CONVERSATIONAL SPANISH OFFERED AT USD SUMMER SESSION

Informal conversation will be the emphasis of the summer course in Elementary Spanish offered during the University of San Diego 1974 Summer Session, June 24 to August 2.

Persons with little or no familiarity with the Spanish language will engage in basic dialogues and conversations, supplemented by readings, laboratory work, and individual sessions with the instructor.

Offered from 8:30-10:00 a.m. Monday through Friday in Camino Hall, USD, the course will be conducted by Sister Alicia Sarre, RSCJ, Chairman of the Foreign Languages department at USD. Four college credit hours may be earned.

Sr. Sarre has been a member of the USD foreign languages faculty since 1952. She received her B.A. from Barat College, her M.A. from Marquette University and her Ph.D. (Spanish) from Stanford University.

Sister Sarre will also lecture in Spanish 148 "Spanish American Essay), June 24 to August2, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 1:00 to 2:45 p.m. in Camino Hall. The class will concentrate on reading and analysis of the major Spanish-American essays, tracing related themes in other works by the same authors from the 16th century to the present. This course may be taken for 3 college credits.

On campus registration for classes in any of the three USD Summer Sessions will be held from 8-12 p.m. and 4-6 p.m. on the first day of each course. Pre-registration is encouraged.
