OFFICE OF SCHOOL RELATIONS

In addition to the regular six-week and three-week College for Men summer session programs, the College for Men will also serve as the site for three independent summer session programs. St. Paul's Lutheran Church will conduct a Lutheran Service Volunteers in Encounter School for the purpose of giving Lutheran youth leadership training. Fifty students are expected to participate in the program from July 30 - August 4. Three teachers and two counselors will offer instruction and guidance. The newly formed Southern California Scholastic Publications Association will offer a Yearbook Workshop for Southern California high school students from August 20-31 on the campus. Housing and classroom space will be provided for an expected 150 students. The Young Christian Students will also hold a seminar on the Alcala Park campus from August 27 - 31. Father Leo Davis of San Diego's Cardign Center will direct the program.

On Friday, April 28, Father Eagen Attended a luncheon sponsored by the American Jewish Committee to plan an inter-religious institute which may be held on our campus in November with Dr. Robert McAffe Brown, chairman of Stanford's Religion Department, as guest speaker.

DIVISION OF ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS

Dr. Miller has received a two-year leave of absence to accept a Department of State appointment as a Foreign Service Officer and will be assigned as the Economics Officer of the AID mission in Pakistan as of September 1, 1967. Dr. Miller will be responsible for representing the United States and assisting Pakistani government officials in the planning and implementing of United States aided economic development projects - which to date have totaled some three billion dollars.

Early this summer, Dr. Miller is expected to go on a special tour of active duty in Vietnam for 30 days requested by the Department of the Army as a U.S. Army reserve officer. This assignment is to aid in the establishment of a Headquarters U.S. Military Advisory Command, Vietnam - Data Management Agency in Saigon. Dr. Miller is a Lt. Colonel of Artillery detailed to the General Staff Corps.

He will also lecture in Europe again later this summer - speaking in Ireland, England, Italy and Switzerland - before reporting to Washington for orientation and his Department of State assignment.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOLOGY

On April 17, Dr. Bradshaw presented a lecture at Mira Costa Junior College on "Marine Ecology - Past and Present." This lecture was part of a series of lectures on oceanographic topics, presented by noted workers in the various marine science disciplines. The series is sponsored by the Oceanographic Committee of the Ocean-side Chamber of Commerce.

DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

Dr. Theil lectured the Coumet-Insurgency Officers at North Island on April 28. The topic was "The Politics of Buddhism."
