OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

Saturday, April 27, the College for Men will hold a "College Day," designed primarily for prospective students and their parents, but welcoming also our own students and their families. An informal program from 1:30 - 4:30 p.m. will offer an opportunity to discuss academic and financial matters with members of the faculty and administration, and other aspects of college life, with our present students. All the members of the faculty are asked to mark this day on their calendars and to plan to be available.

Approval is hereby given to the following recommendations of the Academic Standards Committee:

1. Committee on Academic Standards and Honors

It is understood that the greater part of a student's work in the first two years of college will be preparatory and prerequisite to the mature work of upper division courses. Where the necessary prerequisite training has resulted in a basic proficiency, subject to the written approval of the Chairman of the Department in which the course is offered, a freshman or a sophomore may enroll at any time in an upper division course and receive upper division credit.

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Effective for all students, starting with the Fall Semester, 1968, the College for Men will no longer have the general requirement that each student must have a minor. However, an individual department may still require a program of courses which produces a minor in another area, and any student may elect to take a Minor. Such Minors are to consist of 5 courses, of which at least 2 must be upper division courses. The student's transcript will recognize the attainment of a Minor.

COMMITTEE ON THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

The Committee on the Educational Program has agreed upon the following recommendation: approval is given to the concept of adopting specific majors and/or minors offered at a College with whom we have reciprocal course agreement which entails the listing of the courses and the related faculty of that College in our catalog, with consideration given to the following factors: (1) coordination of calendars; (2) extension of reciprocal course agreement for a time appropriate for this purpose; (3) concern of the faculty to be cross-listed; (4) approval of the specific majors and/or minors by the Committee on the Educational Program and the Curriculum Committee. The Committee also voted that they would not act on any of the specific majors and/or minors until the current question of coordination of calendars has been solved.
