KNBC PRESENTS CONVERSATION WITH ED MEESE AT USD

On Sunday, Sept. 20, at 2:00 p.m., KNBC Channel 4's "On Campus" will present a conversation with Presidential Counselor Ed Meese, filmed at the University of San Diego's Joseph P. Grace Courtroom.

In a look behind the political headlines, Meese discusses the Constitution and the power of the Presidency with Herb Klein, Editor-in-Chief of the Copley Newspapers, and Bernard Siegan, Distinguished Professor of Law at USD. Meese is on leave as Director of the USD Law School's Center for Criminal Justice Policy and Management. "On Campus" host George Fenneman will introduce the conversation.
