Meg McDermott, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. P. McDermott of Bakersfield, California has been elected Secretary of Communications of the Executive Board of the University of San Diego Associated Students for 1974-75. Announcement was made by Mark Zecca, outgoing President of the student government body.

A junior at USD majoring in chemistry, Meg graduated from Garces Memorial High School in 1971. As Secretary of Communications Meg will coordinate the various AS publications and on campus publicity.

The AS organization provides the 1,500 undergraduate students with a formal means of government, as well as serving as a means of communication for the entire Alcala Park campus.

The University of San Diego is comprised of one college and three professional schools: the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business Administration, School of Education and School of Law. USD offers a complete undergraduate program and graduate studies leading to a Masters Degree. Day and evening classes are held on the centrally located campus. Forty-two states and twenty-two foreign countries are represented in USD's student body of 2,600.
