Open Budget Hearing:

There will be an open meeting on the 1993-1994 budget at 2:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 18, 1992, in the University Center Room 107. Everyone is encouraged to attend.

Academic Calendars for 1994-1995 and 1995-1996:

On October 6, 1992, the ad hoc Committee to propose an academic calendar for all units of the University, except the School of Law, met to formulate a proposal for the academic years 1994-1995 and 1995-1996.

The Committee included administrators and faculty members from each of the four Schools/College (Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Nursing), plus student representation. The ad hoc Committee's proposal is attached to these Newsnotes in order to seek faculty comment prior to finalizing the calendars. Faculty members on the Committee requested that spring semester mid-term grades be due to the Registrar a week later than they have been in the past. This would give faculty the option of giving mid-term exams before or after the Spring Break in March.

Faculty comments may be forwarded in writing to Debbie Gough, Chair, Academic Calendar Committee, Office of the Provost, or you may call her or Peggy Agerton at extension 4553. These verbal comments will be jotted down and included with any written comments. Comments should be received by Friday, November 6, 1992. If there is no substantial objection voiced, the calendars as proposed by the ad hoc Committee will be adopted for the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Schools of Business, Education and Nursing.

Social Issues Committee:

The Social Issues Committee has chosen the theme "Human Dignity: Bridges and Barriers" for the coming academic year (1993-1994). As in past years, there will be speakers, a Faculty Series of lectures, special events, etc. to bring the full dimensions of the theme to focus for the University community. One of the ways that the committee has sought to bring the chosen themes of past years into the curriculum has been by the sponsoring of team-taught courses centered on the issue at hand. As in past years, the committee will be sponsoring two to three team-taught courses in

the spring semester of 1994. These may be interdisciplinary or from the same college, school, or department. One of the departments will be reimbursed for the faculty member who participates and the faculty will each receive a \$1000 stipend for joint January preparation. Faculty interested in team-teaching such a course should submit proposals to the Chair of the Theme Course Subcommittee, Dr. Kathleen Dugan, in the Department of Theological and Religious Studies. The proposal should include: the names and departments of the participating faculty, course title, description and objectives, the requirements of the course, method of evaluation, and reading list. Proposals are due by December 2, 1992.

The team-taught courses provide an interdisciplinary way to expand students' understanding of social issues by combining analysis of different disciplines. The issues surrounding the search for human dignity invite a rich variety of responses from every field. Events of past and present history demonstrate the urgent need to educate our students.

Section 504:

USD recognizes that it is most important that all members of the community know the requirements contained in Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. Therefore, we are publishing the following information regarding academic and employment areas:

- no student may be excluded from any course or any course of study solely on the basis of handicap;
- modifications in degree or course requirements may be necessary to meet the requirements of some handicapped students (examples: extended time, less units per semester);
- prohibitive rules, such as those banning tape recorders from the classroom, must be waived for some handicapped students;
- auxiliary aids must be permitted in the classroom when they are required to ensure the full participation of handicapped students;
- alternate testing and evaluation methods for measuring student achievement will be necessary for students with impaired sensory, manual, or speaking skills (except where those are the skills being measured);
- classes may have to be rescheduled to permit access for students with mobility impairments;
- special equipment or devices used in the classroom (and in some cases teaching techniques that rely upon the sight, hearing, or mobility of students) may require adaptation in individual cases;
- it is discriminatory to counsel handicapped students toward more restrictive careers than non-handicapped students, unless such counsel is based on strict licensing or certification requirements in a profession;

- auxiliary aids are made available by the institution for students with impaired sensory, manual, or speaking skills.
- there may be no discrimination on the basis of handicap in any employment decision or action, policy, procedure or practice;
- prior to posting or advertising any job, essential and non-essential functions of the job should be defined;
- alternate tests are available for applicants or employees with impaired sensory, manual, and speaking skills, and should be used whenever employee testing is affected by such impaired skills;
- there may be no pre-employment medical examinations required;
- there must be no discrimination based on handicap in recruitment, advertising, or processing forms for employment;
- tests and criteria that screen out handicapped persons must not be used;
- either: 1) pre-employment questions regarding the nature or severity of handicaps may not be asked - if not taking voluntary, remedial, or affirmative action; or 2) pre-employment questions regarding the nature or severity of handicaps may (or must) be asked because the institution is taking voluntary, remedial, or affirmative action;
- pre-employment questions regarding one's ability to perform essential functions of a job effectively and safely may be asked;
- reasonable accommodations will have to be made to the known physical and mental limitations of otherwise qualified handicapped persons;
- there may be no discrimination based on handicap regardless of the provisions in contractual agreements with unions, employment or referral agencies, providers of fringe benefits, providers of training or apprenticeship programs, and similar organizations;
- recreational and social opportunities for employees must be provided equally to handicapped employees;
- handicapped persons must have an equal opportunity to use parking and housing facilities provided to employees;
- there may be no discrimination based on handicap in any leave programs, including sick leave, vacation, leaves of absence, and so forth;
- there may be no discrimination based on handicap in opportunities for apprenticeships, internships, and staff or professional development, including travel to meetings and conferences; and
- handicapped applicants and employees must not be counseled toward more restrictive careers than non-handicapped persons.

HUMAN RESOURCES: BENEFITS

To all employees who responded to the PruNetwork, PruCare and Safeguard surveys...thank you. Your comments were very helpful.

The University is pleased to announce its decision to offer 1993 medical coverage through PruNetwork, PruCare and Kaiser. Except for the addition of Sharp-Reese Stealy to PruNetwork's list of providers, coverage and reimbursement levels will remain the same as in 1992.

Delta quoted a 62% increase in rates. In addition, employees have been complaining about the quality of Safeguard's service for some time now. Effective January 1, 1993, the University will offer Fortis Benefits in place of Delta Dental and Western Dental in place of Safeguard.

Fortis uses the same CDN network as Northwestern. As with Northwestern, employees will be responsible for filing of dental claims. Western's provider list includes private dentists as well as clinics which are owned and operated by Western. Basically, coverage remains the same. However, employees will receive additional discounts when services are performed at a Western clinic. Provider lists are available in Human Resources.

IMPORTANT...ALL BENEFITS ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES WILL BE REQUIRED TO GO THROUGH OPEN ENROLLMENT to either enroll in one of the new dental plans, re-establish health and dependent reimbursement accounts, or waive medical and/or dental coverage. Remember, open enrollment is scheduled from November 16 through 20, a total of five days. Because of the number of people who must enroll, the process of enrolling will probably take longer than usual.

Dr. Laetitia Argentero, History Department, will chair a session on "The Italian Experience in the West" during the AIHA (American Italian Historical Association) Conference, which will be held in November in Washington, D.C.

Kim Braun Padulo, Associate Director of Student Activities, presented a keynote address, "Communication is the Key," at the National Panhellenic Conference Forum 2000 on October 24. This conference was a part of the NPC "Project 2000" series which explores current perspectives and issues confronting campuses and women's fraternities today and in the 21st century. This was the first of the series, and topics concerned leadership for women. The conference was attended by more than 500 leaders of national men's and women's fraternities and campus student affairs administrators.

During the academic year 1991-1992, Dr. Gary Macy, Theological and Religious Studies, was resident as an Herodotus Fellow in the School of Historical Studies at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, New Jersey. While on sabbatical, Dr. Macy's book, The Banquet's Wisdom: A Short History of the Theologies of the Lord's Supper, (Paulist Press: Mahwah, NJ, 1992) appeared as well as the article, "Of Mice and Manna: Quid mus sumit as a Pastoral Question," Recherches Theologie Ancienne et Medievale, vol. 58 (1991), pp. 157-166. Two articles were accepted for publication: "A Re-evaluation of the Contribution of Thomas Aquinas to Thirteenth-Century Theology of the Eucharist," The Early Universities, ed. by Nancy Van Dusen (University of California Press: to appear, 1994); and "The 'Dogma of Transubstantiation' in the Middle Ages," Journal of Ecclesiastical History, to appear in the January, 1994 volume; as well as the book review of Miri Rubin, Corpus Christi, The Eucharist in Late Medieval Culture (Cambridge University Press: Cambridge, 1991) to appear in the journal Speculum and seven entries in the Encyclopedia of Catholicism edited by Richard McBrien and to appear in 1994.

Dr. Macy also gave the following talks: "Lateran IV and the Dogma of Transubstantiation," meeting of the Delaware Valley Medieval Association, Princeton, NJ, December 7, 1991; "A Re-evaluation of the Contribution of Thomas Aquinas to Thirteenth-Century Theology of the Eucharist," Institute of Advanced Study, Princeton, NJ, December 10, 1991; "Salvation, Miracles and Heresy: Theology of the Eucharist in the Early Thirteenth Century," Institute of Advanced Study, Princeton, NJ, April 21, 1992; "Nicholas Eymeric and the Persecution of Orthodoxy," Annual Convention of the College Theology Society, Allentown, PA, May 31, 1992; "Was Transubstantiation Ever a Dogma in the Middle Ages?" Conference on Heresy and Literacy c. 1000-c.1530, Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford University, July 7-9, 1992; and "Church Leadership and the Hermeneutics of Suspicion," Future of the Church Conference, Washington, D.C., September 25, 1992.

Dr. Macy was also accepted into the international edition of Who's Who.

Dr. Donald McGraw, Associate Provost, presented "An Update on San Diego's Quincentenary Commission" to the Invisible University on October 7, 1992.

Dr. Beth Dobkin, Communication Studies, presented a paper, "Constructing News Narratives: ABC and CNN Cover the Gulf War," at the annual Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication conference in Montreal, Canada, in August. A version of this paper will appear in an edited book, Mass Media and the Gulf War, next spring.

In September, Dr. Dobkin conducted a two-day workshop, "Leaven for Leadership," for women clergy. The workshop, held in Sierra Madre, California, was sponsored by the Disciples Seminary Foundation.

Her book, Tales of Terror: Television News and the Construction of the Terrorist Threat, was nominated for the 1992 George Orwell Award.

Dr. Ben Nyce of the English Department read a paper, "Hollywood Formula in the Film Adaptation of The Last Tycoon," at the 1st International F. Scott Fitzgerald Conference at Hofstra University on September 24, 1992. An adjacent panel featured scholars from Beijing, Ukraine, Portugal and Japan.

The death of Satyajit Ray, three weeks after he received the lifetime achievement award at the Academy Awards, was the occasion for several interviews Dr. Nyce gave to The San Diego Union, India Today, and The Times of India.

Katherine Nakamura acted as an official translator at the annual meeting of the National Association of Women Judges, held on October 8-12, 1992 in San Diego. Her charges were Tokyo District Court Judge Machiko Odawara and her husband, Atsushi Odawara, chief editorial writer for Japan's largest newspaper, Asahi Shimbun.

Dr. Marianne Richert Pfau has published "The Concept of Armonia as a Key to the Antiphons in Hildegard von Bingen's Symphonia," Medieval Perspectives, VII (1992): 154-170; "Die Isorhythmischen Motetten von Machaut und Dufay," Internationale Tage fuer Alte Musik (Frankfurt, 1991): 66-73; and "Mode and Melody Types in Hildegard von Bingen's Symphonia," Sonus 11, no. 1 (1990): 53-71. She has presented a paper, "Participation Mystique: The Relationship between Divine Inspiration and the Artistic Act in Hildegard von Bingen's Musical Composition," at the Twenty-Seventh International Congress on Medieval Studies, Kalamazoo, Michigan, May, 1992.

Dr. Phyllis Kahaney, Department of English, presented a paper co-authored with Professor Steven Hartwell, School of Law, "What Is Said, What Is Meant, What Is Understood: Interpretive Communities and Legal Discourse," at the Legal Writing Institute's Summer Conference, University of Puget Sound, Tacoma, Washington, July 31-August 2, 1992.

Forthcoming this spring by Dr. Kahaney are a book, Theoretical and Critical Perspectives on Teacher Change, co-edited with Dr. Linda Perry of Communication Studies and Dr. Joseph Janangelo, UCLA Writing Programs (Ablex Press); and a chapter co-authored with School of Nursing professor Dr. Kathleen Heinrich, "Journal Writing and the Non-Academic Writer," in The Handbook on Aging and Adult Development, Jan Sinnott (Ed.), Greenwood Press.

Ron Pachence, Theological and Religious Studies, recently completed a set of 65 entries for the forthcoming Encyclopedia of Catholicism, which is being edited by Richard P. McBrien. His contributions focused on a variety of religious personalities, movements and practices in Catholicism throughout the centuries. The encyclopedia, which also includes articles authored by Gary Macy, is slated for publication in 1994 by Harper Collins.

Ron has begun work as co-author of a high school text on world religions to be published by the Benzger Company. His other early fall projects include a three-part adult education series on Islam for La Jolla Lutheran Church and participation as presider-homilist for the 13th anniversary Mass of the San Diego Catholic Worker.

German Marshall Fund of the U.S. Grants Program

DEADLINE: Open.

FOR: Grants to institutions to encourage mutual understanding between the U.S. and Europe. Program areas are:

(1) *Exploring Changing U.S.-European Economic Roles.* This includes (a) the European Economy: Challenges to the U.S., which focuses on European institutional changes and how they will affect the U.S., policy developments in the E.C. which will affect Europe's competitiveness, and the E.C.'s role beyond its boundaries, especially in Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union. The sponsor will support meetings and discussion groups for policymakers, dissemination of analyses of European development available to national and state level policymakers, and improved reporting on the European economy. The annual budget is \$480,000. (b) Improving U.S. Competitiveness: Workforce Preparation and Small Firm Assistance, which is designed to introduce European ideas on human investment policies, especially school-to-work training, retraining for older workers, and assistance to small companies, to American policymakers and practitioners. The program will support study tours, workshops, fellowships, individual travel, and informational materials. The budget is \$875,000.

(2) *Supporting Reform in Central and Eastern Europe.* Grants are made for organizational development, institutional support, training, and exposure to Western expertise and institutions. Priority is given to projects conceived by Central and Eastern Europeans and carried out within the region, usually with a U.S. partner. Priority will be given to urgent projects where relatively small amounts of money at an early stage can have a major impact, and projects which target the region's younger professionals. Currently there are three programs: (a) Political Development, which is carried out principally in Poland, Hungary, and Romania, and which is designed to enable informed and responsible participation by citizens, and to strengthen reporting by the independent press. The annual budget is \$690,000. (b) Economic Reform, which operates primarily in Poland, and supports workshops, training, organizational development, and U.S. advisers in government agencies. The annual budget is \$300,000. (c) Environmental Reform, which operates in Poland, the Czech and Slovak Federal Republic, and Hungary, and supports organizations and individuals working to increase public participation in environmental decisions. Support is provided for short-term fellowships, conferences and workshops, travel grants, and organizational development. The budget is \$460,000 a year.

(3) *Building U.S.-European Environmental Partnerships.* With a focus on reducing the threat of global warming through integrated management policies in transportation, energy efficiency, and other fields, and the use of economic tools, such as taxes, fees, and pricing mechanisms. The sponsor will support short-term transatlantic fellowships and study tours for U.S. and European practitioners, workshops and conferences, and nongovernmental organizations. The annual budget is \$530,000.

(4) *Fostering U.S.-European Cooperation after the Cold War.* Supports ongoing analysis and dialogue on critical issues among government and business officials, journalists, and academics, in order to increase their understanding of the other side of the Atlantic. Support is provided for conferences and workshops, scholarly research, teacher study tours and work/study programs for German secondary school teachers in the U.S., the efforts of U.S. nonprofit institutions in the eastern part of Germany, and improved reporting on relations. The annual budget is approximately \$3.6 million.

NOTE: In program areas 1, 3, and 4, the sponsor generally makes grants to projects that address issues and involve people from both sides of the Atlantic, that include transnational comparisons and transfer of experience, and that include a plan for marketing ideas, with an emphasis on stimulating policy debate.

AWARDS: In 1990, 161 grants were made to institutions, the median grant being \$16,000. Also, 259 grants were made to individuals. Grants seldom exceed \$60,000. Program officers in each program may make travel grants.
