Leland S. Prussia was named on December 1, 1980, to become chairman of the board of BankAmerica Corporation and Bank of America NT & SA and assumed these offices on April 21, 1981. As chairman, Prussia also assumed expanded responsibilities for the corporation's and the bank's credit and financial activities, economics and policy research, legal and legislative matters, as well as other support services. He was appointed executive officer of the bank's World Banking Division in May 1979, the post he relinquished upon becoming chairman.

Prussia was designated vice chairman of the board in 1978 and also served as the bank's cashier and the corporation's treasurer from 1974 until he was named to head the World Banking Division.

A graduate of Stanford University with a master's degree in economics, Prussia joined the bank in 1956 as a research economist. In 1962 he transferred from the Economics Department to the Bank Investment Securities Division, and, three years later, as head of the bank's investment portfolio activities, he was promoted to vice president. In 1971, he was appointed senior vice president in charge of the Bank Investment Securities Division. He was promoted to executive vice president in 1974 and named to the bank's Managing Committee two years later.

Prussia is a former California region chairman of the Securities Industry Association as well as a former director of the

association's governing board. He is a past president of the Dealer Bank Association. He currently serves on the Payments Systems Committee of the Association of Reserve City Bankers. He is a member of the California Roundtable and serves on the ABA Advisory Committee to the Treasury.

Prussia is a trustee of the University of San Diego, a member of the Advisory Council of the J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management of Northwestern University and is a member of the board of the Saint Francis Foundation of St. Francis Memorial Hospital in San Francisco. He has recently accepted appointment to the University of San Francisco President's Roundtable and Advisory Council of San Francisco State University School of Business. His memberships include the The Pacific-Union Club, Bohemian Club, American Economics Association, American Finance and Western Economic Associations, Security Analysts of San Francisco, San Francisco Day Homes Advisory Board, San Francisco Bond Club, the Stanford Associates, Commonwealth Club of California, Bankers Club of San Francisco, and Merchants Exchange Club.

Prussia was born in 1929 in San Jose, California, and attended elementary and secondary schools there. He received a bachelor of arts degree from Stanford University in 1951 and then served in the U.S. Air Force. He resumed his education at Stanford in 1955 and received a master of arts degree in economics in 1956. He is a graduate of the Advanced Management Program at Harvard Business School, and served as a lecturer in economics in the evening division at University of San Francisco from 1957 to 1965.
