Iris Engstrand, History Department, presented an address May 4 on "Scientific Illustrations of California's Landscapes and Seascapes during the Spanish Colonial Era" at the plenary session of a conference titled "Artists Impressions of the California Landscape" held at the University of the Pacific. She also presented a paper on "Medicinal Herbs from Central Mexico to Baja California: The Aztec Heritage" at the California Mission Studies Association Annual Meeting in La Paz, Baja California, on May 25.

Dr. Engstrand's chapter on the "History of Scientific Exploration in the Sea of Cortés," co-authored with George Lindsay of the California Academy of Science, appears in *A New Island Biogeography in the Sea of Cortés* published by Oxford University Press. Also, her chapter entitled "Father President Mariano Payeras: A View of the California Missions," coauthored with Douglas Cutter, was published in *The Human Tradition in California* by Scholarly Resources, Inc.

On July 13, Dr. Engstrand, along with Roger Manion and Tom Coffin, presented a workshop for the Society of College and University Planning on programming and design, specifically the Kroc Institute for Peace and Justice.

In August, Dr. Engstrand gave a paper entitled "Inspired by Mexico: An American Architect Promotes a Spanish Revival in Balboa Park" at the Pacific Coast Branch meeting of the American Historical Association in Tucson.

Susan Instone, Hahn School of Nursing and Health Science, presented a research poster with Mary Ann Thurkettle and Kathy James entitled "Risk Factors for Injury and Illness among College Students" at the Western Institute of Nursing Research Conference in Palm Springs, April 18-20.

Professor Instone also presented a research poster with Mary Ann Thurkettle and Kathy James entitled "Risk Behaviors in a College Student Population" at 23rd Annual Nursing Conference on Pediatric Primary Care in Reno, April 10-13.

Kathy James, Hahn School of Nursing and Health Science, presented a research poster with Susan Instone and Mary Ann Thurkettle entitled "Health Attitudes and Behaviors among College Students" at the Western Institute of Nursing Research Conference in Palm Springs, April 18-20.

Ken Keith, Psychology Department, is author of a chapter titled "Promises to Keep" in a new book, *Out of the Darkness and Into the Light*, published in Washington, DC by the American Association on Mental Retardation. Dr. Keith also presented a paper, "Cross-Cultural Quality of Life: Critical Issues," at the national convention of the American Association on Mental Retardation in Orlando on May 29.

Dr. Keith has been named the next Question Leader, effective in 2003, for the College Board Advanced Placement Psychology Exam program.

Dr. Keith was faculty advisor for this year's first-place student research paper in the Applied Psychometric Society competition at Fordham University. The winning paper, by USD student Angela-Minhtu Nguyen, was "Vietnamese Refugees and Their American-Born Vietnamese Counterparts: Development of an Instrument to Measure Biculturalism, Self-Determination, and Perceived Discrimination."

Dr. Keith is co-author of a new research article, "Comparing the Quality of Life of School-Age Children With and Without Disabilities," appearing in the August issue of the journal *Mental Retardation*.

Mitch Malachowski, Chemistry Department, organized a symposium at the 223rd national American Chemical Society meeting in Orlando held from April 7-11. The Symposium was entitled "Undergraduate Research: Where have we been? Where are we now? Where are we going?" The symposium included 24 presentations from faculty and administrators from universities, public and private funding agencies and industry.

Sharon McGuire, Hahn School of Nursing and Health Science, presented in South Africa in January at the International Interdisciplinary Advances in Qualitative Health Research Methods. The name of her presentation was "Leaping through Cyberspace" which explained her method of data management and transmission using digital equipment.

Dr. McGuire also presented at the Western Institute of Nursing Research Conference in Palm Springs in April. Her presentation discussed agency, initiative, and obstacles to health among indigenous Oaxacan immigrant women.

Linda Robinson, Hahn School of Nursing and Health Science, had her article titled "Disclosure after a sibling's death from AIDS" published in *Family and Community Health* 25, pgs. 22-31.

Vincent Stretch, Psychology Department, has been named recipient of the Outstanding Teaching Award from the graduating class of 2002 of both Revelle College and Warren College at the University of California, San Diego.
