## Enrollment Charts:

Attached to these Newsnotes are the official Enrollment Charts tracing USD's enrollment (head count and FTE - Full Time Equivalent) over the past six years, including the current semester. This year's figures are comparable to the last four year's figures, since the tuition structure has been identical since 1975-1976. During the year prior to 1975, the undergraduate tuition structure was totally on a per unit basis, so there is a slight non-comparability in the mode of calculating FTE students. In one of the next issues of the Newsnotes, we will publish the official HEGIS (Higher Education General Information Survey) enrollment charts as they have been sent to Washington, D.C.

As you can see in analyzing the charts, we are considerably above budget in undergraduate students, somewhat above budget in law enrollment, and just at budget in graduate students. Kudos are enthusiastically in order for the fine achievement of the Office of Undergraduate Admissions in bringing in a large group of freshmen and more transfer students than ever, without any diminishment of academic standards. For the first time in its history, USD is over 4000 headcount enrollment.

## Resident Housing Statistics, Fall, 1979:

Vice President for Student Affairs Tom Burke's office reports the following housing statistics for this fall semester. For comparison, statistics for the fall of 1975, 1976, 1977, and 1978 are also listed. The Bahia Loma and University Knolls

are now subsumed into the Mission Housing Complex statistics, which include those units and the new residences.

Dr. Sonya Herman, School of Nursing, was written up in the La Jolla Light early this summer as well as the New York Times for teaching nurses assertiveness and holistic health. She recently had a paper published "Assertive Nurses Breathe!" in The Journal of The New York State Nurses Association and has completed a book The Miracle of Breath, Thought and Love a holistic health story to be published in November, 1979. She is speaking at national nurses' conventions as well as to two regional American Medical Holistic Association conferences this year.

Virginia V. Shue, Director of the Graduate Taxation Program and Associate Professor of Law, during the summer researched and wrote materials on Social Security, Medicare, MediCal and Supplemental Security Income. The California Continuing Education of the Bar (CEB) has published these materials.

Professor Shue also presented a six hour seminar on "Counseling the Older Client" at Boalt Hall in Berkeley, as part of the 25th Annual Summer College of the Law sponsored by the California Continuing Education of the Bar (CEB) and the University of California Schools of Law.
