A pre-symposium workshop, "Instructing the Language Handicapped: What do you do after the diagnosis?" will be held on Friday, April 2 from 4:00 to 10:00 p.m. Registration of \$30 (\$15 for full-time, college students) includes dinner.

The focus of this year's symposium on April 3 is "Effective Parent-Teacher Collaboration in the Education of Problem Children." Registration will be held from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. in DeSales Hall and a fee of \$30 (\$15 for full-time, college students) includes a continental breakfast and luncheon.

One unit of graduate continuing education credit is available for each workshop for a fee of \$25.

Symposium keynote speakers are James A. McLoughlin, Ph.D. and Rena Lewis, Ph.D. McLoughlin, an associate professor of special education at the University of Louisville, is a staff member of the Parent Education Resource Center and secretary of the National Council for Learning Disabilities. Lewis, associate professor of special education and coordinator of the learning handicapped program at San Diego State University, serves as secretary of the Society for Learning Disabilities and Remedial Education.

Following Saturday's keynote address, there will be twelve workshops running concurrently. These will be repeated in the afternoon. Participants may choose to participate in two workshops.

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
