Apologies to Dr. Ray Brandes, who will again be Chairman of the Department of History for the next academic year, but whose name was omitted through error from the list published last week.

The Academic Standards and Honors Committee has recommended that the College for Men join with the College for Women in establishing a chapter of the Catholic college honor society, Delta Epsilon Sigma, Further investigation will be made of the possibility of this recommendation.

The Committee on the Educational Program voted at its last meeting to table the question of changing the name of the Department of Biology to the Department of Life Sciences.

Beginning next September, the Division of Economics and Business will no longer exist as a separate administration structure. The Department of Economics will be located within the Division of Social Science. The Department of Business Administration, to be known as the "Business Administration Program," will offer two majors: Business Administration and Accounting.

Approval is hereby given to the combined recommendations of the Curriculum Committee and the Committee on the Educational Program to accept the majors in Art and Music at the College for Women for our students. Counseling of these students, in regard to their general education requirements at the College for Men, will be the charge of Mr. Irving Parker, Chairman of the Division of Humanities.
