FACULTY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

The President, Reverend John Baer, has approved the following recommendations of the Faculty Curriculum Committee:

- 1) The over-all revision of the offerings of the History Department.
- 2) The over-all revision of the Chemistry Department offerings.
- 3) Departmental Changes applicable to Spring, 1968.
 - a) Sociology
 - 1) Withdrawal of required minor in Social Science.
 - 2) Addition of Sociology 112, Social Disorganization, 3 units.
 - b) Political Science
 - 1) Discontinuation of P.S. 10 (Methodology)
 - 2) Addition of P.S. 20 (State and Local Government)
 - c) Business Administration cross offerings:
 - 1) B.A. 112 P.S. 112
 - 2) B.A. 167 P.S. 167
 - 3) B.A. 180 Psychology 180
- 4) Deletion of the total units of General Education requirements as set forth on page 35 of the 1967-1968 College Bulletin.
- 5) Reduction in unit credit from 3 to 2 units (effective Summer, 1968) for:
 - a) Sociology 35, Marriage and the Family
 - b) P.S. 2, American Government
- 6) Procedure regarding minor departmental adjustments.

 This area is defined as:
 - a) Additions or deletions of individual courses.
 - b) Up-grading courses from lower division to upper division, or down-grading courses from upper division to lower division.
 - c) Basic alterations of the content of individual courses.

- d) Changes of unit-values of individual courses.
- e) All changes in departmental requirements.

The approving procedure consists of:

- a) Submission of proposed change by the department to the Academic Dean for distribution, within five instructional days, to all members of the faculty for their information.
- b) Comments or objections by any faculty member to be submitted in writing to the Academic Dean within five instructional days.
- c) If serious objections remain unresolved, the matter is to be submitted to the Curriculum Committee within five instructional days.

POLITICAL SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

John S. Chambers has collaborated with Professors Ivo K. and Rosalind L. Feirabend both of Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, and Frank Scanland III, formerly of San Diego State College, in a paper recently presented at a seminar on Foreign Policy and International Relations at the University of Kentucky.

The paper, entitled Level of Development and Inter-Nation Behavior, treats the relationship between levels of socio-economic development achieved by 84 nations of the world (all independent politics since 1948) and their behavior within the international political system. One of the main purposes, was to determine the reasons for riots in small countries.

The Feirabends studied the correlator of internal political stability of the countries; Scanland studied the rate of change of internal stability and Chambers made an analysis of the international politics of the countries. Each professor worked from 9 to 10 months on his research.

ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS DEPARTMENT
