USD'S JOHN CHAMBERS NAMED WILTON PARK FELLOW

San Diego, Calif., John S. Chambers, Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of San Diego, has been nominated a Wilton Park Fellow and invited to attend the 143rd Wilton Park Conference in London this summer. The Conference is sponsored by the British Foreign Office.

Wilton Park is a British contribution to the formation of an informed international public opinion. To promote greater cooperation in Europe and the West in general, it offers those influencing opinion in their own countries and opportunity of exchanging views on political, economic and social questions of common interest.

Professor Chambers will attend the 143rd Wilton Park Conference, 11 June to 24 June. The specific aspect of this conference will be "Modern Technology and its Impact on Man's Environment".

American conferees, in addition to Chambers, will include two persons from the U.S. State Department, a flag officer from the Department of Defense, and an industrialist. Names of the other U.S. Conferees are not yet known. Fifteen countries are expected to be represented at Wilton Park.

Mr. Chambers has been a member of the Political Science Department at USD since 1967. He received his B.A. and Masters from San Diego State College and began work on his Ph.D. at Vanderbilt College.
