NUTRITION AND THE EXCEPTIONAL CHILD TOPIC OF PROGRAM AT USD

The role of nutrition in treating exceptional children will be the focus of a presentation sponsored by the University of San Diego's Council for Exceptional Children on Thursday, November 16, at 7 p.m. in the Salomon Lecture Hall.

Leading the discussion will be Dr. Barnard Rimland, Director of the Institute for Child Behavior, and a supporter of research which links food allergies and additives to a wide spectrum of disorders related to the exceptional child.

Dr. Rimland is the author of the book, "Infantile Autism," and is also the founder of the National Society for Autistic Children. In addition, he is the vice-president of the Academy of Orthomolecular Psychiatry, and vice-president of the California Orthomolecular Medical Society.

His speech, entitled "Nutritional Approaches to the Treatment of Children With Learning and Behavior Disorders," is part of a continuing effort by the University's Council For Exceptional Children to provide the community with current trends and problems in meeting the needs of the exceptional child.

The discussion is open to the public at no charge.
