Yvonne Scheffer, star of the Parisian stage, screen, radio and television, is directing <sup>is one of the</sup> cast of French students at the University of San Diego <sup>who will present</sup> for a presentation of excerpts from French classics ~~to be given~~ on Saturday, April 28 in the Camino Theatre. The public is invited to attend the three o'clock performance. Tickets are available through USD's French Department and at the door the day of the performance for \$2.00 for general public and .50 for students.

Mme. Scheffer made her debut at age 13. She has made over 70 films and was a member of the Theatre de Chaillot and appeared at the Comédie Française. Frequent appearances in New York and throughout South America added to her reputation as both a serious and comédie actress. She is currently conducting classes in drama in French in Los Angeles where she has founded a French Community Theatre.

Mme. Scheffer will co-star in a portion of the program with Roger Ferrari. Mr. Ferrari has appeared in both the English and French stage and films in Europe and the United States.

The program consists of one act of Malade Imaginaire by Moliere, a selection from La Delaissee by Max Maurey as well as selections from classical and modern works by such writers as Claudel and Cocteau.

Mme. Jeanne Brink Rigsby, Professor of French, is assisting Mme. Scheffer with the direction of the students.

A reception is planned for after the performance to honor the Consul Général de France à Los Angeles, Mme. Jean-François Roux and the Consul Honoraire de France à San Diego and Mme. Jean-Pierre Paris.
