Evelyn Diaz Cruz, Theatre Arts, has been placed among the top 10 finalists for the prestigious *Repertorio Espanol's* annual playwriting contest in New York City, for her full-length play entitled "Glass Cord." The play, set on a roof-top in the Bronx, explores some of the myths of the maternal instinct and is rich in cultural metaphors. As a finalist in this nation-wide competition, Professor Cruz will be granted a professional reading of her play at the *Repertorio Espanol* on December 15. The *Repertorio Espanol* is the leading playhouse for Latino/a work in the United States.

Mitch Malachowski, Chemistry, coordinated a three-day workshop on "Institutionalizing Undergraduate Research" for the Council on Undergraduate Research from October 22-24 at the College of New Jersey. The workshop brought together 55 faculty and administrators from 13 institutions interested in increasing the participation of undergraduates from all disciplines in faculty scholarship. Dr. Malachowski gave the opening address which was entitled "Undergraduate Research: The Right Idea at the Right Place at the Right Time."
