## JARED JACOBSEN TO BE HEARD AT USD ORGAN DEDICATION

Jared Jacobsen, prominent San Diego musician, will be the featured soloist at ceremonies on Friday, November 13 dedicating the recently installed pipe organ at Founders Chapel, University of San Diego. The concert will begin at 8 p.m. and will feature, in addition to Jacobsen, the USD Chorus under the direction of Fr. Nicolas Reveles. A reception will be held in Founders Hall immediately following the concert. The general public is cordially invited to attend the event, which is sponsored by the Friends of Music of the University.

The 648-pipe instrument, the gift of the A. Eugene Trepte family, was constructed by L. W. Blackinton and Associates of El Cajon, the firm that completed the recent restoration of Balboa Park's Spreckels organ, the world's largest outdoor pipe organ.

Jacobsen, member of the USD faculty and civic organist for the City of San Diego since 1978, holds a doctorate in Music Arts, Keyboard Performance, from the University of Arizona. In addition to his affiliation with the University of San Diego, he serves on the faculty of the University of California, San Diego, and on the summer faculty of the School of Music of the Chautauqua Institution, where he

began his own musical training at the age of five. He pursues an active performing career nationally, having given organ recitals at Carnegie Hall and at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. This year's tour will take him to St. Mark's Cathedral in Seattle, St. Paul's Chapel of Columbia University in New York, and Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Jacobsen's November 13 performance at USD will include works of Bach, Mendelssohn, Reger, and Albright, along with commentary by the artist.
