Dr. John S. Bradshaw, authority on Conservation and Environmental Quality, and member of the Coastal Lagoon Study Group of San Diego, has been honored by an invitation from Governor Ronald Reagan to participate in the Governor's Conference at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, November 17 and 18 on California's Changing Environment.

Drs. Virginia and A. M. Livingston will leave next week for New York to deliver a series of papers on their work on abnormal organisms and toxic compounds isolated from malignant tumors, at the New York Academy of Sciences meetings.
