KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS LIBRARY

The following are some new services provided by the Knights of Columbus Library:

1. A new check-out system, modeled after the one used at UCSD, will add efficiency and speed to faculty and student service.
2. A liberalized loan period for graduate students will double the time they may borrow books.
3. An Olivetti reproducing machine has been installed on the second floor lobby. It will cost only 5¢ per page, instead of the 10¢ charge for xeroxing.
4. A new holdings list of periodicals has been distributed to department heads. A holdings list for microfilm will be out shortly.
5. All books have now been labeled. This is an improvement over the old marking system. This concludes a 2-year project.

Father Dollen's pamphlet, Marriage and the Vatican Council has been adopted in 12 dioceses as part of the pre-Cana program. He was also guest editor for the January, 1971 Daily Visitor pamphlet.

Miss Lynn K. Horobetz, member of the U.S.D. English Department, is the author of an article in the Autumn issue of the scholarly periodical, Shakespeare Quarterly (XXI, No. 4). Miss Horobetz comments on the Old Globe's productions of last summer: Shakespeare's "Richard II, Cymbeline," and "Much Ado About Nothing." Her article contains astute, though unflattering, estimates of the Balboa Park productions.

Miss Horobetz has for some years been connected with the Folger Library in Washington, D. C. and has served in an editorial capacity with Shakespeare Quarterly.

U.S.D. BOOKSTORE

The Bookstore will be ordering academic regalia for CW-CM Faculty and Administration for this year's Commencement. No pre-measurements will be taken for caps and gowns.
