Two full-time nursing faculty members have been appointed to the Philip Y. Hahn School of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences, University of San Diego, it was announced by Sister Sally Furay, Provost.

Mrs. Claire Gulino, R.N. has recently moved to La Jolla, California. She graduated from Mt. Sinai Hospital School of Nursing in New York, holds a B.S. in Nursing and an M.A. in Public Health from New York University. She has completed all her course work for a doctorate in Curriculum and Teaching at Teachers College, Columbia University, where her doctoral dissertation is still in progress. For the past five years, she has been Assistant Professor of Nursing at Borough of Manhattan Community College, New York.

Miss Frances Geddo, R.N. has moved to the San Diego area from Menlo Park, California, where she has been an Assistant Professor of Nursing at Stanford University School of Nursing for the past six years. She graduated from St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing in Chicago, holds a B.S. in Nursing from Loyola University in Chicago, and an M.S. in Nursing from Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. Prior to teaching at Stanford, she held faculty positions at Loyola University of Chicago and at the University of Arizona. Before beginning her faculty career in higher education, she had worked in hospital and private duty nursing.

The Dean of Nursing, Dr. Irene Palmer will assume her duties in January. Meanwhile, the 20 full-time and 45 part-time students are attending classes in the humanities at the USD campus.
