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USD LAWYER'S ASSISTANT PROGRAM

Dr. Ray Brandes, Director of Graduate and Special Programs at the University of San Diego, today announced the establishment of a Lawyer's Assistant Program. The program will provide career opportunities for college graduates.

Answering the need for trained Lawyers' Assistants, the University of San Diego, in cooperation with the National Center for Legal Training, has established a 12-week program to train and develop qualified college graduates as Lawyers' Assistants.

The Summer program will be June 9 through August 22, 1975; Fall will be September 29 through December 19, 1975; and Spring from February 23 through May 14, 1976. Legal Research and Introduction to Law are required subjects. One of five specialties is chosen: Estates, Trusts and Wills; Litigation; Corporations; Public Service Law; or Real Estate and Mortgages. All five specialties will be offered during the year, though not necessarily all during each session.

An ongoing development effort will be undertaken in addition to the training. The legal community in metropolitan centers will be contacted about the existence of the program, the calibre of students selected, the content and structure of the curriculum, and the availability of graduates for placement. Students will also be helped with specific referrals, contacts and leads, and will receive a six hour pre-employment orientation to prepare them for the job search.
