SAN DIEGO, Calif.-- A junior at the University of San Diego, Leonard Jones Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard E. Jones Sr. of Newfield, was elected prime minister of the Black Students Union at the university.

A speech major, Jones transferred to the University of San Diego from Southwestern College, Chula Vista, Calif. Jones was a member of the Armed Forces for three years, serving for 2 and a half years in Germany as private first class in the U.S. ARMY.

The senior Jones' reside at 323 Atlantic Ave., Newfield.

The Black Students Union at the University of San Diego was officially chartered April 25 and has set forth an eight point action program, which emphasizes inspiration of minority students to attend college, and once in to stay there. The BSU will also sponsor, said Jones, cultural and social exchanges and dialogues to promote understanding between the BSU and the rest of the university community.
