TENTH ANNUAL TENNIS WORKSHOP

SCHEDULED AT USD

A two-day tennis workshop for teachers will be held at the University of San Diego Saturday, July 30 and Sunday, July 31 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The workshop, sponsored by USD's Continuing Education, is open to current teachers/instructors of tennis as well as those interested in teaching. Registration of \$75 includes 2 quarter hours of continuing education credit. For information call 293-4585.

The two-day workshop demonstrates how motor-learning theories can be applied to tennis. The importance of mental imagery, auditory memory clues, "progression" methodology, and the role of practice in learning will be explained and illustrated.

Workshop director Edward S. Collins, M.A. is men's tennis coach at USD and has experience as a high school tennis coach, a club pro, and director of year 'round tennis clinics and camps that have been attended by over 20,000 students. Mr. Collins' teaching philosophies and methods have been published in World Tennis and Tennis magazines as well as a nationally syndicated tennis column. Collins is author of the book "Watch the Ball, Bend your Knees, That'll be \$20 Please."
