44 JAPANESE STUDENTS AT USD

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

The University of San Diego is repeating a special program for Japanese students which met with great success during last year's Summer Session. 44 women students from the University of the Sacred Heart, Shibuya Campus in Tokyo will be attending USD until August 10. The Tokyo campus is operated by the Religious of the Sacred Heart, the same society of nuns stationed at USD.

The students, under the direction of Sr. Helen McHugh, will follow an intensive English course and supplement their study by attending plays and concerts, visiting galleries, conversing with and be entertained by American students and families. Local Alumnae of the Sacred Heart will host the students in their homes for dinner parties.

Tours of San Diego's historical sights are included in their study program. The English lessons then supplement the areas visited.

Among events planned for their entertainment is the jazz concert to be presented by Dick Braun in Camino Theatre on July 24. The concert is part of the History of Jazz course being taught by Braun.

On July 22, Murray and Christopher Gerlach, sons of English Professor Lee Gerlach, will show slides of their bicycle tours of Scotland and Wales made while they were students at Oxford.
