OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT:

Meetings and Foundations:

Sister Furay, Dr. Foster, and I will be attending the meeting of the College and University Department of the National Catholic Educational Association in St. Louis on Saturday and Sunday, January 12 and 13, followed immediately by the annual meeting of the Association of American Colleges, also in St. Louis, on January 13 and 14. Additionally, Dr. Foster will be attending the simultaneous meeting of the American Conference of Academic Deans, held in connection with the AAC meeting.

Prior to the St. Louis meetings, I shall be on the east coast, visiting the Lewis Foundation and the Arthur Vining Davis Foundation in Miami, then going on to New York. In New York, I am visiting the Rockefeller Foundation, the Henry Luce Foundation, the William Randolph Hearst Foundation, the Exxon Foundation, the Carnegie Corporation, and Morgan Guaranty Trust Company. I hope that these visits will be productive for future funding proposals from the University of San Diego.

Faculty Orientation, Fall, 1974:

In December, 1974, I notified the University Cabinet that I intend to appoint a faculty committee to design an orientation program for faculty for fall, 1974, built around academic advising and counseling as the central theme.

1974-1975 Academic Calendar: School of Law:

The School of Law has adopted a revised academic calendar for the academic year 1974-1975, with a late August beginning and completion before Christmas for the fall semester. The revised calendar is attached to these Newsnotes.

Number of Majors in Academic Disciplines:

Below is a listing of the number of students declaring undergraduate majors in the various areas of the School of Business Administration and the College of Arts and Sciences. The figure in parenthesis following the number indicates how many of the declared majors are juniors and seniors. This data is applicable for fall semester, 1973 - though of course all will realize that data on declaration of majors is in constant flux as students change their majors or move from "undeclared" status to declaration of major. The data should, therefore, be considered an approximation only. In the spring semester, the data will be gathered by classes - that is, freshman, sophomore, junior, senior - since it is obviously relevant to know whether the students are seniors, who rarely change major, or freshmen, for whom change is quite usual.

Commencement:

Professor John Roche, Chairman of the Law School Commencement Committee, has requested a correction of the item on Commencement appearing in the December 14, 1973 Faculty Newsnotes. That issue indicated that both Commencement Committees had recommended a reappraisal and discontinuance (in 1975) of the policy subsidizing the faculty with appropriate academic regalia for commencement. The Law School Commencement Committee

neither made nor voted on such a recommendation. The statement was therefore erroneous with respect to the Law Commencement Committee. However, it is still appropriate to solicit comments on the recommendation from all faculty members who might wish to comment, including law faculty. The current practice of subsidizing faculty (and administration) academic regalia is University-wide. Any change in it would also be University-wide.
