- Instructional Scientific Equipment - for new or improved undergraduate instructional programs in the sciences;
- Faculty Research Participation - for periods of up to 10 weeks in the summer at the host research facility;
- Science and Engineering's Technician Education Program - for development, demonstration, and evaluation of college-level technician programs;
- Energy Related Graduate Traineeships - in the areas of coal and oil shale, solar energy, and geothermal energy, at the master and doctoral levels.

The U. S. Office of Education announced earlier that regulations would be available in March for its new ethnic heritage studies program.
