Aaron Copland, noted American composer and author, will be the featured member of a music symposium at the University of San Diego on November 21 at 8:00 p.m. in Camino Theater. The public is invited to attend.

Joining Mr. Copland for the discussion will be three local professors of music: David Ward-Steinman, San Diego State University; Robert Heninger, Mesa College; and Bertram J. Turetzky, University of California, San Diego. Dr. Henry Kolar, chairman of the USD Music Department, will be moderator.

Copland's "Duo for Flute and Piano" will be performed by USD sophomore Stephanie Bell, flautist, and Lauren Izner, pianist, a senior student at the University.

Acclaimed as a major American composer of this century, Mr. Copland is also the author of What to Listen for in Music and other books. He won a Pulitzer Prize in 1945 for his score for the ballet "Appalachian Spring" and has received numerous awards in this country and abroad.
