SAN DIEGO BAY ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

On March 30, 1971, a Resolution was drawn up by the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District, establishing a San Diego Bay Environmental Advisory Committee. Membership consists of fourteen San Diegans and Mrs. Florence Shipek, who is Director of the American Indian Project on the U.S.D. campus.

The Committee's purpose is to advise the Board of Port Commissioners on environmental matters. Memberships are composed of persons who volunteer portions of their time toward solving environmental problems. Their backgrounds consist of anthropology, law, geometry, hydrology, meteorology, biology, ecology, oceanography, engineering, or chemistry. A balanced group selected from the academic, industrial, military and federal agency sections would be most beneficial to the Committee's efficiency.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Mrs. Marcia Klein gave a talk on "Early Irish Culture and the Book of Kells" last Wednesday, April 28.

Mrs. Klein spent her sabbatical leave in England and Ireland last year and worked in universities and libraries while there. She became especially interested in Irish writings and has many slides of old manuscripts which she showed Wednesday.

The March issue of Modern Language Quarterly published by the University of Washington contains the article "Joyce Cary's Political Trilogy: The Atmosphere of Power" by Dr. Benjamin Nyce. The article is twenty-five pages long and it examines both the published text of Cary's important study of political behavior as well as Cary's unpublished notes and jottings. Professor Nyce was given permission by Cary's literary executors to examine the unpublished writings which are kept in the Bodleian Library, Oxford, England. Professor Nyce reports that he enjoyed meeting Cary's friends in Oxford, where Cary lived his last years, as well as working in the fine old drafty Bodleian.

Dr. Joseph P. Ghougassian, at the request of the Philosophy Department of California Western Campus of USIU, will deliver a lecture on Gabriel Marcel's Philosophy of Man, Tuesday, May 4, 1971, at 9:00 a.m., in the Philosophy Department at USIU.

On May 6 Dr. Delwin Schneider will give a one and a half hour lecture on Eastern Mysticism - a Modern Western Phenomenon at the University of California campus.
