### OFFICE OF THE PROVOST

#### Enrollment Statistics for Spring, 1974:

In the Faculty Newsnotes of October 5, 1973, there appeared the Enrollment Charts tracing USD's enrollment (head count and FTE - Full-Time Equivalent) over the past five years, including the fall semester, 1973. These Enrollment Charts have been updated in two ways:

1. The budgeted FTE figures were revised at the same time as the budget cuts last October, to reflect more accurately the actual enrollment;
2. The enrollment figures for spring semester, 1974 - both head count and FTE - have been added to complete the chart. As you can see, the spring semester figures for undergraduates are somewhat short of the revised projections, as is the total FTE figure. The spring semester graduate enrollment figure is somewhat over projections for on-campus enrollment, somewhat under them for External Degree enrollment. Law School enrollment figures reflect a number of January graduations under a new School of Law policy making this possible for students.

No admission will be charged.
