Lori Low and Lonnie Rowell, School of Education, co-chaired the 6th Annual Forum on the State of Guidance and Counseling in Schools at the IPJ in December. Dr. Rowell established the Forum in 1999 as a project of the USD Counseling Program and School of Education.

Mary Jo Wiggins, School of Law, has been invited to present a paper in June 2005 at a conference at Tel Aviv University School of Law. The Conference is sponsored by the Cegla Center at the Tel Aviv University School of Law and will be on the topic of theoretical and empirical issues in bankruptcy law. The papers from the conference will be published in the *Journal Theoretical Inquiries in Law*, a journal published by the University.
