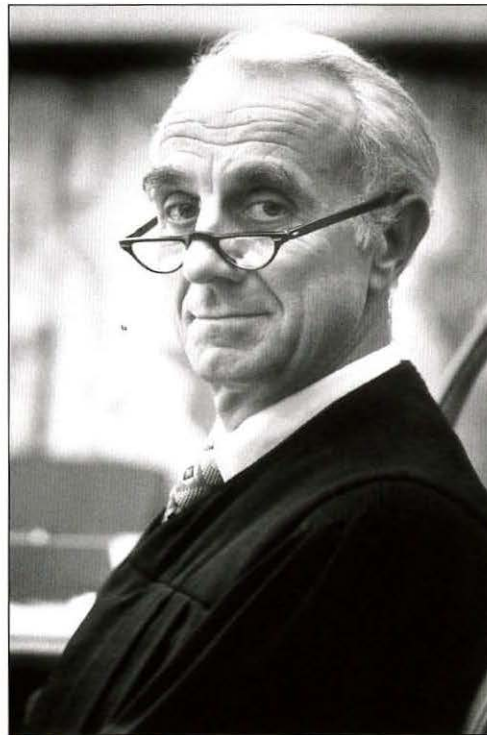

The Honorable Louis M. Welsh Memorial Scholarship Fund Established

In memory of Judge Louis M. Welsh, a beloved friend of the USD School of Law, a memorial scholarship fund has been founded to help law school students in need. Judge Welsh, a native of Chicago, Ill., was educated at the University of Chicago High School, the University of Chicago and received his J.D. from Northwestern University where he was awarded membership to The Order of the Coif. He also received an honorary LL.D. from the University of San Diego. During the Second World War he served as a lieutenant in the United States Navy.

Among his many accomplishments, Judge Welsh was a trial lawyer for 25 years, founded two law firms and served on the San Diego County Superior Court from 1971 to 1983. In 1978 he was appointed Justice Pro-Tem on the Fourth District Court of Appeal and he also served on the Appellate Department of the Superior Court. For nine years he presided over the *Carlin* case, involving school integration. His approach was to avoid mandatory busing while encouraging integration through other means such as magnet schools. In addition, Judge Welsh was an adjunct professor at the USD School of Law

and a faculty member of the California Judges' College.

In 1974 Judge Welsh founded the San Diego Inns of Court, a training program for practicing lawyers, which was the first organization of its kind in the country. When the American Inn

of Court was founded, the first San Diego chapter was named the Louis M. Welsh Chapter of the American Inn of Court. After he retired, Judge Welsh founded and served as director of Alternatives to Litigation, the predecessor of JAMS. In 1987 and 1988 he played the role of the judge on the national television series "Superior Court."

Judge Welsh was a founding father of the city of Del Mar and he was the first recipient of the San Diego Trial Lawyers Judge of the Year award. In 1995 he was named Legal Professional of the Year by the San Diego Bar Association and a Citizen of the Year by The City Club of the San Diego Junior Chamber of Commerce. Judge Welsh was a devoted family man and he is survived by his wife Patricia, his children Francesca and Peter Filanc and Wendy and Larry Woolf and five grandchildren.
