USD FACULTY TO PRESENT LENTEN SERIES

AT ALL HALLOWS CATHOLIC CHURCH, LA JOLLA

University of San Diego faculty will present a lenten series of four programs in the Parish Hall of All Hallows Catholic Church, La Jolla, beginning February 23 at 7:30 p.m.

"From Death to Life: The Journey of the Christian" is the general theme of the lecture series offered free to the public by USD Department of Religious Studies faculty members.

"The Uncertainty of the Way" by Gary A. Macy, Ph.D. will begin the series on February 23. Dr. Macy explains, "Lent is the time when Christians prepare their lives for the coming of the Lord. Usually this coming is seen as an event of great joy, and yet it is a frightening thought to have to justify our lives to the Lord. This talk will explore why we might not be too eager to face the Lord."

On March 2, Kathleen M. Dugan, Ph.D. reflects on the shape of Christian hope in our times in her presentation "For What Do We Hope?" Dugan says, "Human life is founded on hope, and hope is a dynamic principle in a life lived in the manner of Christ. Today the presence of hope is an embattled one."

E. Jane Via, Ph.D. presents "The Holy Barren Fig Tree" on March 9 in which she discusses repentance and symbols of repentance in the theology of life.

"Forgiving and Being Forgiven" will be explored by Rev. Ronald A. Pachence, USD's Chairman of Religious Studies, in the final program of the series on March 16. According to Fr. Pachence, "Every sacrament is a sacrament of reconciliation because the ministry of Jesus was a ministry of healing. No more, No less. Love is 'for-giving...away' and love heals. That's the Good News explored in this session on forgiveness."
