## SANTA ANA STUDENT NOMINATED FOR USD HOMECOMING QUEEN

Angela Mary Hammer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward T. Hammer of Santa Ana, California, was among sixteen candidates nominated for the title of 1973 Homecoming Queen at the University of San Diego.

Angela was selected to represent B.Y.O.S., the campus pep club, during the USD Homecoming festivities, October 30 - November 4. Candidates were nominated on the basis of personality, involvement in campus activities, and concern for the USD community.

A sophomore at USD, Angela served as past vice-president of the pep club, as well as participating on the freshman orientation team in the fall of 1973. She is presently involved in a newly formed women's honorary group on campus.
